### Tropical Outlook – Atlantic




#### **Tropical Storm Laura** (Advisory #14a as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 40 miles NNE of Port au Prince, Haiti
- Moving WNW at 18 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- Strengthening is forecast once Laura moves into the Gulf of Mexico Monday night and Tuesday
- On the forecast track the center will move across Hispaniola today, be near or over Cuba tonight and Monday, and over the southeastern Gulf of Mexico Monday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 140 miles

### Watches and Warnings

- Tropical Storm Watch for the Florida Keys from Ocean Reef to Key West and the Dry Tortugas; Florida Bay
- Rainfall amounts of 1-3 inches is expected across the Florida Keys



### Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



#### **Tropical Storm Marco** (Advisory #12a as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- 210 miles NW of the western tip of Cuba
- · Moving NNW at 13 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 70 mph
- · Tropical storm force winds extend 70 miles
- Forecast to continue moving NNW across the central Gulf of Mexico today and will approach southeastern LA on Monday. A gradual turn toward the W with a decrease in forward speed is expected after Marco moves inland on Monday and Tuesday.
- Some strengthening is anticipated, and Marco is expected to become a hurricane today and remain a hurricane when it approaches the northern Gulf coast on Monday. Rapid weakening is forecast after Marco moves inland.

#### Watches and Warnings

- · Storm Surge Warning from Morgan City, LA to Ocean Springs, MS and Lake Borgne
- Storm Surge Watch for Sabine Pass to Morgan City, LA; Ocean Springs to AL/FL border; Lake Pontchartrain, Lake Maurepas, and Mobile Bay
- · Hurricane Warning for Morgan City, LA to mouth of the Pearl River
- Hurricane Watch for Intracoastal City, LA to west of Morgan City; Lake Pontchartrain, Lake Maurepas, and metropolitan New Orleans
- Tropical Storm Warning for mouth of Pearl River to the MS/AL border; Lake Pontchartrain, Lake Maurepas, and metropolitan New Orleans
- Tropical Storm Watch for MS/AL border to AL/FL border

#### Hazard Affecting Land

- Storm surge: Sabine Pass to Morgan City, LA: 2-4 feet; Morgan City, LA to Ocean Springs, MS including Lake Borgne: 4-6 feet; Ocean Springs, MS to the AL/FL border including Mobile Bay: 2-4 feet; Lake Pontchartrain and Lake Maurepas: 2-4 feet
- Rainfall: Central U.S. Gulf Coast: 2-4 inches with isolated maximum amounts of 6 inches; may cause flash and urban flooding



### Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




#### Disturbance 1 (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles SSW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula, Mexico
- A tropical depression is likely to form during the early to middle part of next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (50%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (80%)

### Disturbance 2 (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Likely to form south of the Gulf of Tehuantepec during the next day or two
- Moving slowly NW or N
- A tropical depression is likely to form by the middle of next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)




## Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



### Disturbance 1 (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- The remnant low of Tropical Depression Ten-E, located 1,050 miles SE of Hilo, HI
- Moving slowly N
- Conditions expected to become increasingly unfavorable for development during the next couple of days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)

#### Situation:

Tropical Cyclones Laura and Marco threaten U.S. interests in the Caribbean and Gulf Coast.

#### **Lifeline Impacts**

#### Safety and Security

 USVI distributed sandbags to locations on St. Thomas, St. Croix and St. Johns Food, Water, Shelter

### Shelters: 22 open with 61 occupants

• PR: 13.7k (1.12%) customers without water service

#### Energy

- PR: 32.k (2.2%) customers without power
- USVI: 4,763 customers without power (Region II DSAR)

#### **Transportation**

PR and USVI ports at ZULU (closed)

#### State/Local Preparations/Response:

- PR EOC at Full Activation
  - PR Governor requested an Emergency Declaration on Aug 21 (approved Aug 22)
- USVI EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19 and tropical storms)
- FL EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19 and tropical storms)
  - o Governor requested an Emergency Declaration on Aug 21
- LA EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
  - Governor declared a state of emergency
  - o Governor requested an Emergency Declaration on August 22




#### Federal Preparations/Response:

- Region II RRCC at Level II (Full Activation) with select ESFs
  - IMAT deployed to USVI
  - LNO on standby to support USVI/PR
  - o Region X DCE available to deploy to USVI if needed
  - DCE deployed virtually to PR
- · Region IV RWC is rostering an Enhanced Watch for activation if necessary
  - o Region IV RRCC will go to Level III at 8:00 a.m. ET, Aug. 24-27 (RNC)
  - IMAT-2 and LNO deployed to Tallahassee, FL
- Region VI RRCC at Level II
  - IMAT-1 deployed to Austin, TX
  - IMAT-2 deployed to Baton Rouge, LA

#### **FEMA HQ:**

- NWC at Enhanced Watch (day shift only)
- NRCC will go to Level I, 24/7 on Aug. 24
- Logistics HQ: Staging Management Team (SMT) Atlanta deploying to Camp Beauregard, LA and National ISB team deploying to Craig Field, AL. SMT Fort Worth deployed to Roseland, LA.
- MERS deployed to USVI (x2), FL, PR LA, TX
- · IA and PA cadres on alert
- US&R Equipment Cache pre-positioned in PR
- Emergency Declaration FEMA-3537-EM-PR approved for Puerto Rico on August 22

<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 3 states, with 10 states in a plateau status, and 43 states on a downward trajectory.

23,110 Federal employees deployed / activated; 1,946 FEMA employees deployed.











### Severe Weather Outlook











# Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall












6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability



#### **Current Situation:**

- Fire began August 17 and is burning on federal, state and private land
- 15,000 acres burned; 0% contained
- 450 homes in and around Susanville (pop 17,974) and Jamesville (pop 1,408) threatened
- Also threatening two schools, two power generation stations along with substations and associated transmission lines, and a watershed
- 4 homes destroyed
- Mandatory evacuations for 1,000 people
- Evacuation center established at Quincy High School
- No fatalities or injuries

#### Response:

- CA EOC at Full Activation (Wildfires and COVID-19)
- Region IX RWC and NWC continue to monitor
- FMAG approved August 22, 2020


