National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Severe thunderstorms possible Northern Rockies to Upper Mississippi Valley
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Northern Plains to Upper Mississippi Valley; Southern Plains
- Critical fire weather possible —Central Great Basin to Central Plains
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic: Disturbance 1 Medium (40%)
- Eastern Pacific:
 - Tropical Storm Cristina
 - Disturbance 1 Low (30%)
 - Disturbance 2 Low (30%)
- Central Pacific: Disturbance 1 Low (10%)
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests


Declaration Activity: FMAG approved, Numbers Fire, NV

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located inland over northeastern Georgia
- Expected to move NE toward the coast of the Carolinas and the Mid-Atlantic states
- Some development is possible later this week if it moves over water
- Regardless of development, it is forecast to produce locally heavy rainfall that could cause flash flooding across portions of the southeastern U.S. during the next couple of days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Tropical Storm Cristina (Advisory #3 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 535 miles SSE of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 13 mph; this motion expected to continue during the next few days, keeping it well away from the coast of Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph; forecast to become a hurricane on Wednesday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 35 miles
- No costal watches or warnings in effect


Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,000 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Some slow development possible over the next few days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to form south of the Gulf of Tehuantepec late this week
- Gradual development is possible this weekend
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)






Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located far SE of the Big Island of Hawaii
- Some development is possible later in the week as it moves W
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)

Current Situation:

- Fire began on July 6, 2020 and is burning near Pineview Estates, 23 miles SSE of Carson City, NV
- Threatening 1,000 homes in and around Pine View Estates, Ray May Way, China Springs Youth Camp, Bodie Flat (combined pop 4,000), the Carson River water shed (provides water to Carson City), a propane handling facility, and a youth correctional facility
- Mandatory evacuations in effect for 4,000
- Road closures in effect for portions of Hwy 395 and Pinenut Road

Response:

- NV EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- FMAG approved July 7
- Region IX RWC and NWC are monitoring



COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 31 states. Interagency missions have been launched to 9 hotspot locations to collaborate with local stakeholders to understand how federal agencies can support. 31,745 (-163) Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,303 (-43) FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 36,255,888 (+798,299) cumulative as of July 6.



National Weather Forecast











Precipitation Forecast








40% chance of tropical development

Maximum Heat Index Thru Friday









