National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Severe Thunderstorms possible Central/Southern Plains and Mississippi River Valley
- Heavy Rain and Flash Flooding possible Lower Great Lakes and Northeast
- Elevated Fire Weather/Isolated Dry Thunderstorms possible Northwest to Southwest
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic: Post-Tropical Cyclone Fay (FINAL)
- Eastern Pacific:
 - Tropical Storm Cristina
 - Disturbance 1 High (70%)
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Post-Tropical Cyclone Fay (FINAL)



Post-Tropical Cyclone Fay (Advisory #8 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 30 miles S of Albany, NY
- · Moving N at near 17 mph
- · Maximum sustained winds 55 mph
- Post-tropical cyclone is likely to dissipate by late Sunday
- · This is the last public advisory issued on this system

Situation:


Earlier yesterday Fay made landfall just north-northeast of Atlantic City, minor flooding occurred in NJ and NY. Fay has since advanced north through central NY and is expected to produce 1 to 2 inches of rain with isolated amounts of 4 inches along and near eastern New York into portions of New England. A marginal risk of severe thunderstorms remains through today in central NY, widespread damage is not anticipated, and Watches and Warnings have expired.

State/Local Response:

- NJ & NY EOCs at Partial Activation for COVID-19
- NYC EOC at Full Activation for COVID-19; select ESFs activated for Fay

Federal Response:

- NRCC at Level I for COVID-19
- Region II RRCC at Level III for COVID-19
- NWC and RWC monitoring



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Tropical Storm Cristina (Advisory #19 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 565 miles WSW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 16 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 70 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend 90 miles
- Expected to become a post-tropical cyclone early next week


Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Southwest of the Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Environmental conditions expected to become more conducive for formation of a tropical depression in two to three days as it moves westward, well south of the coast of Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)

COVID-19 Update




<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 14 (+2) states, including TX with, 21 states in a plateau status, including NC, TX and FL. 31,403 (-399) Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,292 (-9) FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 40,045,940 (+837,662) cumulative as of July 10.

 - United States: 3,106,931 (+59,260)
 - o Worldwide: 11,874,226 (+204,967)
- · Deaths caused by COVID-19
 - United States: 132,855 (+799)


- NRCC at Level I


National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Fire Weather Outlook






