



- Expected to form several hundred miles SW of the coast of southwestern Mexico
- 48-hour Formation Chance: Low (near 0%)
- 5-day Formation Chance: Low (20%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Could form S or SE of the Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Gradual development possible
- 48-hour Formation Chance: Low (near 0%)
- 5-day Formation Chance: Low (20%)

Current Disturbances and Five-Day Cyclone Formation Chance:

Sat Oct 3 2020

- Located in eastern and central Caribbean Sea
- Tropical depression could form next week
- 48-hour Formation Chance: Low (20%)
- 5-day Formation Chance: Medium (50%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located between Africa and the Lesser Antilles
- 48-hour Formation Chance: Low (20%)
- 5-day Formation Chance: Low (20%)

Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- 1,000 miles ESE of Bermuda
- 48-hour Formation Chance: Low (10%)
- 5-day Formation Chance: Low (10%)

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Tropical Storm Gamma (Advisory #4A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 40 miles SSE of Tulum, Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds 65 mph
- Moving NW at 9 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 80 miles
- Additional strengthening possible before Gamma makes landfall on the Yucatan Peninsula today
 - o After landfall, some weakening is expected




Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Hurricane Marie (CAT 4) (Advisory #17 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,120 miles WSW of the southern tip of the Baja California
- Moving NW at 9 mph
- · Maximum sustained winds at 130 mph
- Hurricane strength winds extend 30 miles
- Tropical storm force winds extends 150 miles



Wildfires – Western US



<u>Situation:</u> Of the over 7 million acres burned, the National Watch Center continues to track 11 active fires that have burned nearly 2 million acres from the West Coast to the Rocky Mountains. Mandatory evacuations continue throughout the impacted regions. No reported unmet needs.






National Weather Forecast






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall





COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 29 states/territories, with 8 (+2) states/territories in a plateau status, and 19 (+2) states/territories on a downward trajectory. 16,763 (+379) National Guard deployed / activated; 1,293 (-14) FEMA employees deployed. (COVID-19 SLB, as of Oct 2)


Nationwide Testing: 115,475,943 (+1,001,062) cumulative (as of Oct 2)




