National Current Operations & Monitoring



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Significant Incidents or Threats:

- COVID-19
- Civil unrest and protests
- Slight risk of severe thunderstorms possible – Central Plains, Middle and Lower Mississippi valleys
- Heavy rain/Flash flooding possible – Mid-Atlantic
- Critical fire weather possible – Central Great Basin and Central Rockies

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – Tropical Depression Cristobal
- Eastern/Central Pacific – No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next five days

Declaration Activity: None


Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



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Tropical Depression Cristobal (Advisory 15 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 80 miles SSE of Campeche, Mexico
- Moving NNE at 7 mph
- Max sustained winds 35 mph
- Little change in strength expected while the depression is located over land; gradual strengthening forecast to begin once the system moves over the southern Gulf of Mexico
- Re-intensification expected to begin on Friday
- The center is forecast to move back over the southern Gulf of Mexico by tonight, over the central Gulf of Mexico on tomorrow, and approach the northern Gulf of Mexico coast Sunday and Sunday night

Tropical Depression Cristobal – Preparation



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Situation: Tropical Depression Cristobal forecast to move northward over the central and northern Gulf over the weekend. States may begin to experience tropical-storm-force winds and rainfall as early as Sunday morning from eastern Texas into the western Florida Panhandle coastlines.

Potential Impacts:


- Risk of storm surge, heavy rainfall, and wind beginning this weekend for portions of Louisiana to the Florida Big Bend
- City of New Orleans reports no concern with pump capacity but concerned with redundant power if turbine 4 is lost
- Flood Watch in effect for the southeastern Gulf Coast of Louisiana

State / Local Preparations:

- Louisiana Governor Declared a State of Emergency
- TX and LA EOCs at Partial Activation (COVID-19); LA EOC will activate to Level II 8:00 am Saturday
- States coordinating/planning non-congregate sheltering options

FEMA / Federal Preparations:

- NRCC at Level I; Region VI RRCC at Level III for COVID-19, will activate to Level II tomorrow at 8:00 am ET
- Region VI
 - IMAT-1 deploying to TX EOC today; reporting 8:00 am tomorrow
 - IMAT-2 deploying to LA EOC today; reporting 8:00 am tomorrow
 - Denton MERS assets deploying to LA EOC
- ISB established in Roseland, Louisiana; SMT deployed as surge support
- IOF established at LA GOHSEP
- USACE managing Mississippi river flow



Civil Unrest and Protests



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Situation: Protests, civil disturbances and marches continue in numerous cities around the nation. The demonstrations were sparked by the May 25 death of George Floyd in police custody in Minneapolis, MN.

Impacts:


- Numerous roadways impacted in the immediate area of civil disturbances
- Media reports several major cities remain under curfew orders

State / Local Response:

- State of emergency:
 - States (7): VA, GA, MN, TX, MO, AZ, AR
- State EOCs activated for civil unrest (in addition to COVID-19 activation):
 - States (12): MN, WI, UT, WA, OK, MO, AZ; PA, IA, KS, NE, CA
- National Guard activated (32): MA, NY, DC, MD, VA, PA, FL, GA, TN, AL, KY, NC, SC, IL, IN, OH, MI, MN, WI, AR, OK, TX, MO, NE, CO, ND, SD, UT, CA, NV, AZ, WA

FEMA Response:

- Region's II, III and V: RWC working from alternate location until further notice
- RRCC: Regions III, V, and VII working remotely
- NWC and RWCs at Steady State and monitoring



COVID-19 Update



Situation: FEMA and HHS continue leading the multiagency COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. **39,668 (-2,647)** FEMA, DoD, HHS, VA, and CDC personnel deployed / activated; **2,755 (-33)** FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide testing: **19,382,280 (+473,868)** cumulative as of June 3.

Lifelines Impacts:

Health & Medical:


- WHO resumed hydroxychloroquine clinical trials for COVID-19 Patients
- CA: Deploying 1,084 trained contact tracers to counties; 774 contact tracers in training; 1,300 state employees identified to be redirected as contact tracers

Transportation:

- USCG's National Command Center is monitoring 83 cargo vessels in transit that have embarked from a COVID-19 port of interest and have a scheduled arrival in a U.S. port within next 96 hours; 30 of which will arrive in the next 24 hours

Response:




- 28 FEMA IMAT-A teams deployed to states/territories/tribal nations; LNOs deployed to 37 states/territories/tribal nations
- 57 Major Disaster Declarations approved; All State / Territory EOCs activated
- NRCC Level I; Region IX RRCC Level I; Region III, V, VI and VIII RRCCs at Level III; Region VII RRCC is rostered but the Region continues to support COVID-19 response from the JFO in Kansas City, MO; all remaining RRCCs at Level II
- NWC and all Regional Watches and MOC's at Steady State and monitoring



National Weather Forecast




Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






