National Current Operation



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Derecho Midwest FINAL
- Severe Thunderstorms possible Upper/Middle Mississippi Valleys, Northern/Central Plains
- Heavy Rain / Flash Flooding possible Northern Plains, Upper Mississippi/Ohio Valleys, Mid-Atlantic
- Elevated Fire Weather Northern Intermountain/Great Basin, Central Rockies, Central Plains
- COVID-19

 - Tropical Storm Josephine
 - Disturbance 1: Medium (50%)
- Eastern Pacific:
 - Tropical Depression Ten-E
 - Disturbance 1: High (80%)
 - Disturbance 2: High (60%)
 - Disturbance 3: High (80%)
- Central Pacific: Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Derecho – Midwest - FINAL



<u>Situation:</u> On Aug 10, severe thunderstorms with long track damaging winds (derecho) impacted the Midwest, causing widespread power outages across Regions V and VII. Power restoration and damage assessments continue. No requests for FEMA assistance

Lifeline Impacts:

Safety and Security

- Fatalities: IA 2, MO -1 (as of Aug 12, Region VII Incident Report)
- Injuries: IA 50; IL 5 unconfirmed

Food, Water, Shelter: (as of 7:25 a.m. ET, ESF 6 Report)

- IA: 119 (+42) total occupants; 62 (-15) in non-congregate (hotels); 0 (-6) in congregate
- IA: 150 members of Meskwaki Nation sheltered in tribal casino

<u>Energy</u>

- Customers without power (as of 4:30 a.m. ET, DOE Eagle-I)
 - Region V: IL: 65k (1%) (peak 757k)
 - Region VII: IA: 181k (13%) (peak 491k)

Communications:


- IA: Widespread damage to communications systems (911 still working)
- 332 (15%) of 2,172 cell towers in the affected areas are out of service

State / Local Response:

- IL EOC: Normal Operations
- IA EOC: Partial Activation (COVID-19); State of emergency declared

Federal Response:

- Region V RRCC Level III (COVID-19); RWC monitoring
- Region VII RWC at Enhanced Watch (day shift) w/ ESFs 2, 12 & 15
- · Region VII State and Tribal LNOs deployed (virtually) to IA
- NWC is monitoring



Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Tropical Storm Josephine (Advisory #11 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 680 miles ESE of the northern Leeward Islands
- Moving WNW at 17 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Some strengthening is expected during the next day or so
- Tropical storm force winds extend outward 80 miles

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 100 miles NE Cape Hatteras, North Carolina
- Moving ENE, well SE of New England and S of Canadian Maritime provinces
- Possible formation into tropical or subtropical depression in next few days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (40%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (50%)







Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



<u>Tropical Depression Ten-E</u> (Advisory #5 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,535 miles WSW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving W at 7 mph
- · Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Little change in strength is forecast during the next few days

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- · A few hundred miles S of Baja California peninsula, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10-15 mph
- A tropical depression is likely to form within the next day or two
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (80%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (80%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,000 SW of S Baja California peninsula, Mexico
- Moving N
- Tropical depression is likely to form next few days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (50%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (60%)

Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located just offshore of the Pacific coast of Central America
- Moving WNW
- Tropical depression is likely to form this weekend or early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (40%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (80%)




Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 800 miles SE of Hilo, HI
- Moving west at 10 mph
- Some gradual development is possible through early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)



COVID-19 Update



Situation: Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 4 (-1) states, with 7 (+3) states in a plateau status, and 45 (-2) states on a downward trajectory. 24,008 (-441) Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,040 (-13) FEMA employees deployed.

Nationwide Testing: 70,212,154 cumulative as of Aug 13

o Worldwide: 20,439,814 (+276,393)



Response:


- NRCC at Level I.

- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs are monitoring






National Weather Forecast











Severe Weather Outlook











Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Fire Weather Outlook




