## National Current Operations and Monitoring FEMA

### **Significant Incidents or Threats:**

- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Southwest; Southern Plains to Lower/Middle Mississippi Valley
- Severe thunderstorms possible Southern Plains to Lower/Middle Mississippi Valley; Mid-Atlantic to Northeast
- Critical fire weather Northern Intermountain to Northern Plains
- Post-Tropical Cyclone Laura
- Wildfires
- COVID-19

### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic:
  - Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
  - Disturbance 2: Medium (40%)
- Eastern Pacific:
  - Tropical Cyclone Iselle
- · Central Pacific:
  - Disturbance 1: Low (20%)
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Approval: Major Disaster Declaration – Louisiana

### Tropical Outlook – Atlantic




### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 550 miles E of Windward Islands
- · Moving W at 15 mph towards Lesser Antilles
- Some gradual development possible during next several days Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

#### Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over the eastern Atlantic Ocean just southwest of Cabo Verde Islands
- Some development is possible early next week over the eastern or central tropical Atlantic
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)




### Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



#### **Tropical Cyclone Iselle** (Advisory #12 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 400 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- Moving N at 6 mph
- Expected to weaken to a tropical depression tonight and degenerate to a remnant low on Sunday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 45 miles




### Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 850 miles SE of Hilo, HI
- Moving slowly W
- Conditions appear somewhat conducive for gradual development over the next several days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)



### Post-Tropical Cyclone Laura – Response Recovery



#### Situation:

At 5:00 a.m. Post-Tropical Cyclone Laura was 90 miles west of Charleston, WV **Lifeline Impacts:** 

#### Safety and Security (FEMA NRCC SLB, as of 6:00 a.m. ET, Aug 29)

- LA: 5 (-13) parishes remain under mandatory/voluntary evacuations; 5 parishes with curfews in place
- LA preliminary damage assessments: Jefferson Davis Parish over 150 trees and over 100 power poles downed, over 50 homes with severe damage; Grant Parish - 45% of residents sustained damage
- TX: Mandatory evacuations lifted for Chambers, Jasper, Polk, and Tyler counties and the city of Beaumont in Jefferson County; curfews in place for Jasper, Newton, and Tyler counties

#### Food, Water, Shelter

- LA: 186k residents in 21 parishes without water; boil water advisories for 99 public water systems in 28 parishes; LA will need generators and potable water
- TX: Boil water advisory for Orange, Jefferson, and Newton counties
- TX: Food POD operations were scheduled to begin August 28 for 5 counties (Jasper, Newton, Polk, Sabine and Tyler)
- LA: 3,546 occupants in congregate and non-congregate shelters
- TX: 10,707 occupants in congregate and non-congregate shelters

#### Health and Medical


- LA: 10 (+4) confirmed fatalities
- LA: 12 (+1) nursing homes evacuated; 30 (-14) on generator power
- LA will need generators and potable water for healthcare facilities
- TX: 8 (+1) hospitals and 109 nursing home/assisted living facilities evacuated

#### Energy (Eagle-I as of 6:15 a.m. ET)

- LA: 418k (19.5%) customers without power
- TX: 90k (0.75%) customers without power
- AR: 17k (1.25%) customers without power
- LA: 90 generators requested, 50 are en route

#### Communications

LA: 15% of cell sites in the disaster area are out of service



#### Transportation

- LA ports: Morgan City, Port Fourchon, and Louisiana Offshore Oil Port open with restrictions
- TX ports: Corpus Christi and all Houston open; Texas City, Galveston, and Freeport open with restrictions; Port Arthur closed
- Roads: LA: I-10 reopened from southwest LA to TX state line
- All airports have reopened

#### Hazardous Material

- Lake Charles chemical fire contained; shelter in place order lifted
- Potential oil-spill reported



- LA & TX EOCs at Partial Activation; State of Emergency declared
- · TX: Governor mobilized National Guard
- TX & LA declared Public Health Emergencies
- LA Governor requested a Major Disaster Declaration on August 28; approved August 28

### Federal Preparations / Response:

- NRCC at Level I, 24/7
- National IMAT Gold deployed to Lake Charles, LA; National IMAT Red deployed to Baton Rouge, LA
- Region I IMAT deployed to Lake Charles, LA
- Region V IMAT deployed to Little Rock, AR
- · Region VI RRCC at Level II with select ESFs
  - o IMAT-1 deployed to Lake Charles, LA; IMAT-2 deployed to Baton Rouge, LA
- Logistics HQ: SMT Atlanta deployed to Camp Beauregard, LA, SMT Fort Worth deployed to Roseland, LA, National ISB Team deployed to Craig Field, AL
- MERS deployed to Baton Rouge, Pineville, and Lake Charles, LA
- Emergency Declarations approved for PR, LA, MS, TX and AR
- Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4559-DR-EM approved August 28
- USCG staged air and watercrafts in AL and LA
- · USACE deployed teams to LA & TX
- US&R deployed to LA: TN-TF1, IN-TF-1, CO-TF1 & OH-TF1 and Blue IST
- Federal Search and Rescue Coordination Group demobilized



### COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 5 states/territories, with 8 (+4) states/territories in a plateau status, and 42 (-4) states/territories on a downward trajectory. 21,704 (-231) Federal employees deployed / activated; 1,954 (+32) FEMA employees deployed.



  - o Worldwide: 827,246 (+6,483)



- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs are monitoring






### Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



### California Wildfires – Response / Recovery



#### Situation:

367 fires are currently burning across CA; 24 are classified as major fires; 8 have FMAGS approved with a combined 1.48 (+20k) million acres burned. 68k (-2k) homes are threatened, and 1,400 (+20) homes destroyed. Air Quality Alerts in effect for 12 (+1) counties.

Lifeline Impacts: (FEMA Region IX Tri-Fold #10, as of Aug 29)

#### Safety and Security

 Evacuations: Mandatory and voluntary in effect for 18 counties; approximately 77k people under mandatory evacuations

#### Food, Water, Shelter

- Shelters:
  - o Congregate: 12 open shelters with 1,066 occupants
  - o Non-congregate: 3,516 occupants

#### <u>Energy</u>

10,400 PG&E customers without power

#### <u>HAZMAT</u>


 Boulder Creek Waste Water Plant was destroyed by CZU Complex, monitoring the situation and coordinating with Bear Creek as back up

- CA EOC at Full Activation (Wildfires & COVID-19)

- FEMA-4558-DR-CA approved on August 22
- Region IX IMAT-1 deployed to CA (Wildfires)
- MERS assets deployed to Tracy and to Mather, CA
- · NWC and Region IX RWC continue to monitor


