FEMA

Significant Incidents or Threats:

- COVID-19
- Slight risk of severe weather – Western Ohio Valley
- Heavy rain/flash flooding possible – Great Lakes and Ohio/Mississippi River valleys
- Critical Fire Weather – Great Basin/Southwest

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – Tropical Storm Arthur

Declaration Activity:

- Request: Major Disaster Declaration – UT

COVID-19 Update



Situation: FEMA, HHS, and federal partners are working with SLTT governments to execute a Whole-of-America response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Among the **12 (+4)** states not presently experiencing a decrease in confirmed cases, **5 (+2)** have no stay-at-home orders in place, 3 have stay-at-home advisories, and **4 (+2)** have state-wide stay-at-home orders in place.

Nationwide testing: 10,847,778 (+421,901) cumulative as of May 16

Operational Task Forces:

Community Based Testing Sites:

- 190,883 (+2,972) samples collected at CBTS locations since Mar 20
- 246,151 (+13,007) tests processed by Private-Partnership Testing Sites since Apr 5

Lifelines Impacts:

Health and Medical Lifeline

Public Health:

- FEMA continues to procure and deliver testing swabs and media to supplement supplies state and healthcare providers are procuring from the private market; to date FEMA has delivered 4.2 million swabs and 2.5 million media across all states and territories; and 130,000 swabs and media to other federal partners

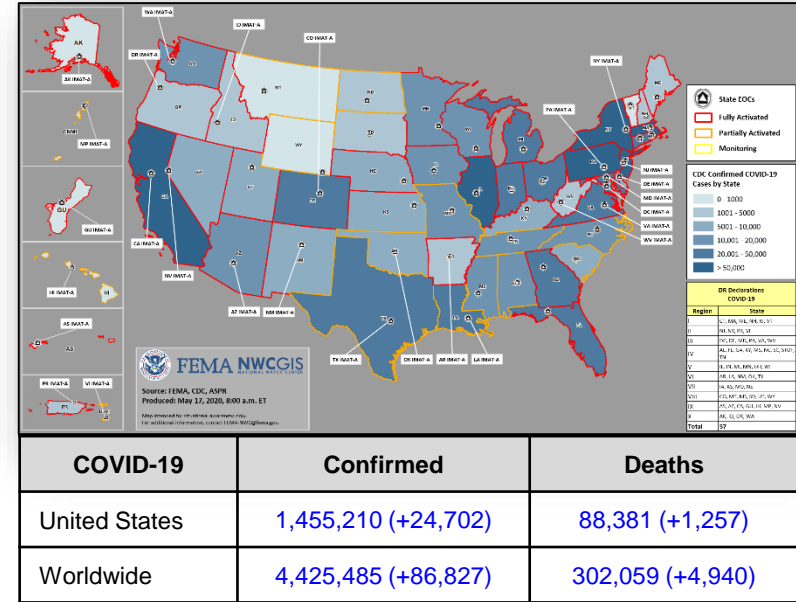
Other Domestic Lifelines

Food, Water, Shelter:

- MT: Salvation Army distributing meals, water, paper products, and cleaning supplies, in addition to providing online shopping assistance for seniors and conducting wellness checks by phone

Response:

