Significant Incidents or Threats:


- Hurricane Zeta Preparations/Response
- Wildfires Western U.S.
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Lower/Middle Mississippi Valley to Tennessee and Ohio valleys and Southern Appalachians
- Severe thunderstorms possible Lower Mississippi Valley and Southeast
- Freezing rain possible Southern/Central Plains
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:


- Atlantic: Hurricane Zeta (CAT 1)
- Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

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

MOST LIKELY ARRIVAL OF TS WINDS




HurricaneZeta PEAK STORM SURGE FORECAST





DAY 1 CONVECTIVE OUTLOOK





Hurricane Zeta – Preparation/Response



<u>Lifeline Impacts</u>: (NRCC SLB Oct 27 6:00 p.m. ET and Oct 28 6:00 a.m. ET) Safety and Security

- LA: voluntary and partial mandatory evacuations for 4 parishes
- · MS: mandatory evacuation for City of Gulfport Municipal Marina

Food, Water, Shelter


- Meals, water and tarps are pre-staged within Regions IV and VI
- LA: 8 water systems serving a population of 2,099 with water outages due to TC Delta; 18 systems remain under boil water advisories affecting 12,566 people
- Shelters:
 - LA: 1 congregate with 41 occupants; 3,556 occupants in non-congregate
 - MS: 9 congregate shelters on stand-by with capacity of 1,489 occupants
 - FL: 3 congregate shelters on stand-by in 3 counties


Health and Medical

- LA: 1 assisted living facility has evacuated as a precautionary measure Energy
- · 56 generators staged at Craig Field, AL
- LA: 5,500 power restoration crews staged in-state

<u>Transportation</u>

- Several ports in LA and AL are at X-Ray and Whiskey status (open to all commercial and recreational traffic; gale force winds predicted to arrive within 48 and 72 hours) (CISA SITREP Oct 27 7:51 p.m. ET)
- LA: Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport anticipated to suspend operations prior to the arrival of tropical storm force winds (CISA SITREP Oct 27 7:51 p.m. ET)





Hurricane Zeta – Preparation/Response



<u>Current Situation</u>: Zeta is strengthening. Life-threatening storm surge and strong winds expected along portions of the northern Gulf Coast beginning midday.

Potential Impacts:


- Storm Surge Warning: Mouth of the Atchafalaya River to Navarre, FL; Lake Borgne, Lake Pontchartrain, Pensacola Bay, and Mobile Bay
- Hurricane Warning: Morgan City, LA to the MS/AL border; Lake Pontchartrain, Lake Maurepas, and metropolitan New Orleans
- Tropical Storm Warning: MS/AL border to Walton/Bay County Line, FL
- · Tropical Storm Watch: west of Morgan City to Intracoastal City, LA
- Locally heavy rains in advance of Zeta will continue to expand and move north from the central Gulf Coast today, eventually affecting the Ohio Valley to the Central Appalachians tonight and Thursday. The core of heavy rains near Zeta will track from the central Gulf Coast to the Mid-Atlantic this afternoon through Thursday evening. Rainfall totals of 2-4 inches with isolated amounts of 6 inches are expected across these areas, resulting in flash, urban, small stream, and minor river flooding
- A few tornadoes are expected this afternoon through tonight over southeastern parts of LA and MS, southern AL, and the western panhandle of FL

State/Local Preparations and Continuing Response:

- LA EOC at Partial Activation (TC Laura, Delta, Zeta and COVID-19)
 - Governor requested an Emergency Declaration; approved October 27
- AL EOC at Partial Activation (TC Sally, Delta, Zeta and COVID-19); Governor declared a state of emergency
- MS EOC at Partial Activation (TC Delta, Zeta and COVID-19)
- FL EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)

FEMA/Federal Preparations and Continuing Response:

- NRCC at Level III (day shift only, TC Zeta & COVID-19); NWC will go to Enhanced Watch (night shift) on October 28
- Region IV RRCC at Level III, day shift
 - IMAT-1 Deployed to MS EOC, LNO supporting virtually; IMAT-2 and LNO deployed to AL EOC



- Region VI RRCC at Level III (COVID-19); RWC is monitoring
 - IMAT-1 and IMAT-2 deployed to Baton Rouge, LA (TC Laura & Zeta)
 - LNO deployed to LA EOC
- SMT deployed in Camp Beauregard, LA (TC Laura/Delta)
- USAR: TN-TF1, and TX-TF1 on alert

<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 41 (+1) states/territories, with 8 (-1) jurisdictions in a plateau status, and 7 jurisdictions on a downward trajectory; 1,240 (-2) FEMA employees deployed. (COVID-19 SLB, as of Oct 27)




Response:

Flood Hazard Outlook – Hurricane Zeta




