Since its inception, JSOU considered the Theater Special Operations Commands (TSOCs) among its most important audiences because these joint SOF

operational headquarters do not have organic, dedicated educational support. Moreover, for many new TSOC personnel, the duty may be their first SOF assignment, first joint assignment, and first assignment at the operational level of planning. To address that need, JSOU designed two courses to accelerate "on-boarding" at a TSOC. The TSOC Staff Preparation Course (TSPC) is conducted at MacDill AFB; and the TSPC-Mobile is conducted at TSOC HQ locations. Feedback from graduates of both courses confirm that they adapted and contributed to their TSOC's requirements quickly due to the education.

- courses designed for niche knowledge specialties (Joint SOF Logistics Course, Special Operations Forces-Security Cooperation Course, SOF Chaplaincy Ethical Leadership Advisement Course)