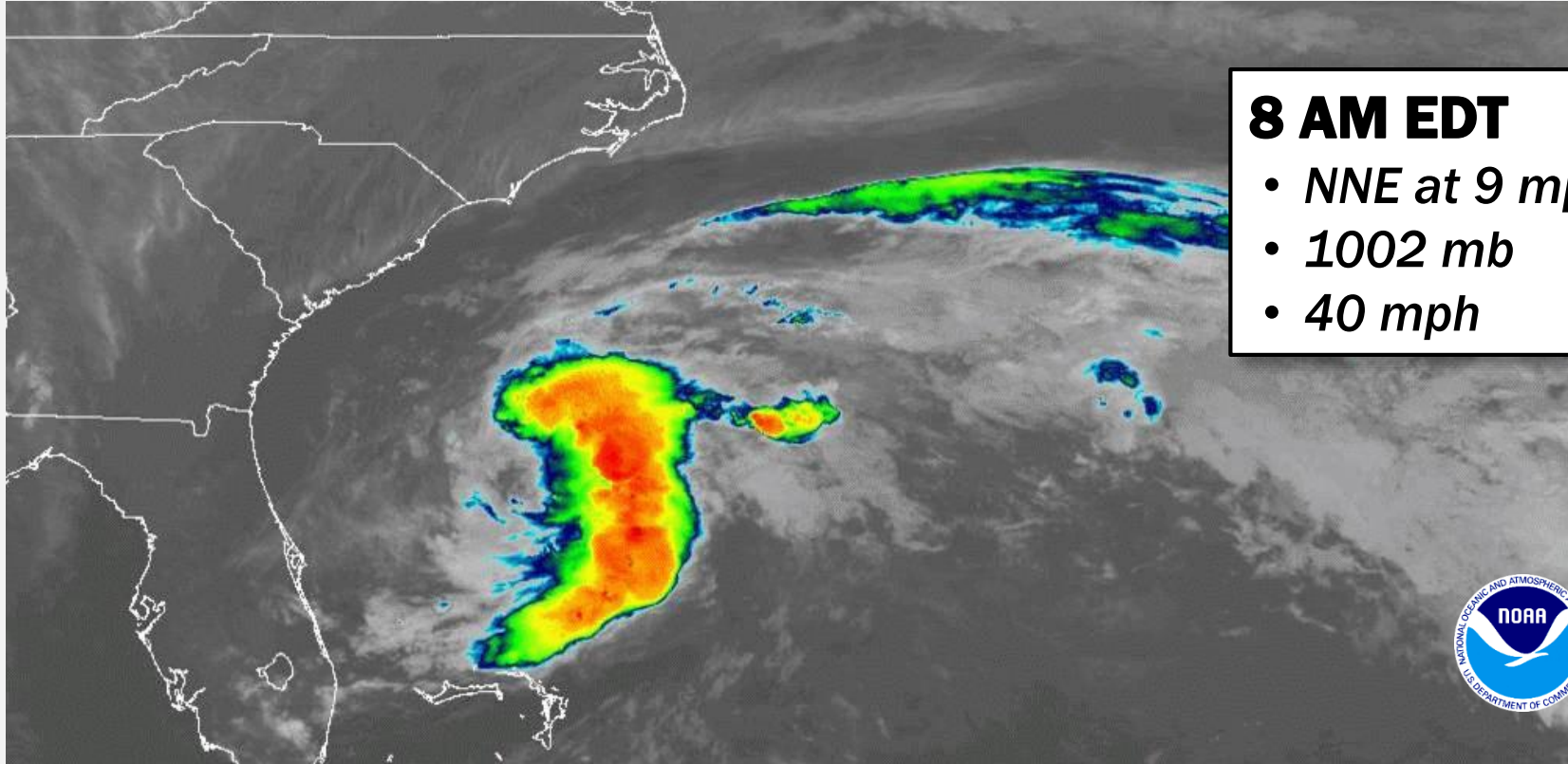
- FEMA NRCC activated to Level I; all FEMA RRCCs activated
- 28 FEMA IMAT-A teams deployed (24 actual/ 4 virtual) to states/territories/tribal nations; LNOs deployed to 37 states/territories/tribal nations
- 57 Major Disaster Declarations approved; All State / Territory EOCs activated
- 49,357 (-29) FEMA, DoD, HHS, VA, and CDC personnel deployed / activated; 3,143 (-11) FEMA employees deployed

