Severe Weather – Lower Mississippi Valley

Current Situation:

Severe weather moved through the Lower Mississippi overnight. There were preliminary reports of 21 tornadoes in Mississippi. The highest concentration was in Yazoo County near Yazoo City (4 tornado reports), in Hines County (3 tornado reports), and near Tupelo in Lee County (6 tornado reports).

Lifeline Impacts:

- Reports of uprooted trees, downed power lines, and some residential damage

- No injuries or fatalities

Energy: (DOE Eagle-I as of 7:30 a.m. ET)

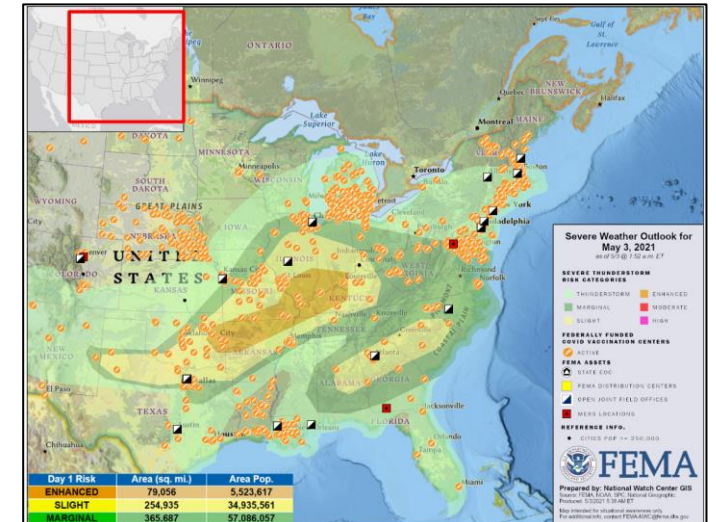
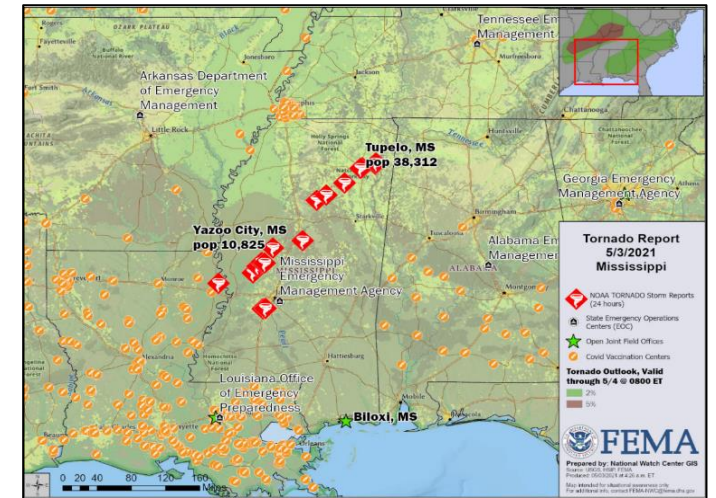

