# National Current Operations & Monitoring



### Significant Incidents or Threats:

- COVID-19
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Tennessee Valley to Southeast, Southern Appalachians and Great Lakes
- Critical fire weather Southwest to Central Great Basin and Central/Southern Rockies

### **Tropical Activity:**

• Atlantic – Tropical Storm Arthur

# COVID-19 Update

<u>Situation</u>: Among the 13 (+1) states not presently experiencing a decrease in confirmed cases, 6 (+1) have no stay-at-home orders in place, 3 have stay-at-home advisories, and 4 have statewide stay-at-home orders in place. Nationwide testing: 10,847,778 (+421,901) cumulative as of May 16

### **Operational Task Forces:**

Community Based Testing Sites:

- 191,941 (+1,058) samples collected at CBTS locations since Mar 20
- 260,971 (+14,820) tests processed by Private-Partnership Testing Sites since Apr 5

### Lifelines Impacts:

Health and Medical Lifeline

Public Health:

- Federal/State Assistance: Over 113.1 million cloth facial coverings are being processed and distributed to state, territorial, tribal, private sector, and federal entities
- Testing: FEMA has delivered 5.27 (+.98) million swabs and 3.1 (+.6) million media across all states and territories to supplement supplies that states and health care providers are procuring from the private market


### Food, Water, Shelter:

 Salvation Army provided 40 pallets of fresh food product, 400 food boxes, 2 pallets of water, and 1 pallet of toys to the Navajo Nation; providing support for AZ and NM rural communities through the distribution of gift cards from a major retailer

### Transportation:

• DC: The Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority will require customers on all trains and buses to wear face masks







### Response:

- FEMA NRCC activated to Level I; all FEMA RRCCs activated
- 28 FEMA IMAT-A teams deployed (24 actual/ 4 virtual) to states/territories/tribal nations; LNOs deployed to 37 states/territories/tribal nations
- 57 Major Disaster Declarations approved; All State / Territory EOCs activated
- 47,594 (-1,763) FEMA, DoD, HHS, VA, and CDC personnel deployed / activated; 3,136 (-7) FEMA employees deployed

# Tropical Storm Arthur RADAR LOOP





# Tropical Storm Arthur ONSET OF TS WINDS




# East Pacific Overview TROPICAL OUTLOOK









### 6-10 Day Temperature Probability





### 6-10 Day Precipitation Probability


