Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Severe Weather possible Northern Plains
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Eastern Pacific:
 - Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,000 miles SSW of the southern tip of the Baja California
- Slow development possible late this weekend or early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

COVID-19 Update

<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 20 (-6) states, with 18 (+9) states in a plateau status. 30,217 (-31) Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,206 FEMA employees deployed.

Nationwide Testing: 45,429,824 (+757,200) cumulative as of July 16.



- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs are monitoring












Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