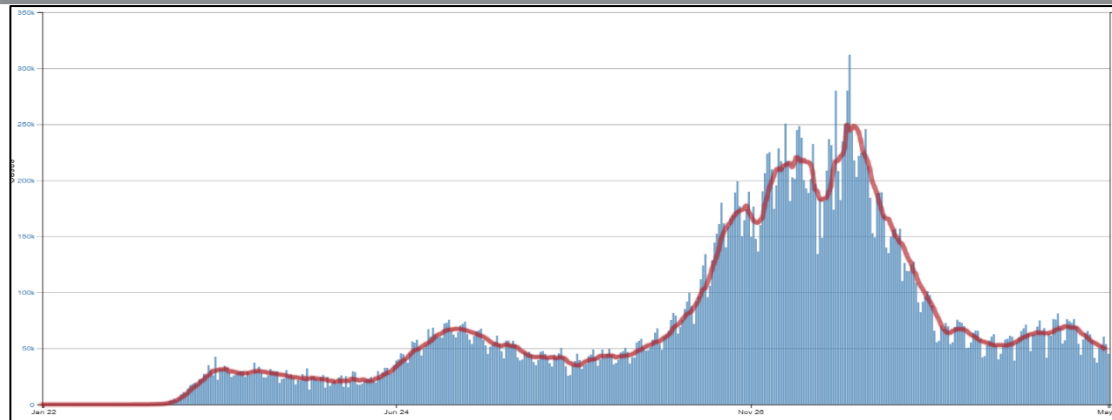

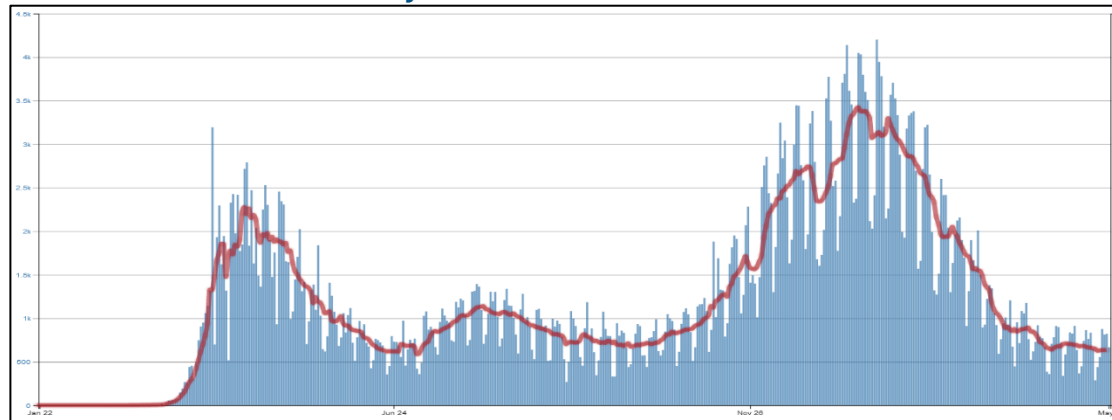

COVID-19 Weekly Update *(CDC