

VACCINE NEWS: WEEKLY REVIEW

THIS WEEK'S PROGRESS

- All Kentuckians 16 and older are eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine. The Pfizer vaccine is approved for individuals 16 and older; the Moderna and Johnson & Johnson vaccines are approved for individuals 18 and older.
- On April 5, Gov. Andy Beshear and Dr. Steven Stack, commissioner of the Kentucky Department for Public Health, shared new guidance from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that fully vaccinated Americans can safely travel domestically. The updated travel guidance has been posted on kycovid19.ky.gov.
- On April 8, the Governor said more than 1.5 million Kentuckians have received at least their first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. To see a list of vaccination sites that have openings, visit vaccinemap.ky.gov.

NEXT WEEK'S GOALS

- Cardinal Stadium COVID-19 vaccination site in Louisville has 11,000 appointments that Kentuckians can preregister for at UofLHealth.org or by calling [502-681-1453](tel:502-681-1453). The vaccination site (2800 S. Floyd St., Louisville, KY 40209), which will become the state's largest, opens April 12. The Governor also shared a [video message](#) from UofL Health's chief medical officer, Dr. Jason Smith.

- Gov. Beshear said, "If you haven't gotten your COVID-19 vaccine yet, look at our list of where you can get your shot of hope this week, at vaccinemap.ky.gov. If you've already been vaccinated, reach out to one friend or family member who is still trying to get signed up and see if you can help them. This is an all-hands-on-deck effort. We are in a race against harmful COVID-19 variants that could threaten the progress we've all sacrificed so much to achieve."
