National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Severe thunderstorms possible Northern Plains to Upper Mississippi Valley
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Mid-Atlantic
- Elevated and critical fire weather Central Great Central Basin to the Central Plains
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic: Disturbance 1 Low (10%)
- Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1 Low (20%)
- Central Pacific No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next five days

COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue leading the multiagency COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 37,399 FEMA, DoD, HHS, VA, and CDC personnel deployed / activated; 2,627 FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide testing: 23,290,274 (+871,393) cumulative as of June 15


 Manufacturer of N95 respirator decontamination systems is implementing a software enhancement that will track rejected masks and reasons for rejections (e.g., stains from makeup, blood, and bodily fluids) (FEMA SLB COVID-19, June 15)

Transportation

 U.S. Department of Transportation announced it will make facial coverings available to passengers of aviation, transit and passenger rail transportation sectors; coverings will be distributed to airports transportation agencies (FEMA SLB COVID-19, June 15)

Response:

- NRCC at Level I; Region I and II RRCCs at Level II; Region III, IV, V, VI, VIII, and X RRCCs at Level III; Region VII and IX RRCCs are rostered, COVID-19 response being worked from the Virtual JFOs
- NWC and all RWCs and MOCs at Steady State, continue to monitor




Tropical Outlook – Five Day

- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)


Atlantic


Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 150 miles S-SE of the North Carolina-South Carolina border
- Slowly moving N-NE
- Conditions expected to remain unfavorable for significant development through tonight when it should move inland over NC
- Regardless of development, heavy rain will occur over SC and NC through Wednesday
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)









Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Fire Weather Outlook




