

Current Situation:

- Fires began August 17 and is burning on state and private land
- Fire is threating homes in the Napa, Lake, Solano, Sonoma, and Yolo counties, CA
- Estimated 500,000 people are threatened by this event
- 32 other large fires are burning uncontrolled within the State
- Travis Air Force Base installation commander has issued a mandatory evacuation
- C-17's from Travis are expected to evacuate to Joint Base Lewis-McChord
- Interstate 80 was previously closed but has since reopened
- No critical infrastructure has been impacted

- FMAG approved August 18
- CA EOC at Full Activation (Civil Unrest and COVID-19)
- Region IX RWC and NWC continue to monitor



Current Situation:

- The fire began on Aug 10 and is burning on Federal and State land in Garfield and Eagle County, CO (population 18,197)
- 28,030 acres burned; 4% contained
- Threatening 4,258 homes; 1,053 buildings, infrastructure, Glenwood watershed, and utilities in the area
- Mandatory evacuations are in effect for 231 homes
- I-70, a major thoroughfare through the Colorado Rockies and four other secondary routes are closed

- CO EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
- FEMA Region VIII RWC continues to monitor
- FEMA NWC continues to monitor
- FMAG was approved on Aug 19



Current Situation:

- The fire began on Jul 31 and has burned in excess of 125,100 acres in Garfield and Mesa counties, CO; currently 14% contained
- Threatening 50 homes in and around De Beque, CO (population 504) as well as infrastructure, utilities, and equipment in the area
- Mandatory evacuations are taking place for 37 people

- CO EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
- FEMA Region VIII RWC continues to monitor
- FEMA NWC continues to monitor
- FMAG was approved on Aug 19






Atlantic Overview TROPICAL OUTLOOK




Tropical Depression 13 SATELLITE LOOP




Tropical Depression 13 FORECAST TRACK



Tropical Depression 13 MOST LIKELY ARRIVAL OF TS WINDS




East Pacific Overview TROPICAL OUTLOOK

COVID-19 Update




Situation: Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 5 (-3) states, with 6 (+4) states in a plateau status, and 45 (-1) states on a downward trajectory. 23,298 (-320) Federal employees deployed / activated; 1,963 (-18) FEMA employees deployed.

Nationwide Testing: 74,830,464 (+1,266,925) cumulative as of Aug 19

COVID-19 positive cases continue to increase globally (CDC COVID-19 update as of Aug 19)

- Confirmed Cases of COVID-19
 - United States: 5,460,429 (+39,318)
 - Worldwide: 21,989,366 (+213,391)
- Deaths caused by COVID-19
 - o United States: 171,012 (+1,172)
 - o Worldwide: 775,893 (+4,644)

- NRCC at Level I
- Regions I, II, III, V, VI, VII, & X RRCCs at Level III
- Regions IV, VIII, & IX RRCCs are rostered
- Regions VII, VIII & IX COVID-19 response being worked from the Virtual JFO

Tropical Depression Thirteen is 915 miles ESE of Windward Islands moving WNW at 20 mph toward Puerto Rico and USVI. .


Preparations:

FEMA REGION II:

- RRCC at Level III; will transition to Level II with select ESFs, MERS, and air operations Aug 21 at 7:00 a.m. ET
- Region II IMAT deploying Aug 20 to USVI
- USVI:
 - USVI EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
 - FEMA LNO on standby to support USVI/PR
 - Region X DCE available to deploy to USVI if needed
- Puerto Rico:
 - PR EOC at Partial Activation (Earthquake & COVID-19)
 - Command and General Staff Structure established
 - DCE deploying virtually to PR beginning Aug 21


<u>FEMA HQ:</u>

- NRCC remains activated to Level 1 (COVID-19)
- NWC at Enhanced Watch (DNC/RNC)
- MERS deploying to USVI and PR
- Logistics personnel are deployed to USVI and PR

- US&R Equipment Cache pre-positioned in PR




National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Fire Weather Outlook




