- Presidential Address to Joint Session of Congress



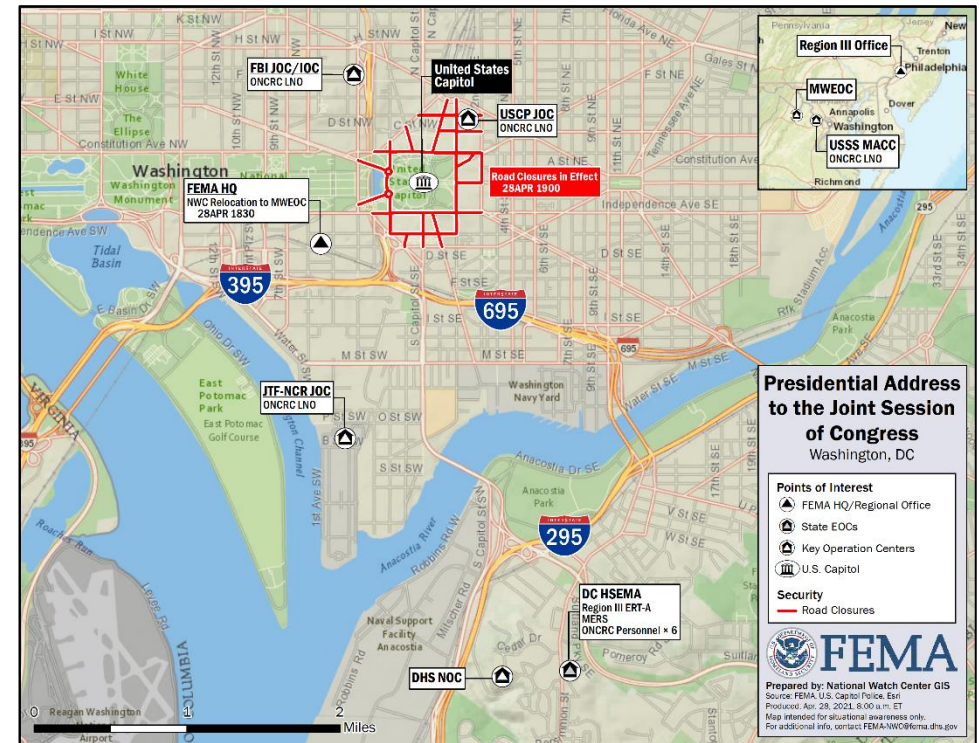

# Presidential Address to Joint Session of Congress

**Situation:** The President will address a Joint Session of Congress this evening in Washington