



<u>Tropical Storm Marie</u> (Advisory #5 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 630 miles SSW of the southern tip of the Baja California, Mexico
- Moving W at 16 mph
- Maximum sustained winds at 60 mph
- · Additional strengthening is likely

Disturbance 1 (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a few hundred miles south of the coast of southwestern Mexico
- Formation Chance next 48 hours Low (Near 0%)
- Formation chance next 5 days Low (30%)


Atlantic


Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over the west-central Caribbean Sea
- Tropical depression could form late this week or this weekend
- 48-hour Formation Chance: Low (near 10%)

National Weather Forecast








Wildfires – Western US



Situation: Of the over 7 million acres burned, the National Watch Center continues to track 11 (-2) active fires that have burned over 2 million acres from the West Coast to the Rocky Mountains. Mandatory evacuations continue throughout the impacted regions. No reported unmet needs.

<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 26 (+2) states/territories, with 13 (-2) states/territories in a plateau status, and 17 states/territories on a downward trajectory. 19,579 Federal employees deployed / activated; 1,465 FEMA employees deployed. (COVID-19 SLB, as of Sep 28)

Nationwide Testing: 111,348,492 (+2,738,833) cumulative (as of Sep 28)

COVID-19 positive cases continue to increase globally (CDC COVID-19 update as of Sep 28)

United States: 7,095,422 (+36,335)Worldwide: 32,968,853 (+294,014)