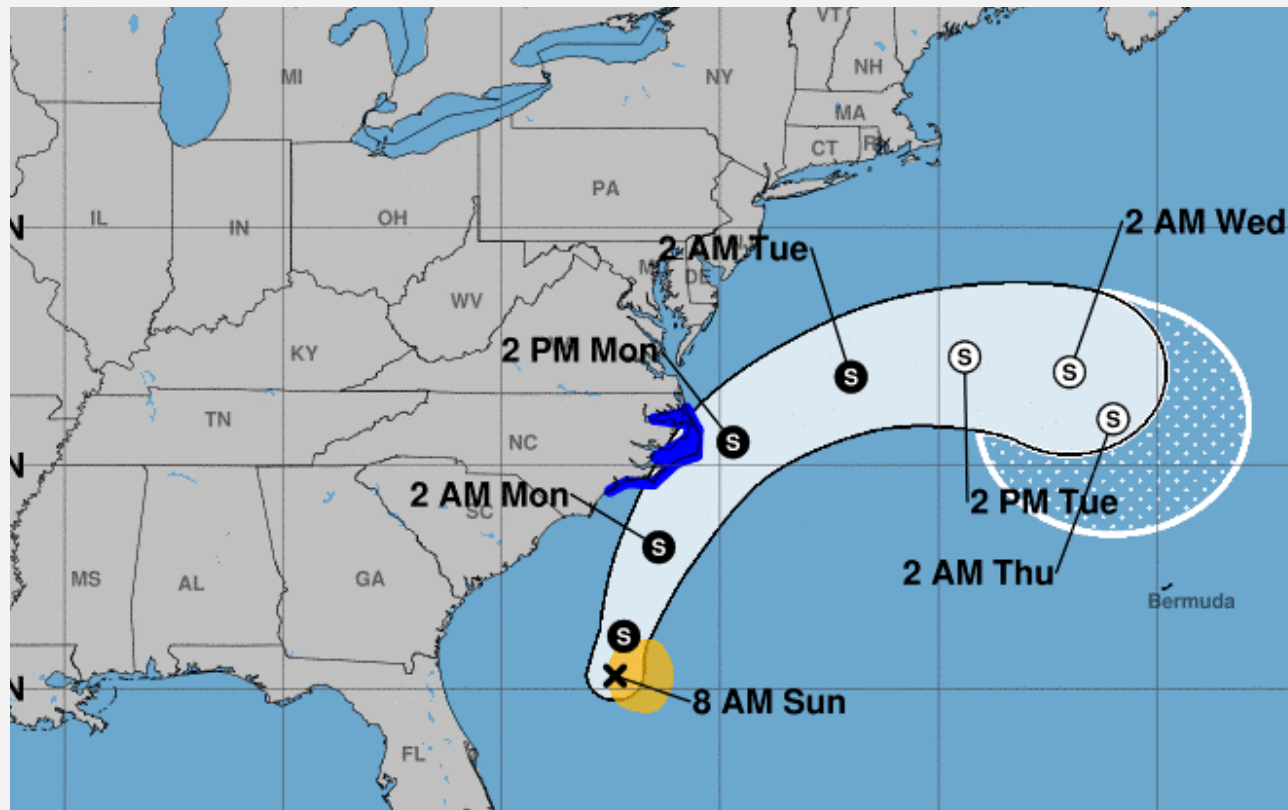

FORECAST TRACK

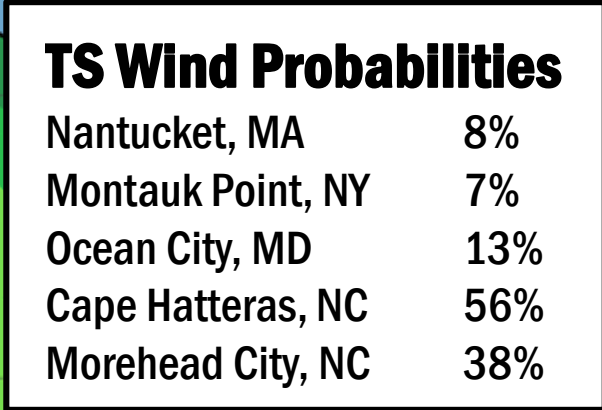

ONSET OF TS WINDS