data, as of May 2)*



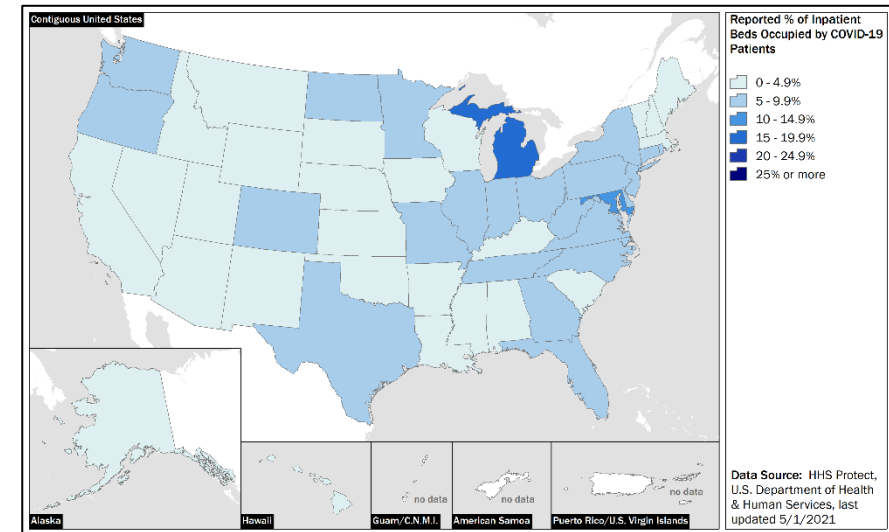
Daily Trends of COVID-19 Cases

- FEMA NRCC activated to