### National Current Operations & Monitoring



#### **Significant Incidents or Threats:**

- Severe thunderstorms possible Southern Plains
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Southern Plains; Appalachians to Mid-Atlantic
- COVID-19

#### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic:
  - Subtropical Depression Four
- Eastern Pacific:
  - Disturbance 1 High (70%)
  - Disturbance 2 Medium (50%)
  - Disturbance 3 High (80%)
  - Disturbance 4 Low (30%)
- Central Pacific:
  - Disturbance 1 High (70%)

### COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue to lead the COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 36,457 (-123) Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,520 FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 26,781,666 (+281,169) cumulative as of June 22.


#### **Lifelines Impacts:**

#### Health and Medical

- VA: Governor announced \$246 million from CARES Act funding will be used to support long-term care facility response to COVID-19; VA Department of Health directed to make COVID-19 cases and deaths data associated with long-term care facilities publicly available
- AZ: 20 consecutive days of increasing averages for new cases;
   19 consecutive days above 10% positive tests; two days of above 20% positive tests; Governor continues to boost testing and amplify contact tracing throughout the state
- WA: Mongolia's donation of 60k isolation gowns arrive in Seattle on June 21
- FEMA RSS allocating gowns to AZ and NV


#### Response:


- NRCC at Level I; Region I and II RRCCs at Level II; Region III, IV, V, VI and X RRCCs at Level III; Region VII, VIII and IX RRCCs are rostered; Region VII COVID-19 response being worked from the Virtual JFO

### National Weather Forecast











### Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

### Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

#### **Subtropical Depression Four** (Advisory #3 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 365 miles S of Halifax, Nova Scotia
- Moving NE at 13 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Will likely weaken and transition into a post-tropical cyclone on Wednesday
- · There are no coastal watches or warnings in effect





### Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- More than 1,500 miles SW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Conditions appear conducive for gradual development; likely to become a tropical depression during the next few days while it moves slowly W
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (50%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)

#### Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Located several hundred miles SSW of the southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Environmental conditions are forecast to remain conducive for gradual development over the next few days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (50%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (50%)

#### Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a few hundred miles SSW of the Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Conditions are forecast to be conducive for development in a couple of days
- Likely to become a tropical depression in a few days while it moves WNW parallel to the coast of Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (80%)

#### Disturbance 4 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- · Forecast to form south of the Gulf of Tehuantepec by late this week
- Conditions are expected to be conducive for gradual development over the weekend as it moves WNW parallel to the coast of Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)




### Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



#### Disturbance 1 (of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located more than 1,700 miles ESE of Hilo, HI
- Conditions appear conducive for gradual development
- Likely to become a tropical depression during the next few days while it moves slowly W
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (50%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)




States with Currently Occupied Units


