### National Current Operations & Monitoring



#### **Significant Incidents or Threats:**

- Earthquakes Puerto Rico
- Severe thunderstorms, heavy rain, and flash flooding possible Northern Plains to Upper Mississippi Valley
- COVID-19

#### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic: Disturbance 1 Medium (60%)
- Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1 Low (30%); Disturbance 2 Medium (60%)
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

### Earthquakes—Puerto Rico



#### Earthquakes - Puerto Rico

- At 9:54 a.m. ET on July 3, 2020, a magnitude 4.9 earthquake occurred offshore 3 miles southeast of La Parguera (pop 1k), Puerto Rico at a depth of 4 miles
  - Level VI on Modified Mercalli Intensity (MMI) scale: 1 k
    exposed to strong shaking, 36k exposed to moderate shaking
- At 4:49 p.m. ET on July 3, 2020, a magnitude 5.3 earthquake occurred offshore 6 miles south-southeast of La Parguera at a depth of 2 miles
  - Level VI on Modified Mercalli Intensity (MMI) scale: 4k exposed to strong shaking, 165k exposed to moderate shaking
- Numerous aftershocks continue
- No tsunami generated
- Preliminary reports of no significant injuries or damage
- No major damage to power infrastructure, no major power outages
- Open source media reporting localized minor landslides





#### Eastern Pacific

#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles SW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Some slow development is still possible during the next few days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

#### Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to form S of the coast of southern Mexico in a couple of days
- Moving WNW
- Gradual development is possible and a tropical depression could form by the middle of next week
- Formation chance through 48 hrs.: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (60%)

#### Atlantic

#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- · Located 300 miles WSW of Bermuda
- Moving ENE or NE at 15 mph
- A tropical depression could form later today or tonight
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (60%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (60%)

<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue to lead the COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 31,908 Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,346 FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 35,457,589 cumulative (as of July 1).





- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs are monitoring



### National Weather Forecast