Level I in support of COVID-19 operations



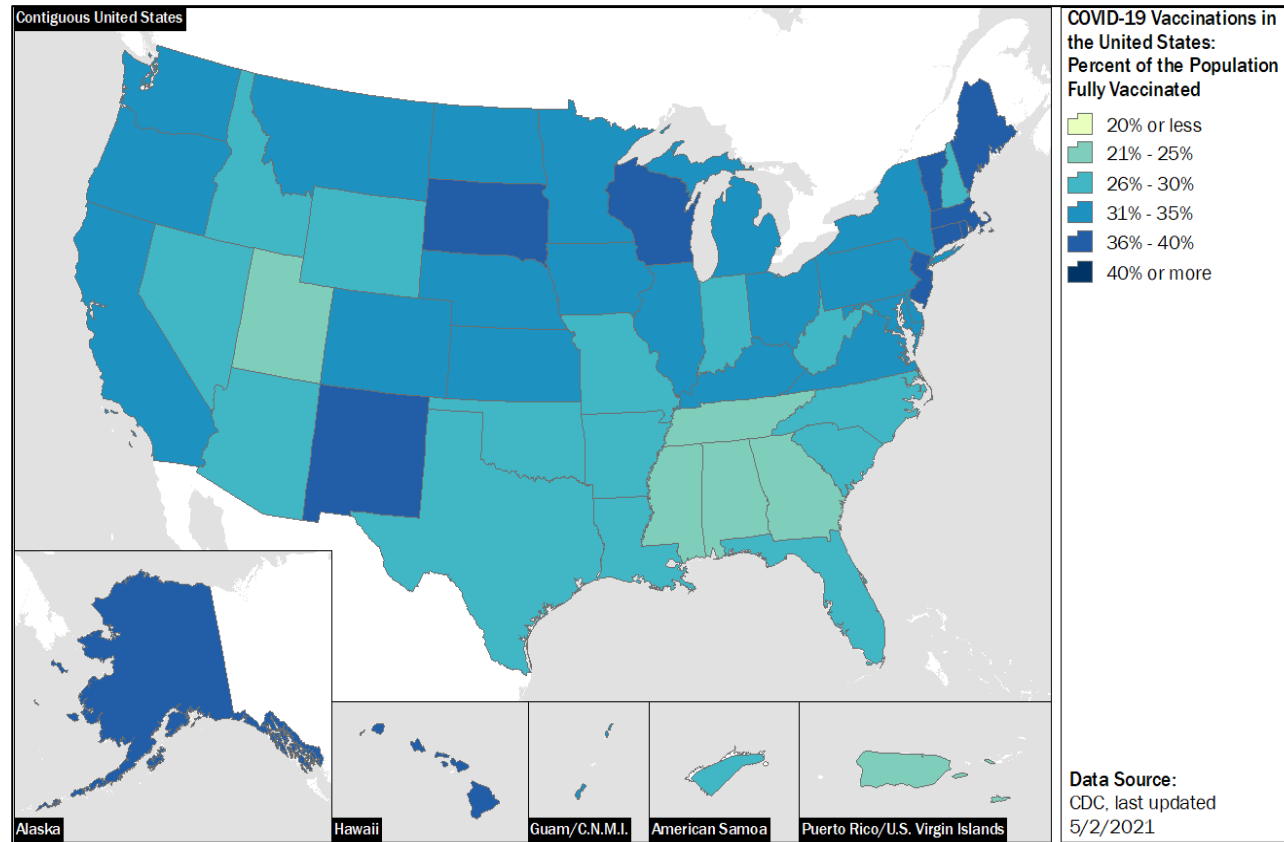

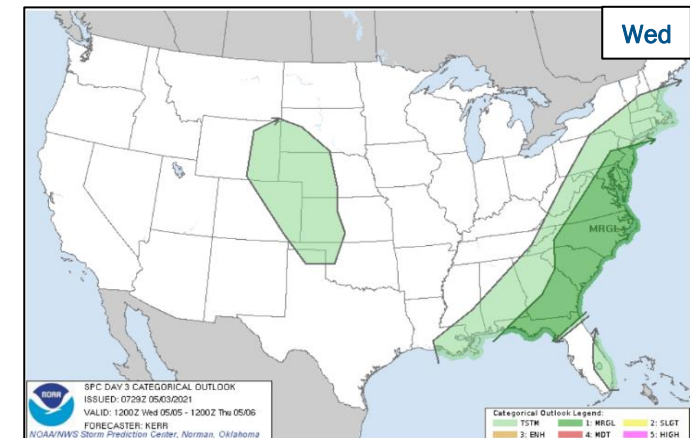

