






## Tropical Storm Beta SATELLITE




### **Tropical Storm Beta FORECAST TRACK**






# Tropical Storm Beta MOST LIKELY ARRIVAL OF TS WINDS




### Tropical Storm Beta PEAK STORM SURGE FORECAST




# Tropical Storm Beta 5 DAY RAINFALL




# Tropical Storm Beta FLASH FLOOD POTENTIAL




### Hurricane Teddy FORECAST TRACK




# Hurricane Teddy MOST LIKELY ARRIVAL OF TS WINDS

#### Situation:


The center of TC Beta continues to move towards the central coast of TX; expected to move inland tonight where weakening will begin.

#### State/Local Preparations and Response: (as of 9:00 a.m. ET)

- TX EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19 & TC Beta)
- Voluntary evacuations ongoing for coastal counties of TX

#### FEMA/Federal Preparations and Response:

- NRCC at Level III (COVID-19)
- FEMA RVI RRCC at Level II; RWC Enhanced Watch (nights)
  IMAT-1 deployed to Austin, TX
- US&R:
  - Mission Ready Package Command IST (10 personnel)
  - NIMS Type 3 US&R task force (TN-TF1 45 personnel)



### Wildfires – Western US




Situation: Wildfires continue to burn uncontained from the West Coast across to the Rocky Mountains. Mandatory evacuations remain in effect throughout the impacted regions. The U.S. Air Quality Index ranges from "Moderate to Hazardous" from Central California to northern Washington state, but have improved in some areas. No unmet needs at this time.




