National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- COVID-19
- Post-Tropical Depression Cristobal FINAL
- Severe thunderstorms possible Ohio Valley to Great Lakes, Mid-Atlantic and Northeast
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Great Lakes

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic:
 - Disturbance 1 Low (10%)
- Eastern/Central Pacific No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next five days

<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue leading the multiagency COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 37,056 FEMA, DoD, HHS, VA, and CDC personnel deployed / activated; 2,655 FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide testing: 20,814,269 cumulative as of June 9.



- NWC and all RWCs and MOCs at Steady State, continue to monitor



Post-Tropical Cyclone Cristobal - FINAL



Situation:

Cristobal has become extratropical and is expected to bring more heavy rains and severe weather across the Middle and Upper Mississippi Valleys, lower Ohio Valley and into the upper Great Lakes through this morning. Cristobal is forecast to intensify as a post-tropical storm and winds are forecast to reach gale force over the waters of the Great Lakes early today. Flash Flood Watches are in effect for parts of the Midwest and western Great Lakes; Wind Advisories in effect for Chicagoland and areas adjacent to Lakes Michigan and Superior; Gale Warnings in effect for Lake Michigan, eastern Lake Superior and portions of Lake Huron.


National Weather Forecast






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Severe Weather Outlook







