- COVID-19


### **Tropical Activity:**

- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests



# Tropical Storm Fay MOST LIKELY ARRIVAL OF TS WINDS






# Tropical Storm Fay 2 DAY RAINFALL FORECAST

# **Tropical Storm Fay**

#### Tropical Storm Fay (Advisory #4 as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 55 miles SSE of Ocean City, MD
- Moving N at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- On the forecast track, the center forecast to move near the Mid-Atlantic coast today and move inland over the Mid-Atlantic/Northeast on Saturday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 140 miles


#### Potential Impacts

- Tropical Storm Warnings in effect for Fenwick Island DE to Watch Hill RI including Long Island and Long Island Sound and southern DE Bay
- 2-4 inches with isolated rainfall of 7 inches expected near the track from the lower Eastern Shore of MD and DE northward into NJ, eastern PA, southeast NY, and southern New England; flash flooding where the heaviest amounts of rain occur is possible
- Isolated tornadoes possible today over portions of NY, southeast NY, and southern New England

- Regions II RRCC at Level II (COVID-19)
- Regions I & III, RRCCs at Level III (COVID-19)
- NWC & RWC's are monitoring





# COVID-19 Update




<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 12 (-7) states, with 21 (+5) states in a plateau status, including NC, TX and AZ. 31,802 (+247) Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,301 (-8) FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 39,208,278 (+196,529) cumulative as of July 8.

Cases of COVID-19 continue to increase throughout the world

- Confirmed Cases of COVID-19
  - United States: 3,047,671 (+64,771)
  - Worldwide: 11,669,259 (+168,957)
- Deaths caused by COVID-19
  - United States: 132,056 (+991)
  - o Worldwide: 539,906 (+4,147)



### National Weather Forecast










### T.S. Fay 3-Day Rainfall Forecast and Risk of Flash Flooding thru Early Sat., Jul. 11, 2020
