Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Severe thunderstorms/flash flooding possible Northern Plains
- Elevated fire weather conditions Central Great Basin
- COVID-19


Tropical Activity:


- Atlantic: Tropical Depression Five; Disturbance 1 Low (30%)
- Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1 Low (30%); Disturbance 2 High (80%)
- Central Pacific: Disturbance 1 Low (20%)
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Declaration Activity: None

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic







Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located in far northern Gulf of Mexico
- Moving NE
- · Some slight development is possible
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

<u>Tropical Depression Five</u> (Advisory #4 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 70 miles N of Bermuda
- Moving NE at 20 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Could become a tropical storm today
- There are no coastal watches or warning in effect

Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles SSW of the southern tip of Baja California peninsula, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Development, if any, should be slow to occur during the next few days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles SSW of the Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Moving WNW
- Likely to form into a tropical depression by the middle of next week
- Formation chance through 48 hrs.: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)




Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- · Forecast to form far southeast of the Big Island of Hawaii
- Conditions for development may become conducive later in the week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)

<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue to lead the COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 31,908 Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,346 FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 35,457,589 cumulative (as of July 1).

o Worldwide: 10,710,005 (+175,723)


Deaths caused by COVID-19


- NRCC at Level I

- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs are monitoring






National Weather Forecast











Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Severe Weather Outlook






Fire Weather Outlook










6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