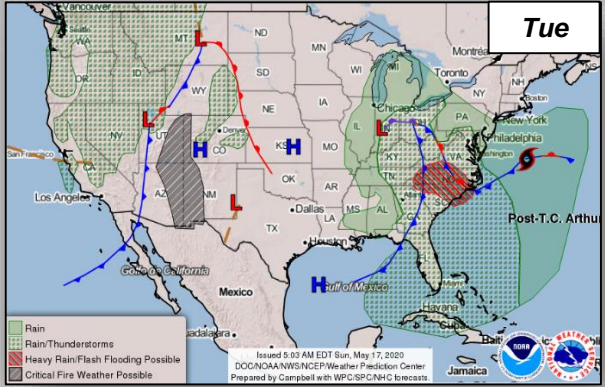
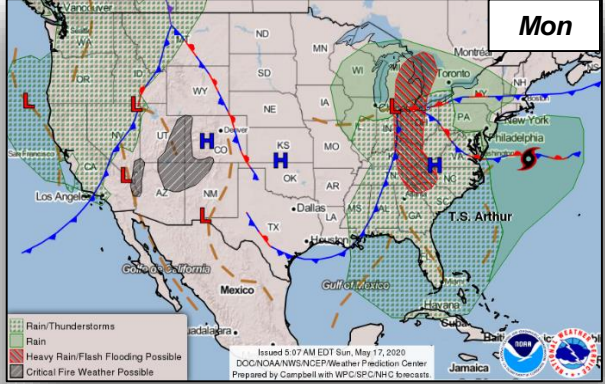
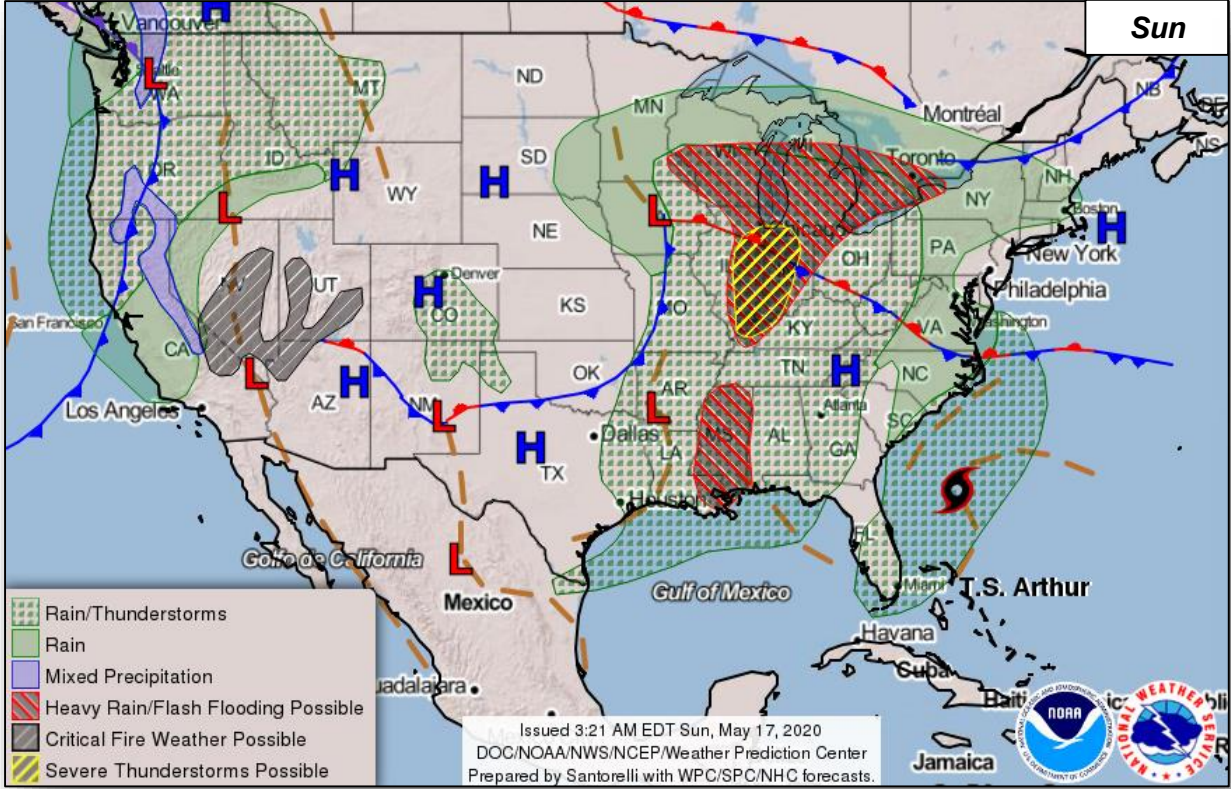

