National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- COVID-19
- Earthquakes Puerto Rico
- Heavy rain/flash flooding possible Upper/Middle Mississippi and Ohio Valleys
- Critical Fire Weather Southwest and Central Great Basin

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic:
 - Disturbance 1 Low (10%)
 - Disturbance 2 Low (20%)
- Eastern Pacific:
 - Disturbance 1 Medium (50%)
 - Disturbance 2 Low (20%)
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Declaration Activity:

- FMAG approved Canal Fire, UT
- FMAG approved Knolls Fire, UT

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- · Several hundred miles east of the southern Winward Islands
- Moving WNW at 20 mph
- Some slight development possible during the next day or so while it moves W to WNW at 20 mph
- Strong upper level winds forecast to inhibit further development by mid-week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to form off the southeastern coast of the U.S. on Tuesday
- Some development could occur later this week as it moves NE well offshore of the east coast of the U.S.
- Forecast to reach cooler waters Wednesday night or Thursday and development after that time is not expected
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- A few hundred miles SSW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Moving NW toward colder waters, but it could still briefly become a tropical depression today or tonight
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (50%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (50%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- A few hundred miles SW of the Gulf of Tehuantepec later this week
- Gradual development possible by the weekend while it moves WNW at 10-15 mph well south of Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)


Earthquakes—Puerto Rico

Earthquakes - Puerto Rico

- At 2:42 a.m. ET on June 28, a magnitude 4.8 earthquake occurred near Ponce (pop 153k), Puerto Rico, at a depth of 7 miles
- 42 aftershocks ranging from 2.0 to 4.5 have occurred in the same area, aftershocks continue
- Level IV on Modified Mercalli Intensity scale (MMI); 40k exposed to light shaking
- Green PAGER alert was issued indicating a low likelihood of casualties and damage
- No power outages or significant damage reported
- No tsunami warning issued

- PR EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- NWC & Region II RWC is monitoring



- Burning on state and private land in and around Learnington and Fool Creek (pop 300)
- Threatening homes and one main power infrastructure, \$1 million of farm equipment, and a cement plant
- FMAG approved June 28

- UT EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- NWC & Region VIII / Denver MOC continue to monitor

- Threatening homes, 2 communication sites, 4 quarries/mines, several hundred businesses, 1 main power plant, 1 high voltage line, and an explosives plant
- FMAG approved June 28

- UT EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- NWC & Region VIII / Denver MOC continue to monitor










Fire Weather Outlook










<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue to lead the COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 36,442 Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,518 FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 30,110,061 cumulative (as of June 25).

United States: 2,504,175 (+44,703)


o Worldwide: 9,653,048 (+179,316)


