Significant Incidents or Threats:

- COVID-19
- Tropical Depression Cristobal
- Flash Flooding possible Gulf Coast to the Upper Mississippi Valley
- Critical fire weather Portions of CA, AZ, NM, UT, TX, & CO

COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue leading the multiagency COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 39,668 FEMA, DoD, HHS, VA, and CDC personnel deployed / activated; 2,729 FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide testing: 20,384,850 cumulative as of June 8.

Lifelines Impacts:

Health and Medical - Public Health


 FEMA continues to procure and deliver testing swabs and media to supplement supplies states and healthcare providers are procuring from the private market; FEMA has shipped over 19 (+1.1) million swabs and 13 (+0.1) million media across all states, territories, and other federal partners (FEMA Update, June 7, 2020, 4:47 p.m. ET).

Food, Water and Shelter

 USDA approved AK, IA and GA to operate the Pandemic-Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) program; there are now 42 (+3) states and one jurisdiction operating the P-EBT programs(ESF-11 Update, June 8, 2020, 1:55 p.m. EDT)

Response:

- NRCC at Level I; Region IX RRCC: deactivated, rostered but continues to support COVID-19 response from the JFO Oakland, CA; Region I, II, IV, VI (for TS Cristobal), and Region X RRCC downgraded to Level III; Region III, V, and VIII RRCCs at Level III; Region VII RRCC is rostered but the Region continues to support COVID-19 response from the JFO in Kansas City, MO
- NWC and all RWCs and MOCs at Steady State, continue to monitor



- Located few hundred miles E of Bermuda
- Development of this system unfavorable conditions
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)

Tropical Depression Cristobal

Situation:

TD Cristobal currently moving into Missouri. Heavy rainfall and gusty winds will spread northward through the Middle and Upper Mississippi Valley and the western Great Lakes today as Cristobal strengthens as an extratropical cyclone over the next 36 hours. Total rainfall is expected to be between 2-4 inches, with local amounts as high as 6 inches. This may produce flash flooding and is forecast to produce new and renewed minor to moderate river flooding across portions of the lower Missouri and Mid to Upper Mississippi Valleys.










National Weather Forecast











Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Severe Weather Outlook






Fire Weather Outlook




States with Currently Occupied Units

NPSC Call Activity




