
Tropical Cyclone Sally (CAT 1) (Advisory #16A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 65 miles ESE of the mouth of the Mississippi River
- Moving NW at 2 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 85 mph
- Expected to be a dangerous hurricane when it moves onshore along the northcentral Gulf coast.
- Hurricane force winds extend 45 miles; tropical storm force winds extend 125 miles
 Watches and Warnings
- Storm Surge Warning: Mouth of the Mississippi River to Okaloosa/Walton County Line in FL
- Hurricane Warning: East of the Mouth of the Pearl River to Navarre Florida
- Tropical Storm Warning: East of Navarre, FL to Indian Pass, FL; Mouth of the Pearl River westward to Grand Isle Louisiana Lake Pontchartain and Lake Maurepas and metro New Orleans

Hazards Affecting Land

- Rainfall: 10-20 inches, isolated amounts of 30 inches, over portions of the central Gulf Coast from western FL panhandle to far southeast MS through the middle of the week. Life-threatening flash flooding is likely
- Storm Surge: 6-9 feet from Ocean Springs, MS to Dauphin Island, AL; 4-7 feet
 Mouth of the Mississippi River to Oceans Springs, MS; 4-7 feet for Dauphin Island,
 AL to AL/FL Border; 2-4 feet from AL/FL border to Okaloosa/Walton County Line, FL






<u>Tropical Cyclone Paulette</u> (CAT 2) (Advisory #34 as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 405 miles NE of Bermuda
- Moving NE at 31 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 105 mph
- Strengthening is likely through tonight
- Weakening is forecast to begin by late Wednesday
- Hurricane-force winds extend 60 miles; tropical-storm-force winds extend 230 miles






<u>Tropical Cyclone Teddy</u> (Advisory #11 as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,030 miles E of the Lesser Antilles
- Moving W at 19 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Strengthening is forecast during the next few days
- · Forecast to become a hurricane by tonight
- Tropical storm force winds extend 115 miles

Tropical Cyclone Vicky (Advisory #5 as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 500 miles WNW of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving NW at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Weakening is expected to begin by tonight
- Forecast to degenerate to a remnant low by Wednesday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 105 miles





Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over the southwestern Gulf of Mexico
- · Any development of this system should be slow to occur
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)


Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- · Few hundred miles SSE of the Cabo Verde Islands
- A tropical depression is likely to form the next few days
- Moving W at 10-15 mph
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (50%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)

Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over the far northeastern Atlantic
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)






Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Tropical Cyclone Karina (Advisory #10 as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 720 miles WSW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Moving NW at 19 mph
- Forecast to become a remnant low in two or three days
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend out to 105 miles




Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific





Wildfires – Western US















Situation: There are over 100 large fires throughout the Western U.S., which have burned over 5 million acres in Regions VIII, IX, and X. The FEMA National Watch is monitoring and reporting on uncontained fires that have received Fire Management Assistance Grants (FMAGs). Lifelines in California, Colorado, and Washington are stable, except for the Health and Medical lifeline (COVID-19), while lifelines in Oregon remain yellow for wildfire response efforts. Federal assets have mobilized in support; currently there are no additional unmet needs.




