National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- CA Wildfires Kincade, Getty, Easy, 46, Hillside, and Maria fires
- Critical fire weather and Red Flag Warnings southern CA
- Severe weather East Coast FINAL

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Eastern Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Declaration Activity:

FMAG approved – Maria Fire, CA

California Statewide Wildfires

Situation:

 Calmer winds will bring some relief from the recent life-threatening fire weather conditions; however, critical and elevated fire weather conditions and Red Flag Warnings remain in effect for portions of southern CA through this evening

- Mandatory evacuations:
 - o Kincade: 3k (-700); Getty: Lifted; Easy: Lifted; 46: Lifted; Hillside: Lifted; Maria: 10.8k

Food, Water, Shelter: (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:01 am EDT)

- · Shelters:
 - Kincade: 2 (-6) open / 58 (-124) occupants
 - o Getty: shelters have closed
 - o Easy: 1 (-1) open / 1 (-51) occupants
 - o 46: shelters have closed
 - o Hillside: shelters have closed

Energy: (As of 7:15 am EDT. Customer outage data is provided by the Department of Energy's EAGLE-I system. Comprehensive National coverage of all electrical service providers is not available.)

Statewide: 7k (-70k) (peak 21k) customers (.05%) without power

State/Local Response:

- · CA EOC returned to Normal Operations
- Governor declared a state emergency; National Guard activated

- FMAG approved for Maria Fire (11/01)
- · Region IX RWC at Steady State, monitoring
 - o IMAT-1, select ESFs, and 2 LNOs deployed to CA EOC
- ISB/SMT and MERS deployed to CA
- NWC at Steady State, continues to monitor

Situation:

- Severe storms moved through the Southeast U.S. to the Northeast on October 31, 2019
- 336 wind reports and 5 tornado reports
- No major/widespread damage; impacts appear to be primarily downed trees and power lines


Lifeline Impacts

Energy: (As of 7:15 am EDT. Customer outage data is provided by the Department of Energy's EAGLE-I system. Comprehensive National coverage of all electrical service providers is not available.)

- Power outages (Regions 1-IV total of 183k customers; peak of 998k)
 - NY: 72k customers (peak 244k)
 - PA: 17k customers (peak 168k)
 - CT: 10k customers (peak of 87k)
 - VA: 29k customers (peak 56k)
 - ME: 24k customers (peak 58k)
 - RI: 3k customers (peak of 42k)
 - MA: 1.4k customers (peak 31k)
 - VT: 29k customers (peak 56k)


Response:

- ME and VT EOCs at Partial Activation
- NY EOC at Monitoring
- VA EOC returned to Normal Operations
- · All other state EOCs remain at Normal Operations
- · Region I, II, III and IV RWCs at Steady State, continue to monitor
- NWC at Steady State, continues to monitor



Tropical Outlook – Five Day















National Weather Forecast











Fire Weather Outlook





Hazards Outlook – Nov 4-8