DC, FEMA has lead responsibility for consequence management for this event.

## Preparations/Response:

- FEMA HQ
  - NWC: Monitoring / Alternate Location (6:30 p.m. ET – 6:30 a.m. ET), NWC Threat Monitoring Team on standby
  - NRCC: Level I, dayshift, (COVID-19). NRCS members, ESFs, and LNOs prepared to activate for 24/7 operations
  - Response LNOs available to support FBI SIOC, NJTTF, and DHS JIAG
  - CMCU, DEST, & National IMAT Blue: On Alert Effective 3:00 p.m. ET
  - US&R: Issued ESF #9 advisory
  - Mobile Emergency Response Support (MERS): Assets supporting RIII & ONCRC
- FEMA Region III
  - RRCC activating to Level III (3:00 p.m. ET – 11:00 p.m. ET)
  - IMAT on alert for the duration of the event
- ONCRC
  - Deploying 6 personnel to DCHSEMA; LNOs deployed to USSS MCCC, FBI SECP, Capitol Police HQ, and JTF-NCR JOC
- States / District of Columbia
  - DC EOC at Partial Activation; Full activation (4:00 p.m. ET - 12:00 a.m. ET)
  - MD & VA EOC at Partial Activation

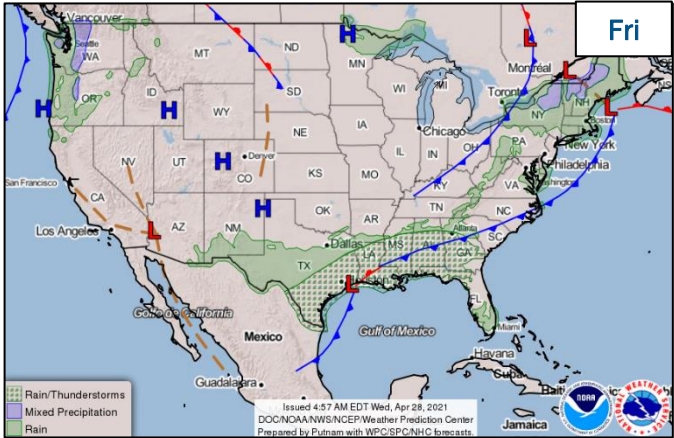
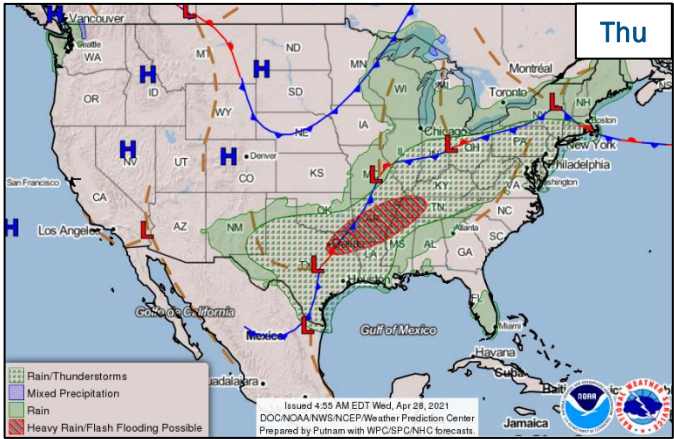
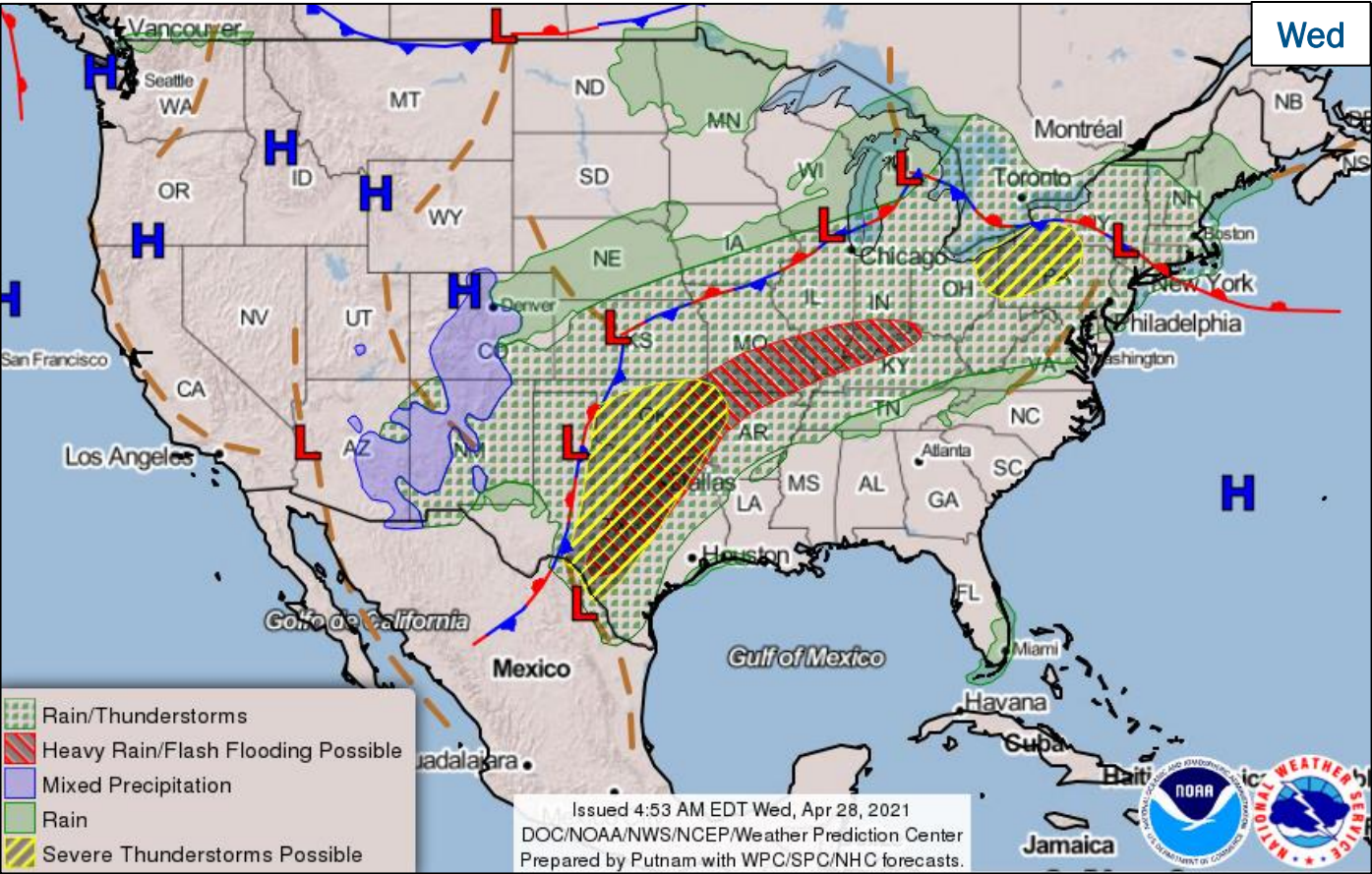

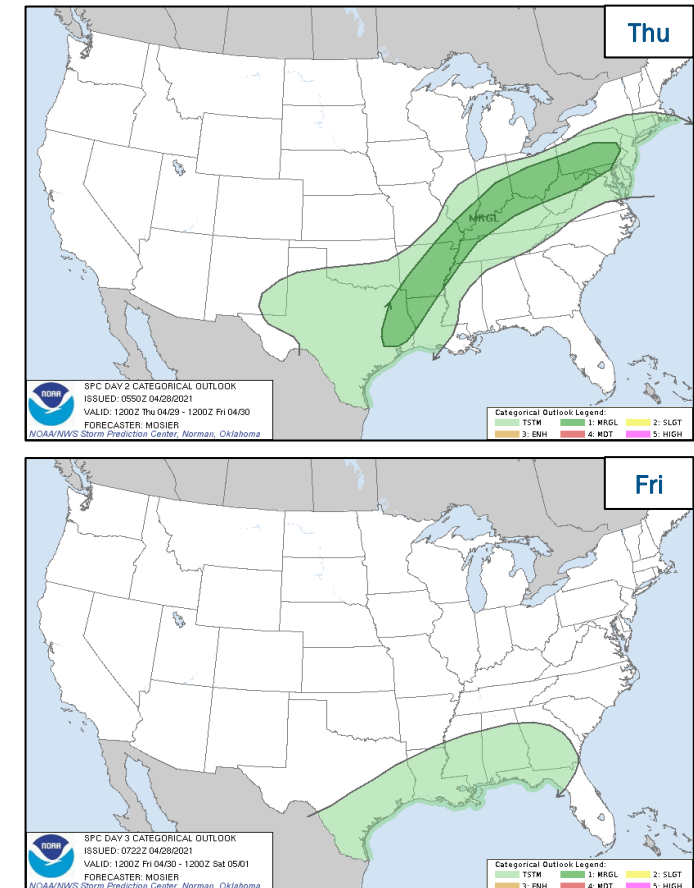
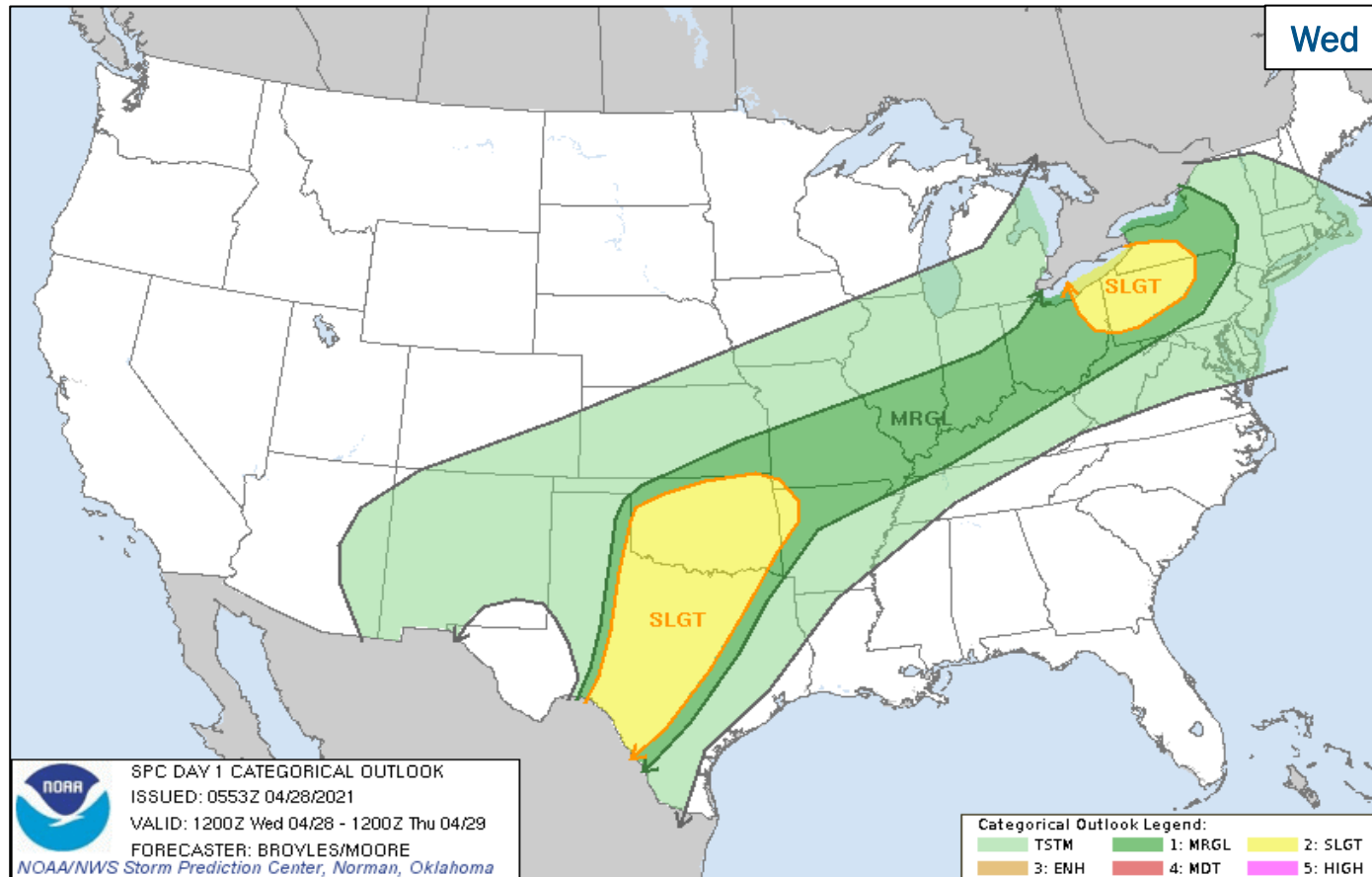


