Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Tropical Cyclone Sally (Advisory #7A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 155 miles W of Port Charlotte, Florida
- Moving WNW at 13 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Forecast to become a hurricane on Monday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 90 miles
- Storm Surge Warning: Port Fourchon, LA to MS/AL border; Lake Pontchartrain, Lake Maurepas, and Lake Borgne
- Hurricane Warning: Grand Isle, LA to Ocean Springs, MS; Lake Pontchartrain and Lake Maurepas including metropolitan New Orleans
- Storm Surge Watch: MS/AL border to AL/FL border
- Hurricane Watch: east of Ocean Springs to AL/FL border
- · Tropical Storm Warning: east of Ocean Springs, MS to Indian Pass, FL
- Rainfall amounts of 6 to 12 inches with isolated amounts of 20 inches over portions of the central Gulf Coast between the western FL Panhandle and far southeast LA from Monday into the middle of the week

Tropical Cyclone Paulette (CAT 1) (Advisory #26A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 280 miles SE of Bermuda
- Moving WNW at 14 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 80 mph
- Hurricane-force winds extend 25 miles ;tropical-storm-force winds extend 195 miles

Tropical Cyclone Rene (Advisory #25 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,160 miles ENE of the Northern Leeward Islands
- Moving NW at 14 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 30 mph
- Forecast to become a remnant low on Monday









Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Tropical Cyclone Twenty (Advisory #3 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 815 miles WSW of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving WNW at 17 mph
- · Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Forecast to become a tropical storm by Tuesday and could become a hurricane in a few days

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- · Located over west-central Gulf of Mexico
- Moving SW and then S at 5-10 mph
- Any development is expected to be slow to occur
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Located over a hundred miles W of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving NNW at 5-10 mph
- Tropical depression is likely to form before it moves over colder waters and into an area of strong upper-level winds by Tuesday
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (70%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 2800 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to move off the west coast of Africa within the next couple of days
- Moving slowly W over the far eastern tropical Atlantic
- · Some gradual development is possible
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)








Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Tropical Cyclone Karina (Advisory #2 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 455 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- · Moving NW at 12 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend out to 90 miles
- Gradual strengthening expected during the next couple of days

Wildfires – Western US



Situation: There are over 100 large fires throughout the Western U.S., which have burned over 5 million acres in Regions VIII, IX, and X. The FEMA National Watch is monitoring and reporting on uncontained fires that have received Fire Management Assistance Grants (FMAGs), are currently threatening homes, or causing evacuations. In Region VIII, efforts to stabilize community lifelines continue as wildfire evacuations have lifted in 2 of 3 states. FEMA Regional Watches will continue to monitor and report on all wildfires within their respective regions. Currently, there are no unmet needs



Current Situation:

- The fire began on Sep 7 and is burning on federal and private land in Lake County, 130 miles south of Bend, OR
- Threatening 114 homes in and around the community of Paisley, OR (pop 240)
- Also threatening Fremont-Winema National Forest, Highway 31, the local rural airport, and high value industrial timber in the area
- Mandatory evacuations for 114 homes; several other homes under voluntary evacuations

- OR EOC at Full Activation (Wildfires & COVID-19)
- Region X RRCC at Level III with ESFs (Wildfires & COVID-19)
- Region X IMAT deployed to OR EOC
- Region X, Bothell MOC, and NWC continue to monitor
- FMAG approved Sep 12




National Weather Forecast











Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall









6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




