National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Severe thunderstorms possible Central/Northern Plains, Ohio Valley to Great Lakes
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Southern/Central Plains and Middle Mississippi Valley
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic:
 - Disturbance 1: Low (20%)
- Eastern Pacific:
 - Disturbance 1: Medium (60%)
 - Disturbance 2: Low (30%)
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests



Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over Hispaniola and adjacent waters of the southwestern Atlantic Ocean
- Expected to move WNW and reach northwestern Gulf on Thursday
- Expected to become at least marginally conducive for development by Wednesday or Thursday
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,200 miles WSW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Conditions conducive for a tropical depression to form in a day or two
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (60%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (60%)


Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 700 miles SW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Moving WSW at 10 mph
- Conditions expected to be conducive for gradual development
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 27 states, with 15 states in a plateau status. 30,220 Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,278 (+52) FEMA employees deployed.

Nationwide Testing: 46,551,605 cumulative as of July 17

COVID-19 positive cases continue to increase globally (CDC COVID-19 Response Update as of July 18)

United States: 3,630,587 (+74,710)

o Worldwide: 13,616,593 (+237,743)


Deaths caused by COVID-19

- · NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs are monitoring





National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Fire Weather Outlook










6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