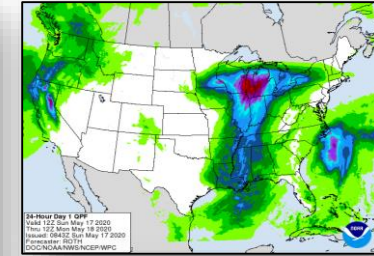
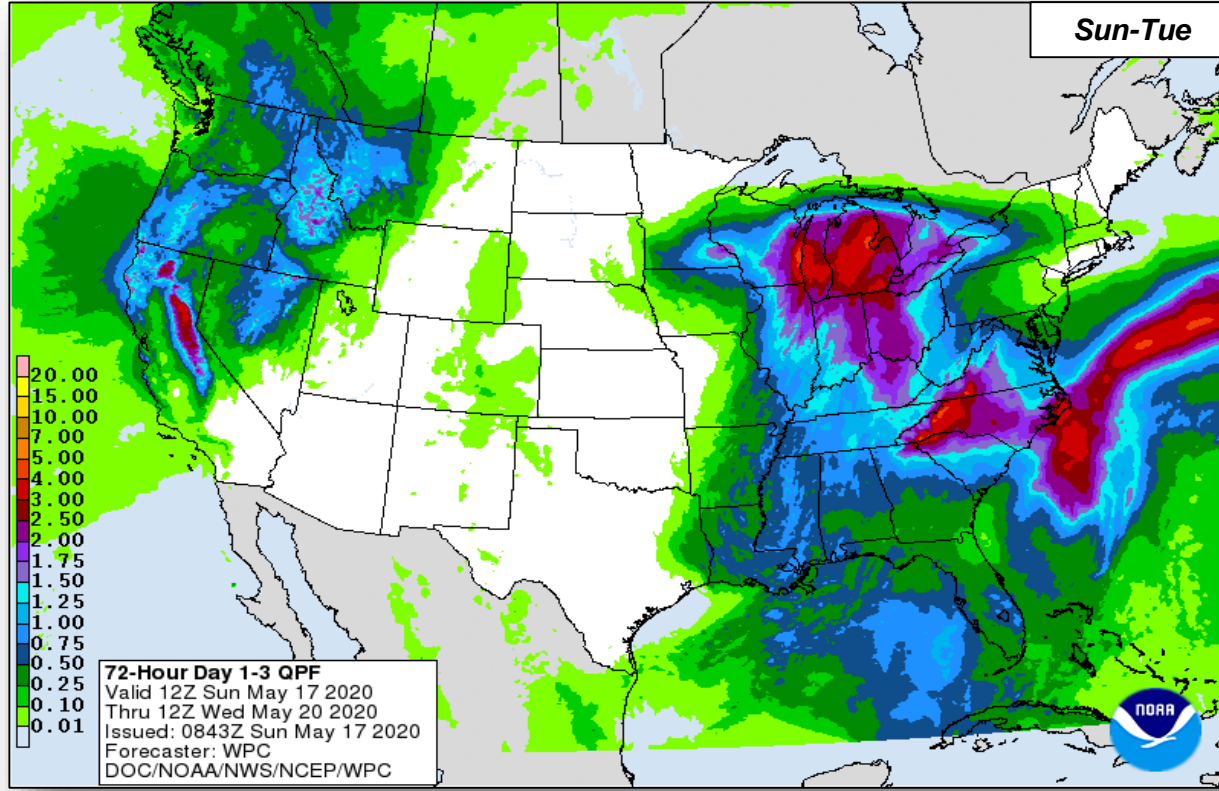

