National Current Operations and Monitoring FEMA

Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Tropical Cyclone Laura Response / Recovery
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Southern Plains to the Ohio Valley
- Wildfires
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic:
 - Tropical Depression Fifteen
 - Disturbance 1 (Invest 90L): High (80%)
 - Disturbance 2: Medium (40%)
- Eastern Pacific:
 - Disturbance 1: Low (10%)
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Declaration Activity:

- Major Disaster Declaration Request Delaware
- Amendment No. 2 to FEMA-4559-LA

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Tropical Depression Fifteen (Advisory #3 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 100 miles SE of Cape Hatteras, NC
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Moving NE at 13 mph
- On the forecast track the center will move away from the NC coast today
- Small chance to become a tropical storm later today; system could degenerate into a remnant low by Wednesday night
- Swells will continue to affect portions of the Outer Banks of NC through this evening, causing life-threatening surf and rip current conditions

Disturbance 1 (Invest 90L) (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Moving quickly west across the central Caribbean Sea
- A tropical depression or tropical storm is likely to form during the next day or so
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (80%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (80%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Expected to emerge off the coast of Africa in a day or so
- Gradual development possible through the end of the week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)








Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 850 miles S of the southern tip of the Baja California Peninsula, Mexico
- Moving slowly W
- Forecast to become unfavorable for any further development by Thursday
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)

Tropical Cyclone Laura – Response / Recovery



Situation: Efforts to stabilize community lifelines continue. Restoration of power and

water remain critical priorities. Resources continue to move into impacted states to supply newly established PODs (Points of Distribution) and efforts are underway to secure lodging solutions for emergency responders and restoration crews

Lifeline Impacts: (FEMA NRCC SLB, as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Aug 31 & 6:00 a.m. ET, Sep 1) Safety and Security

- LA: Mandatory evacuation orders remain in effect for 4 parishes
- CAP conducting aerial assessments; 14 (+6) missions complete

Food, Water, Shelter

4 million liters of water staged

LA:

- 10,246 (+2,019) occupants in congregate and non-congregate shelters
- 83 (-3) of 1,301 drinking water facilities inoperable, affecting 142k (-4k) customers
- Food/Water: 24 (+3) of up to 40 (+4) PODs operational; 2 scheduled to open

- 11,711 (+486) occupants in non-congregate shelters
- Food/Water: All 19 (+4) PODs operational
- 43 (+8) of 164 drinking water facilities inoperable, affecting 17k (+5k) customers Health and Medical

LA:


- 15 (+3) confirmed fatalities
- 15 hospitals evacuated: 14 (+1) on generator power: 11 nursing homes evacuated. 19 (-10) on generator power
- 5 Community Based Testing Sites resumed operations on Aug 31

TX:

- 4 unconfirmed storm-related fatalities
- All hospitals have returned to normal operations

Transportation

All major & primary roads are clear, debris clearance underway



Energy (Eagle I as of 6:00 a.m. ET)

- Customers without power: TX: 36k; LA: 260k
 - Flooding/debris removal slowing restoration;
 - Full restoration for parts of LA expected to take several weeks
- LA: 143 generators available
- Strategic Petroleum Reserve Site Impacts
- West Hackberry conducting assessments; operating on generators



- National IMAT Gold demobilized Aug 30

- Region VI RRCC at Level II with select ESFs
 - o IMAT-1 deployed to Austin; IMAT-2 deployed to Baton Rouge

ASTEROID 2011 ES4



Situation:

On September 1, 2020 asteroid 2011 ES4, will pass closer than the moon.


- Estimated diameter of 72-161 feet
- Expected to pass by in a window of between 30% of the earth-moon distance to outside the moons orbit, 0.19 – 3.4 lunar distances

Potential Impacts:

- No earth impact is forecasted
- No shock wave expected

- DoD and NASA are monitoring
- FEMA NWC is monitoring





