Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Flash flooding possible Southeast Coast
- Critical fire weather Central Great Basin to Southwest & Central to Southern Plains

COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue leading the multiagency COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 37,399 (-386) FEMA, DoD, HHS, VA, and CDC personnel deployed / activated; 2,656 (-2) FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide testing: 22,418,881 (+367,990) cumulative as of June 12

Lifelines Impacts:

Health and Medical


- Puerto Rico announced it will lift nearly all restrictions; beaches, churches, and businesses across the U.S. territory will reopen after three months of being closed (CISA Update, June 12, 2020, 2:11 a.m. EDT)
- KY: The governor announced a new effort to provide health care coverage to all Black and African American state residents, who account for 8% of state population, 15% of cumulative COVID-19 cases, 17% of deaths (HHS Update, June 12, 2020, 11:23 a.m. EDT)

Transportation

 HI: Beginning June 16, all outbound inter-island air travelers will be thermally screened at airport; passengers with a temperature greater than 100.4 will be denied boarding (HHS Update, June 12, 1:41 p.m. EDT)

Response:

- NRCC at Level I; Region I, II, and IV RRCCs at Level II; Region III, V, VI, VIII and X RRCCs at Level III; Region VII and IX RRCCs are rostered, COVID-19 response being worked from the Virtual JFOs in Kansas City, MO and Oakland, CA
- · NWC and all RWCs and MOCs at Steady State, continue to monitor






Severe Weather Outlook






Fire Weather Outlook






