National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Big Horn Fire, AZ
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible coastal Carolinas
- Critical fire weather Central Great Basin to Southwest
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next five days
- Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1 Low (10%)
- Central Pacific No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next five days


Evacuations: M = Mandatory / V = Voluntary

Situation:

- Fire began June 5 and is burning in the Catalina National Forest, Catalina Foothills, and Oro Valley (pop. 15,000), AZ, approximately 10 miles from Tucson
- Threatening 7,400 homes, 9 multiple residences, 12 nonresidential commercial structures, local fire stations, schools, residential power distribution lines, big horn species habitat, and a watershed
- Mandatory and voluntary evacuations in effect
- No injuries or fatalities
- FMAG approved on June 11

Response:

- AZ EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- Region IX RWC at Steady State, continues to monitor
- NWC at Steady State, continues to monitor



COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue leading the multiagency COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 37,785 FEMA, DoD, HHS, VA, and CDC personnel deployed / activated; 2,658 (+11) FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide testing: 22,050,891 (+357,258) cumulative as of June 11.


Lifelines Impacts:

Health and Medical

- WA: Yakima County accounts for 3% of the state's population but 46% of the cases over the past week; 50% of the confirmed cases are under 40 years old; county is in Phase 1 re-opening
- TX: Hospitalizations have increased 42% statewide since Memorial Day *Transportation*
- The European Commission has extended restrictions on non-essential travel from outside the EU until June 30; will allow entry on a country-by-country basis beginning in early July

Response:

- NRCC at Level I; Region I, II, and IV RRCCs at Level II; Region III, V, VI, VIII
 and X RRCCs at Level III; Region VII and IX RRCCs are rostered, COVID-19
 response being worked from the Virtual JFOs in Kansas City, MO and
 Oakland, CA
- NWC and all RWCs and MOCs at Steady State, continue to monitor

Disturbance 1 (as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- A low S or SSW of southern tip of Baja California Peninsula

No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next five days








Fire Weather Outlook






