Tropical Outlook – Atlantic




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over the eastern Caribbean Sea
- Moving W at 20 mph
- Conditions could become more conducive for the development of a tropical depression later this week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (60%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 700 miles WSW of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving W to WNW at 15-20 mph
- A tropical depression is likely to form within the next day or two
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (70%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)

Tropical Cyclone Genevieve (CAT 3) (Advisory #8 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 215 miles WSW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving NW at 17 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 115 mph
- Additional rapid strengthening is forecast during the next 12 to 24 hours
- Hurricane force winds extend 30 miles
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 150 miles

Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Tropical Cyclone Genevieve (CAT 3) (Advisory #8 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 215 miles WSW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving NW at 17 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 115 mph
- Additional rapid strengthening is forecast during the next 12 to 24 hours
- Hurricane force winds extend 30 miles
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 150 miles


Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over the far southwestern portion of the basin and associated with the remnant low of Tropical Depression Ten-E
- Moving slowly W
- Conditions do not appear conducive for significant development and regeneration of this system is not anticipated
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Expected to form later this week several hundred miles W of the southwestern coast of Mexico
- Conditions appear favorable for some development over the weekend
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)



Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- 800 miles SSW of Honolulu, HI
- Conditions are not expected to be conducive for development over the next few days but may improve as the system continues westward and nears the Date Line later in the week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)



COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 7 (+4) states, with 4 (-2) states in a plateau status, and 45 (-2) states on a downward trajectory. 23,799 (-328) Federal employees deployed / activated; 1,986 (-41) FEMA employees deployed.





Current Situation:

- Fire began August 16 and is burning 9 miles southwest from the city of Yakima (pop 94k) on tribal, state, and private land
- Threatening homes in and around the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation Reservation (pop 31,799)
- Threatening agricultural resources, irrigation systems, electrical utilities, recreational areas, tribal cultural areas, and the Ahtanum Creek Watershed
- ARC coordinating hotel rooms for evacuees

- FMAG approved August 17
- WA EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- Region X, Bothell MOC, and NWC continue to monitor



Current Situation:

- Complex is comprised of the Hennessey and Gamble fires
- Fires began August 17 and is burning on state and private land in Napa Valley (pop 80k), Napa County (pop 139k), CA
- Threatening homes in and around the eastern ridgeline of Napa Valley (pop 600)
- Threatening a water treatment plant and high voltage transmission lines both serving Napa and Calistoga
- Evacuation center established at the Crosswalk Church in Napa

- FMAG approved August 18
- CA EOC at Full Activation (Civil Unrest and COVID-19)
- Region IX RWC and NWC continue to monitor

- Threatening a school, historical and cultural sites, a county jail and high voltage transmission lines serving multiple communities along Highway 49
- · Evacuation center established in Penn Valley, CA
- Highway 49 closed

- CA EOC at Full Activation (Civil Unrest and COVID-19)
- Region IX RWC and NWC continue to monitor








States with Currently Occupied Units


