National Current Operation



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Tropical Cyclone Isaias Response
- Severe thunderstorms possible Northern Plains and Upper Mississippi Valley
- Heavy Rain and Flash Flooding possible Upper and Middle Mississippi Valley
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic: Disturbance 1: Low (20%)
- Eastern Pacific:
 - Tropical Storm Elida
 - Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
 - Disturbance 2: Low (30%)
- Central Pacific: Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Declaration Activity: None

Tropical Cyclone Isaias – Response

Situation: Widespread power outages continue due to Isaias; restoration on-going.

Lifeline Impacts:

Food, Water, Shelter

- CT: 33 (-4) public drinking water systems on generator power; 2 boil water advisories in effect
- NJ: 1 (-1) boil water advisories; 41 (-1) water systems without power
- All shelters closed in NJ and NY

Health and Medical

- CT: 32 (-45) nursing homes/skilled care facilities on generator power
- NYC: All nursing home power has been restored

Energy (Eagle-I as of 9:00 a.m. ET)

Customers without power

CT: 178k (-141K) (peak 636k) (11%); NJ: 43k (-106k) (peak 568k) (1%)
 NY: 146K (-166k) (peak 579k) (2%)

Transportation

NY: Metro North operating weekend service schedule; Long Island Railroad service restored


State / Local Response:

- CT & NH EOCs at Full Activation (Isaias & COVID-19); States of Emergency declared
- NJ EOC at Partial Activation (Isaias & COVID-19); State of Emergency declared
- NY EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19); States of Emergency declared

Federal Response:


- Region I: RRCC at Level III (Isaias & COVID-19)

- Region II: RRCC transitioned to a Level III Partial Activation (COVID-19) dayshift only

 - o Emergency Declaration FEMA-3535-EM-CT approved






Tropical Outlook









Central Pacific

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,500 miles SE of Hilo, HI
- · Conducive for some development
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

Eastern Pacific

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Expected to form over the western portion of the eastern Pacific basin later week
- Some development is possible
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Expected to form offshore of the SW coast of Mexico by the middle of next week
- Some development is possible
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

Atlantic

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Tropical wave located several hundred miles WSW of Cabo Verde Islands
- Some development is possible
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)

Tropical Storm Elida

Tropical Storm Elida (Advisory 2 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located off the coast of Mexico
- Moving WNW at 16 mph
- Maximum sustained winds near 40 mph
- Strengthening is forecast, and is expected to become a hurricane within the next two days
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend up to 35 miles from the center





COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 3 states, with 4 states in a plateau status, and 49 states on a downward trajectory. 26,073 Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,091 FEMA employees deployed.

Nationwide Testing: 64,920,920 cumulative as of Aug 6

o United States: 4,920,369 (+32,042)



Response:


- NRCC at Level I

- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs are monitoring



National Weather Forecast









Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Fire Weather Outlook











