




Tropical Depression 22 FORECAST TRACK




Tropical Depression 22 MOST LIKELY ARRIVAL OF TS WINDS




Hurricane Teddy SATELLITE

Hurricane Teddy Most Likely Arrival of ts winds





Tropical Cyclone Sally – Stabilization



<u>Situation:</u> Heavy rainfall, flooding, gusty winds, and the risk of a few tornadoes will continue over portions of the Southeast U.S. as Sally continues to weaken. Damage assessments, roadway/bridge inspections and restoration are ongoing where conditions permit.

















Lifeline Impacts: (NRCC & Region IV SLB as of 6:00 a.m. ET Sept 18th)

Safety and Security:

- · AL: Voluntary evacuations: 2 counties
- · FL: Voluntary evacuations: 4 counties
 - o State SAR assets moved to the FL Panhandle
- · SAR: 30 high water vehicles & 18 rotary wing aircraft have been sourced

Food, Water, Shelter:

- Shelters: AL: 2 (-2) open / 68 (-12) occupants
 - o 4 drinking water systems non-operational; 300 people impacted
 - 4k tarps enroute (ETA today)
- Shelters: FL: 4 (+1) open / 298 (+150) occupants
 - o Wastewater: 2 systems impacted: 1 without power, 1 under water
 - o Potable & sewer water shut off for the greater Pensacola Beach area; 256k impacted

Health and Medical:

- AL: 1 nursing closed due to damage; 3 hospitals & 12 nursing homes on generator power
- FL: 14 nursing homes on generator power; 5 hospitals report damage

Energy: (Eagle-I, as of 6:15 a.m. ET)

- AL: 227k (-48k),7% customers without power
- FL: 150k (-46k), 1.3% customers without power
 - $\circ\,$ State request for one generator packs (30 generators) & Bill of Materials kit for 21 days

Communications:

Cell Sites operational in reporting counties: AL: 73%; FL: 82%

Transportation

- AL: All airports, interstate routes & national highway system open, except US 98 & AL 59; alternate routes available; ports remains closed
- FL: Pensacola Port, Airport, & Three Mile Bridge closed; Alternative routes available
 - o Barges previously adrift are all grounded; no longer a threat







<u>Situation:</u> 94 large fires are currently burning uncontained from the West Coast across to the Rocky Mountains, covering a good portion of FEMA Regions VIII, IX, and X. 20 Fire Management Assistance Grants (FMAGs) have been approved. Mandatory evacuations remain in effect throughout the impacted areas <u>but have decreased by approximately 14K</u> over the last 24 hours. The U.S. Air Quality Index ranges from "Moderate to Hazardous" from Central California to northern Washington state, but have improved in some areas. No

unmet needs at this time..









Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Fire Weather Outlook






