National Current Operations and Monitoring FEMA

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Tropical Cyclone Paulette (Advisory #14 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 935 miles ENE of the Northern Leeward Islands
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Some weakening is forecast during the next couple of days;
 re-strengthening expected to begin over the weekend
- Tropical storm force winds extend 205 miles

Tropical Cyclone Rene (Advisory #13 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 730 miles WNW of Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Gradual strengthening is forecast during the next 48 hours;
 expected to be near hurricane strength by Friday night
- Tropical storm force winds extend 70 miles







Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located just off the coast of North Carolina
- Expected to move inland over eastern NC this afternoon; significant development is not expected
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (near 0%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- A couple hundred miles NE of Central Bahamas
- Forecast to cross the Bahamas and Florida on Friday, and into the eastern Gulf of Mexico over the weekend
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over northeastern Gulf of Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)

Disturbance 4 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Moving off the west coast of Africa
- Tropical depression expected to form by this weekend or early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (60%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)



Disturbance 5 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to emerge off the west coast of Africa
- Tropical depression could form early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)

Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 400 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California Peninsula, Mexico
- · Moving slowly W
- Only marginally conducive for some development during the next several days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)


Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 350 miles SSW of the coast of southwest Mexico
- Moving slowly WNW away from the coast of Mexico
- Gradual development is possible; tropical depression could form over the weekend or early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (50%)

Wildfires – Western US

<u>Situation (as of 06:00 am ET):</u> More than 118 large fires are currently burning uncontained across the US, the majority of which are in FEMA Regions VIII, IX and X (NIFC SITREP, Sep 9). The NWC is closely monitoring 22 FMAG-approved wildfires. Homes, public facilities and infrastructure are threatened.

<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 23 (+2) states/territories, with 12 (+4) states/territories in a plateau status, and 21 (-3) states/territories on a downward trajectory. 19,795 (-452) Federal employees deployed / activated; 1,738 (+1) FEMA employees deployed. (COVID-19 SLB, as of Sep 9)







National Weather Forecast










Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall