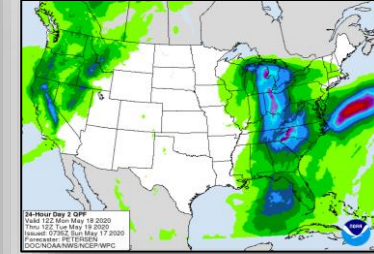

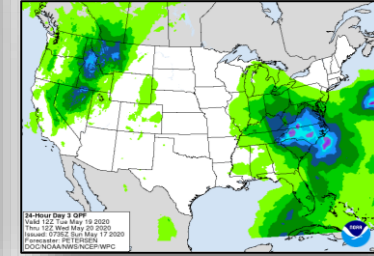

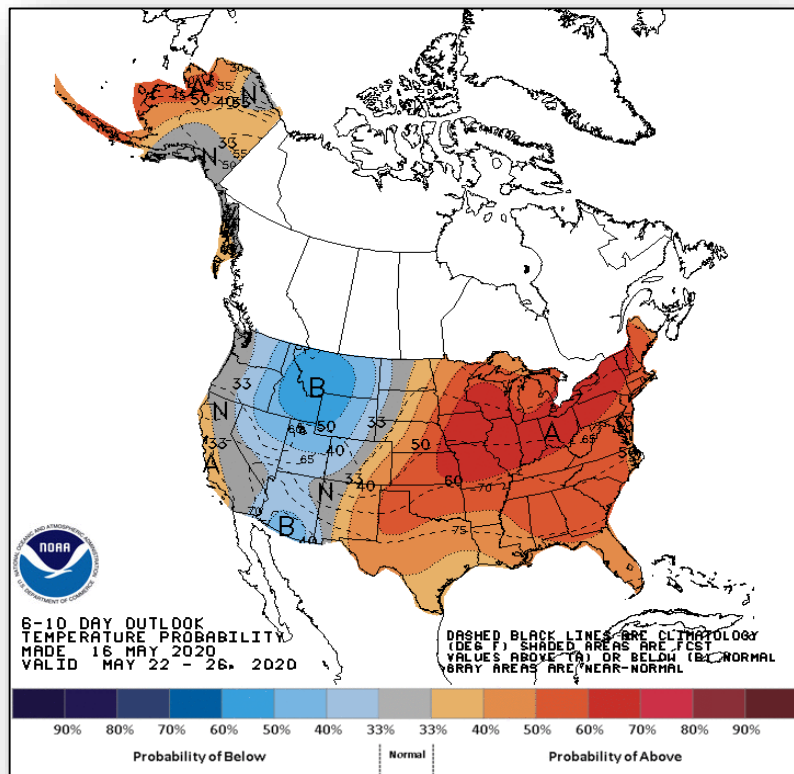

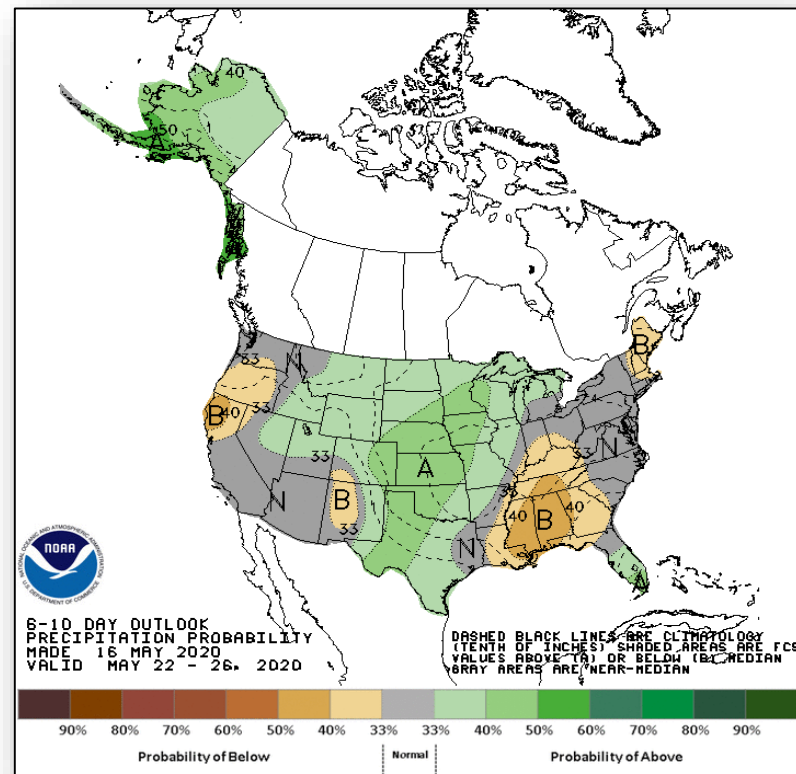
Long Range Outlooks – May 22-26