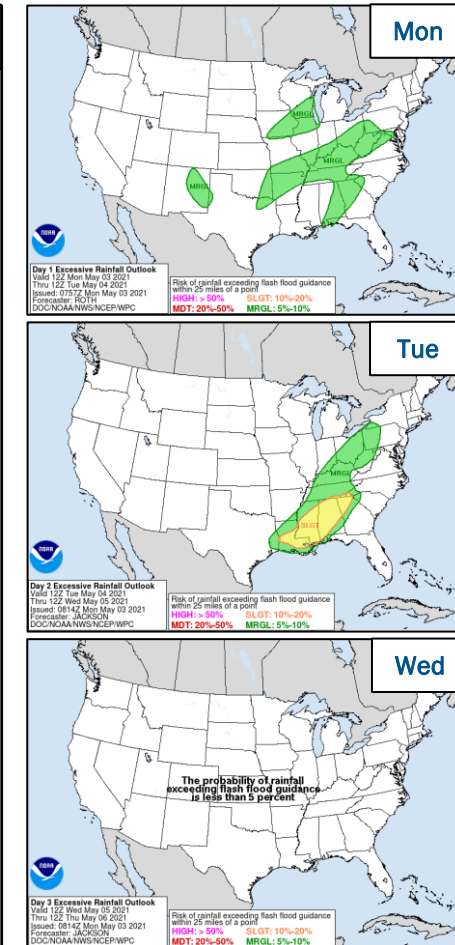
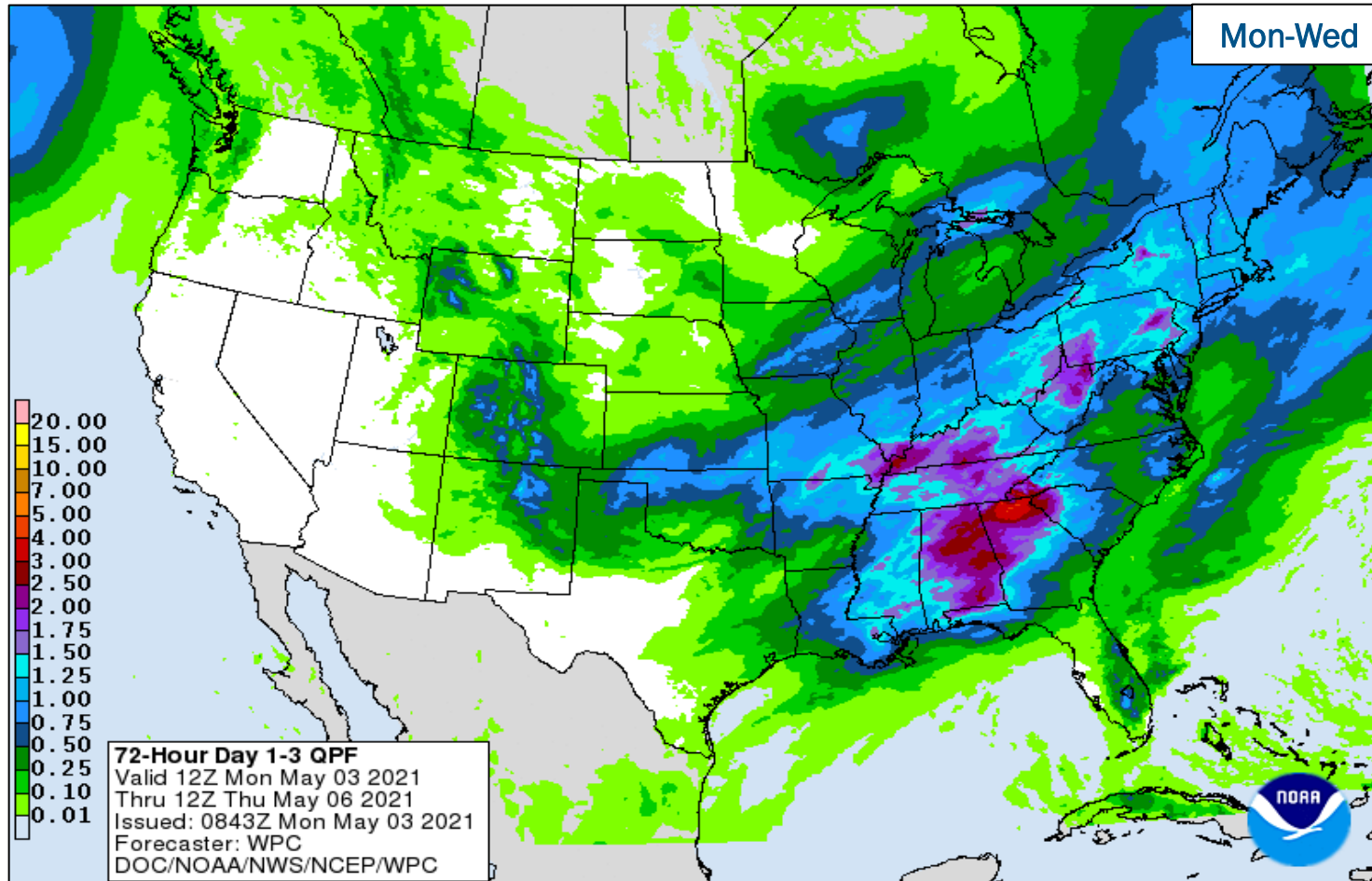
Severe Weather Outlook

