
### **Tropical Activity:**

- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests



### **Tropical Storm Lowell** (Advisory #19 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,160 miles W of the southern tip of Baja California
- Moving W at 12 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Gradual weakening expected; forecast to become a remnant low today
- · Tropical storm force winds extend outward 90 miles

### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Expected to form south or southwest of the southwest coast of Mexico next week
- · Gradual development possible
- 48-hour Formation Chance: Low (near 0%)
- 5-day Formation Chance: Medium (40%)

<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 22 states/territories, with 15 (+2) states/territories in a plateau status, and 19 (-2) states/territories on a downward trajectory. 19,691 Federal employees deployed / activated; 1,467 (-2) FEMA employees deployed. (COVID-19 SLB, as of Sep 24)

Nationwide Testing: 107,300,299 (+936,548) cumulative (as of Sep 24)

COVID-19 positive cases continue to increase globally (CDC COVID-19 update as of Sep 24)

United States: 6,916,292 (+41,310)Worldwide: 31,664,104 (+284,531)




### Response:


- NRCC conducting COVID response operations






### Wildfires – Western US



<u>Situation:</u> Of the over 7 million acres burned, the National Watch Center continues to track 12 active fires that have burned over 2 million acres from the West Coast to the Rocky Mountains. Mandatory evacuations continue throughout the impacted regions. Current U.S. Air Quality Index ranges from "Moderate" to Very Unhealthy" for Central California to northern Washington state. No reported unmet needs.