# National Weather Forecast

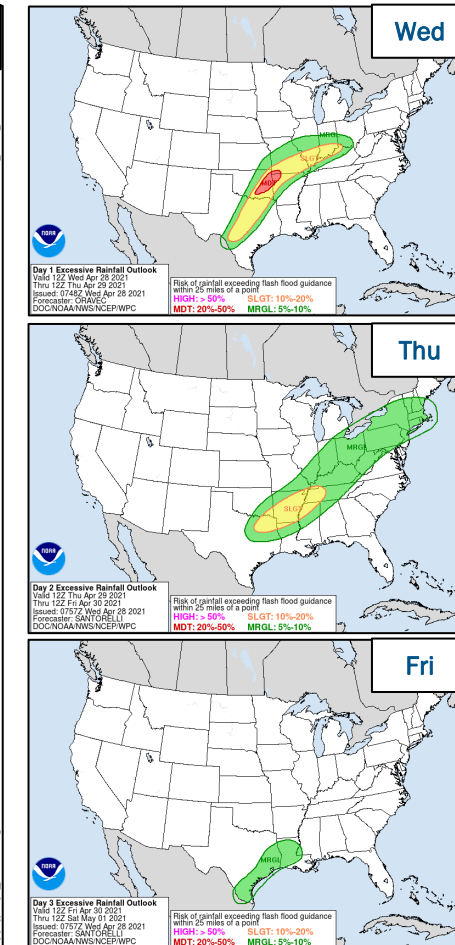
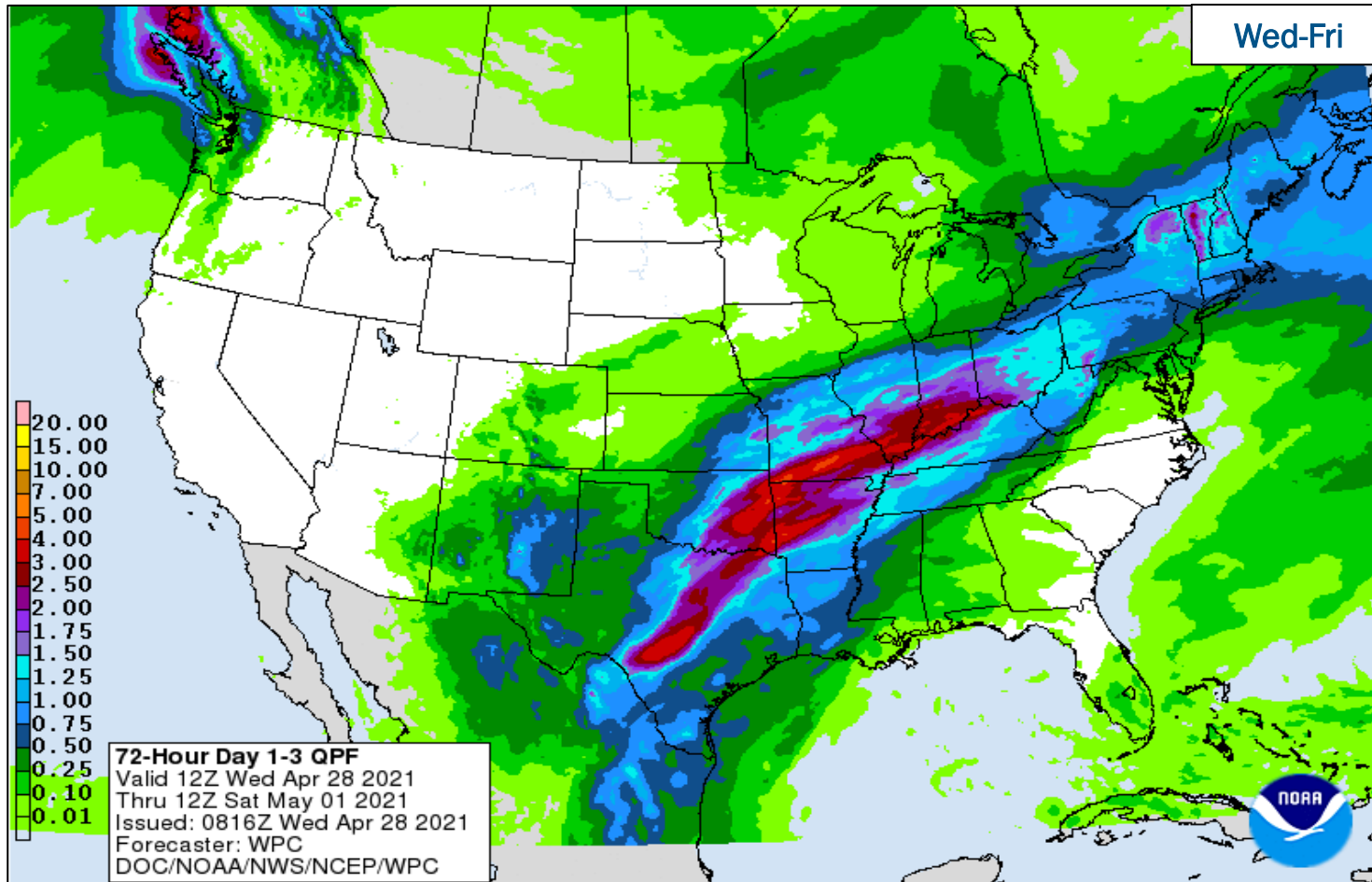
# Severe Weather Outlook

# Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

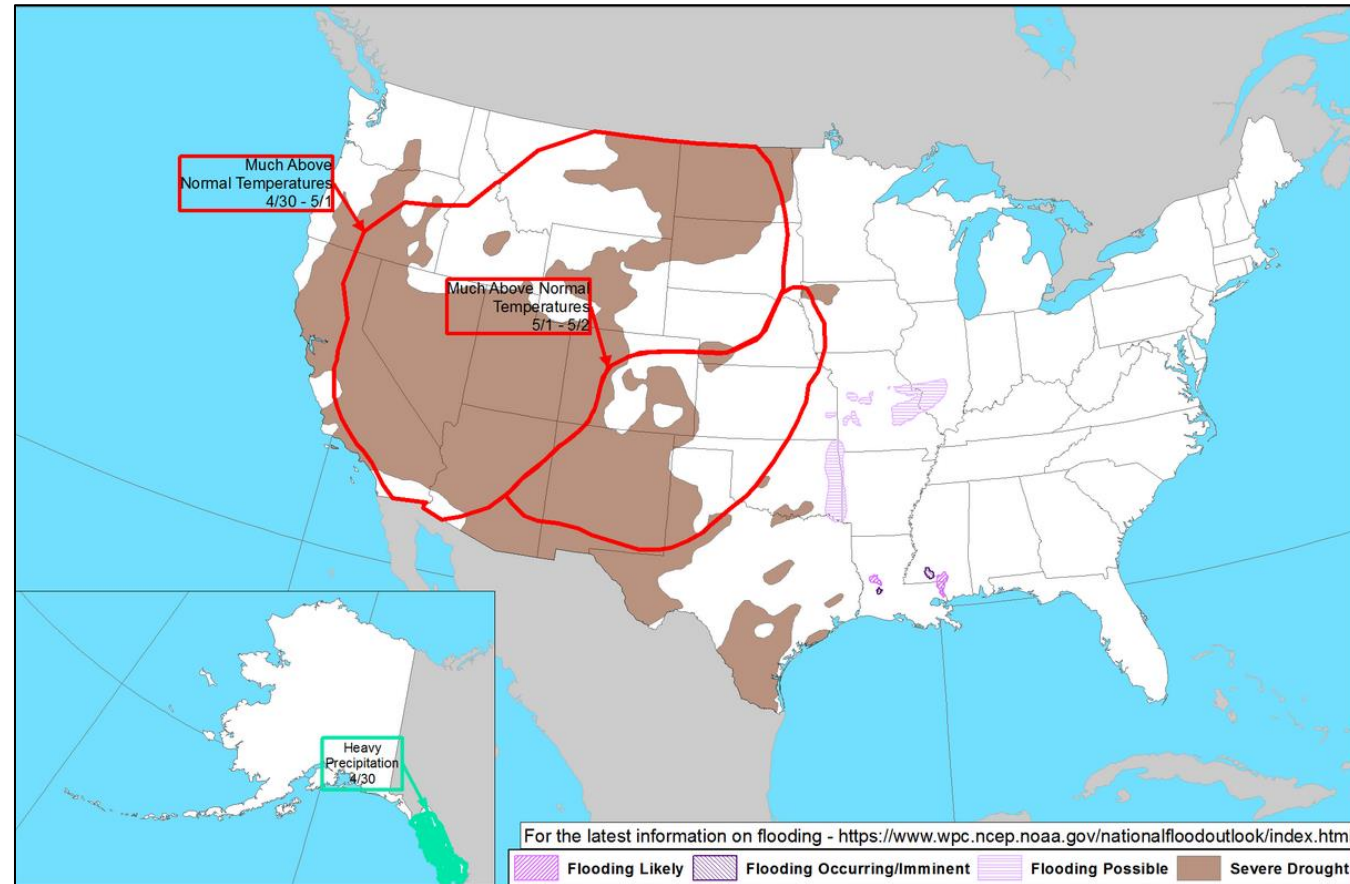

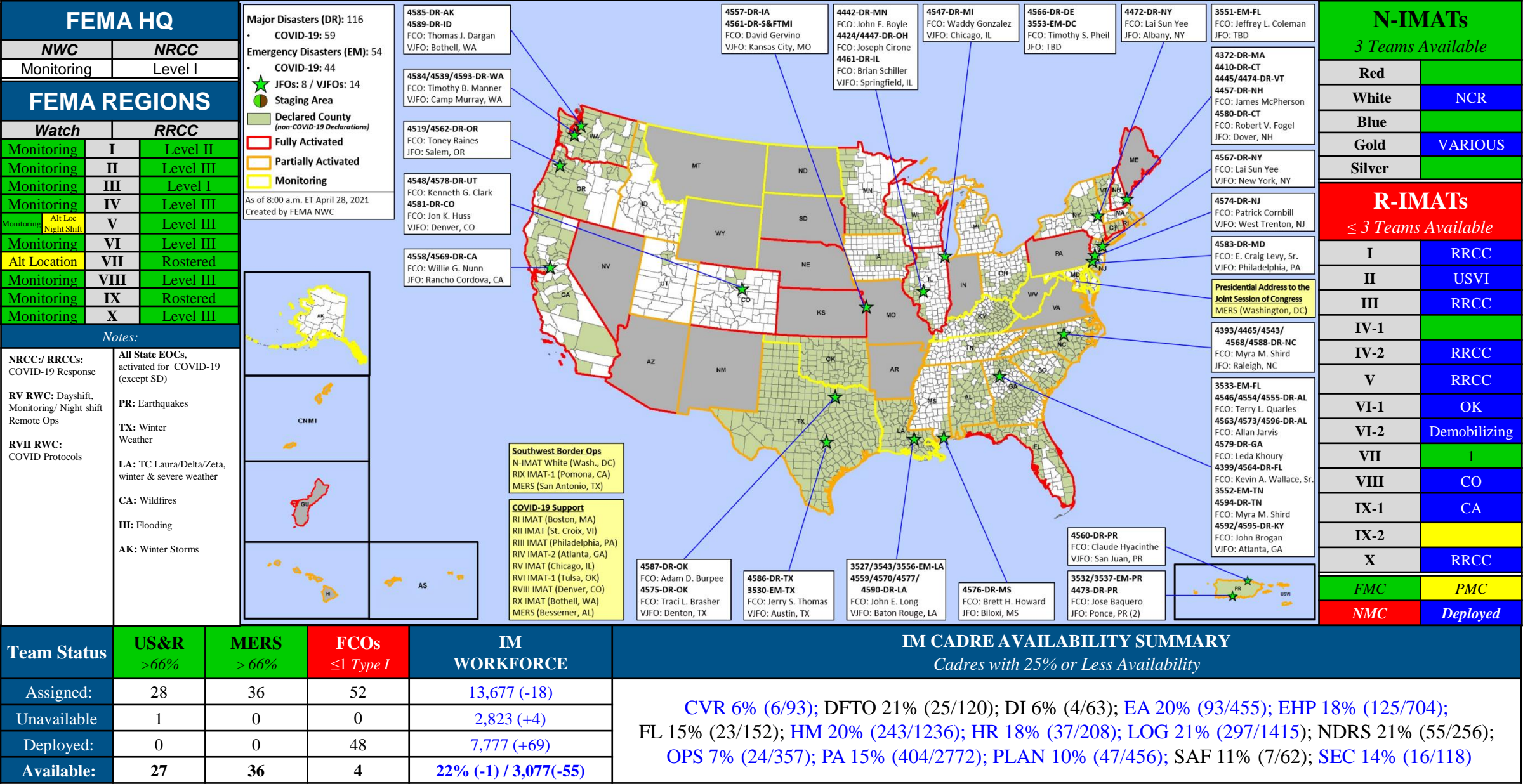
