# National Current Operation



### Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Tropical Cyclone Isaias
- Severe thunderstorms possible Central Plains
- COVID-19

### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic:
  - Post-Tropical Cyclone Isaias FINAL
  - Disturbance 1: Low (10%)
- Eastern Pacific:
  - Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
- Central Pacific: No tropical cyclones are expected during the next 5 days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests
- Declaration Activity: None

# Tropical Outlook – Tropical Cyclone Isaias




### Post-Tropical Cyclone Isaias FINAL (Advisory #33 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 55 miles NNW of Quebec City, Canada
- Moving NNE at 28 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Tropical storm force winds extend 140 miles
- This is the last public advisory issued by the National Hurricane Center on this system

### Potential Impacts

- Scattered minor to moderate and isolated major river flooding is ongoing across portions of the Mid-Atlantic with most rivers expected to fall below flood stage by later today
- Swells generated by Isaias will affect the coast of the Northeast United States through this morning. These swells are likely to cause life-threatening surf and rip current conditions.

### Tropical Cyclone Isaias – Response



#### Lifeline Impacts:

Safety and Security

- NC: Mandatory evacuations remain for Hyde counties; voluntary evacuations remain Brunswick and Sampson counties
- NC: Search and rescue ongoing in Bertie County

#### Food, Water, & Shelter

- VA: Boil Water Advisory for (2) counties and City of Chesapeake due to power outages
- NC: 3 shelters (congregate and non-congregate) open with 21 occupants

#### Health and Medical

- NYC: 6 nursing homes on generator power
- NJ: numerous long-term care facilities on generator power; precautionary evacuation of (1); 16 patients relocated

#### Energy (DOE Eagle-I as of 7:30 a.m. ET)

#### Customers without power

- Region I ME: 74k (peak 93k); NH: 55k (peak 94k) (12%) customers; CT: 702k (peak 682k); RI: 90k (peak 144k); MA: 141k (peak 235k)
- Region II NJ: 992k (peak 1.4 million); NY: 770k (peak 844k)
- Region III VA: 95k (peak 357k); DE: 13k (peak 61k); MD: 14k (peak 115k); PA: 165k (peak 386k)
- Region IV NC: 41k (peak 366k)

#### **Transportation**

- NYC: Modified subway and commuter rail service for track debris removal
- NJ: NJ Transit rail service suspended; anticipated resumption today
- NY and NY ports open with no restrictions

- MD EOC: Monitoring (Isaias & COVID-19)
- NC EOC: Partial Activation (Isaias & COVID-19) state of emergency declared

  - IMAT: Available
- Region III: RRCC at Level III (Isaias & COVID-19)
- Region IV: RWC returned to Steady State
  - IMAT-1 & LNO deployed to NC EOC
- FEMA HQ: NRCC at Level I (COVID-19)
- Emergency Declaration FEMA-3533-EM-FL; FEMA-3534-EM-NC approved

# COVID-19 Update



**Situation:** Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 7 (-4) states, with 10 (+1) states in a plateau status, and 39 (+3) states on a downward trajectory. 26,586 Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,112 (-26) FEMA employees deployed.



#### Response:


- NRCC at Level I








## Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall


