Earthquakes – Southern California



Situation: USGS reported a swarm of 138 earthquakes in Southern California over the past 24 hours, beginning at approximately 8:30 p.m. ET on 30 Sep. The strongest of the quakes was Magnitude 4.9, with a peak MMI of VIII near the epicenter on agricultural lands. The nearest city of Westmoreland (pop 2,225) experienced no greater than an MMI of VI. A YELLOW pager alert was issued for economic losses.





Eastern Pacific


Hurricane Marie (Cat 1) (Advisory #9 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 775 miles SW of the southern tip of the Baja California, Mexico
- Moving W at 17 mph
- Maximum sustained winds at 90 mph
- Expected to become a major hurricane by tonight
- Hurricane strength winds extend 15 miles
- Tropical storm force winds extends 70 miles

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- A few hundred miles southwest of the southwestern coast of Mexico
- Tropical depression could form next week
- 48-hour Formation Chance: Low (near 0%)
- 5-day Formation Chance: Medium (40%)





Atlantic

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Located over the west-central Caribbean Sea
- Tropical depression could form in a day or so
- 48-hour Formation Chance: Medium (40%)
- 5-day Formation Chance: High (70%)


Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Located just east of Lesser Antilles

National Weather Forecast








Wildfires – Western US




<u>Situation:</u> Of the over 7 million acres burned, the National Watch Center continues to track 11 active fires that have burned over 2 million acres from the West Coast to the Rocky Mountains. Mandatory evacuations continue throughout the impacted regions. No reported unmet needs.

<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 26 states/territories, with 8 states/territories in a plateau status, and 17 states/territories on a downward trajectory. 16,384 National Guard deployed / activated; 1,318 (+11) FEMA employees deployed. (COVID-19 SLB, as of Sep 30)

Nationwide Testing: 113,447,795 (+2,000,000) cumulative (as of Sep 30)

COVID-19 positive cases continue to increase globally (COVID-19 SLB as of Sep 30)
