


Presidential Address to Joint Session of Congress

<u>Situation</u>: The President will address a Joint Session of Congress this evening in Washington DC, FEMA has lead responsibility for consequence management for this event.










National Weather Forecast











Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall


