## **Significant Incidents or Threats:**

- Heat Advisories – Southern Plains/Lower Mississippi Valley
- Elevated Fire Weather – Central Great Basin, Rockies, & Northern Plains
- COVID-19

## **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Eastern Pacific:
  - Disturbance 1 – Low (30%)
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

**Declaration Activity:** None

**Disturbance 1** (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- A few hundred miles S of the southern coast of Mexico; moving WNW at 10 mph
- Gradual development possible
- Formation chance through 48 hrs.: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

# COVID-19 Update




**Situation:** FEMA and HHS continue to lead the COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. **32,329 (- 33)** Federal employees deployed / activated; **2,372 (-58)** FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: **35,457,589 (+1,873,742)** cumulative (as of July 1).

Cases of COVID-19 continue to increase throughout the world

- Confirmed Cases of COVID-19
  - United States: **2,624,873 (+43,644)**
  - Worldwide: **10,180,083 (+163,586)**
- Deaths caused by COVID-19
  - United States: **127,299 (+560)**
  - Worldwide: **503,805 (+3,939)**

- NRCC at Level I
- Regions I and II RRCCs at Level II
- Regions III, VI, & X RRCCs at Level III
- Regions VII, VIII, & IX RRCCs are rostered
- Regions IV, VII, VIII, & IX COVID-19 response being worked from the Virtual JFO
- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs at Steady State; monitoring