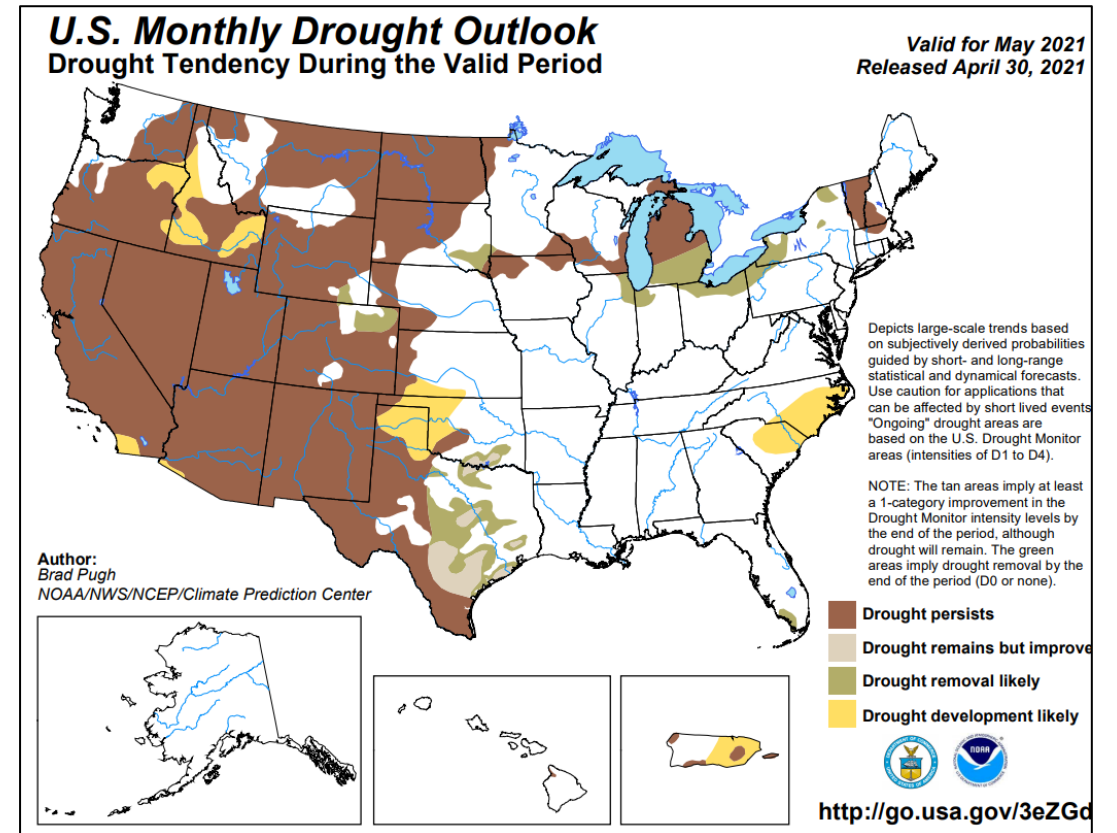
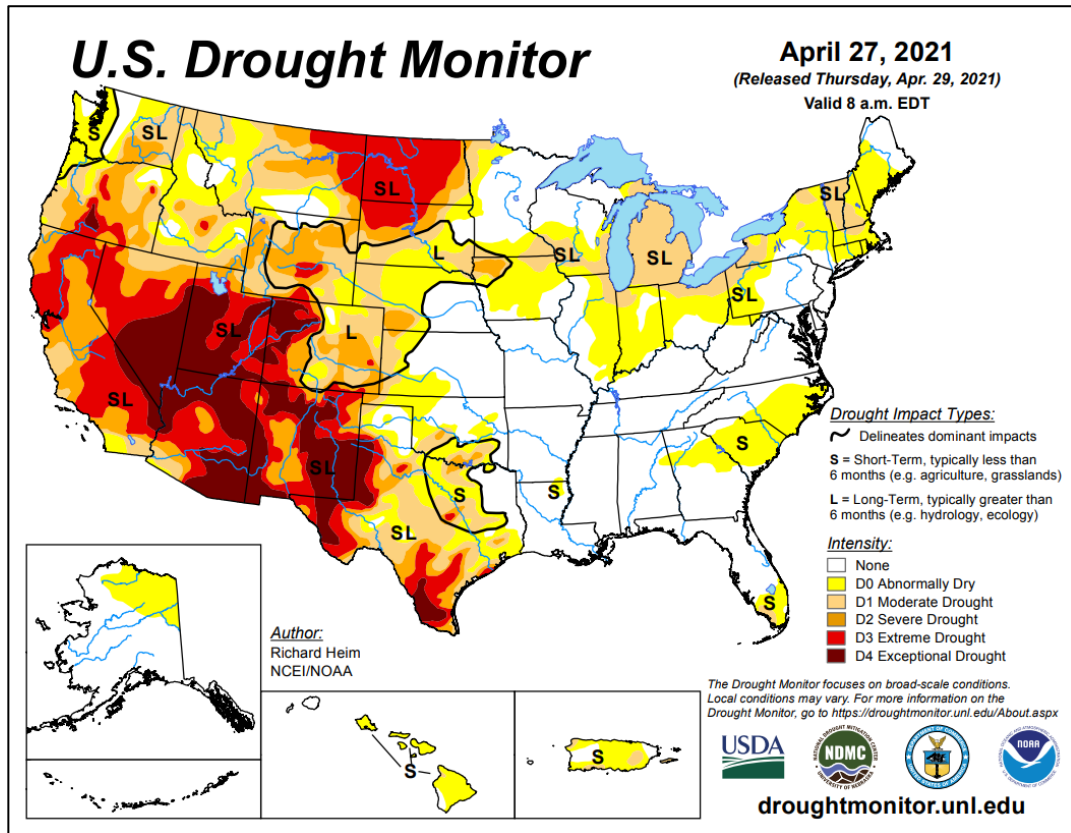
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

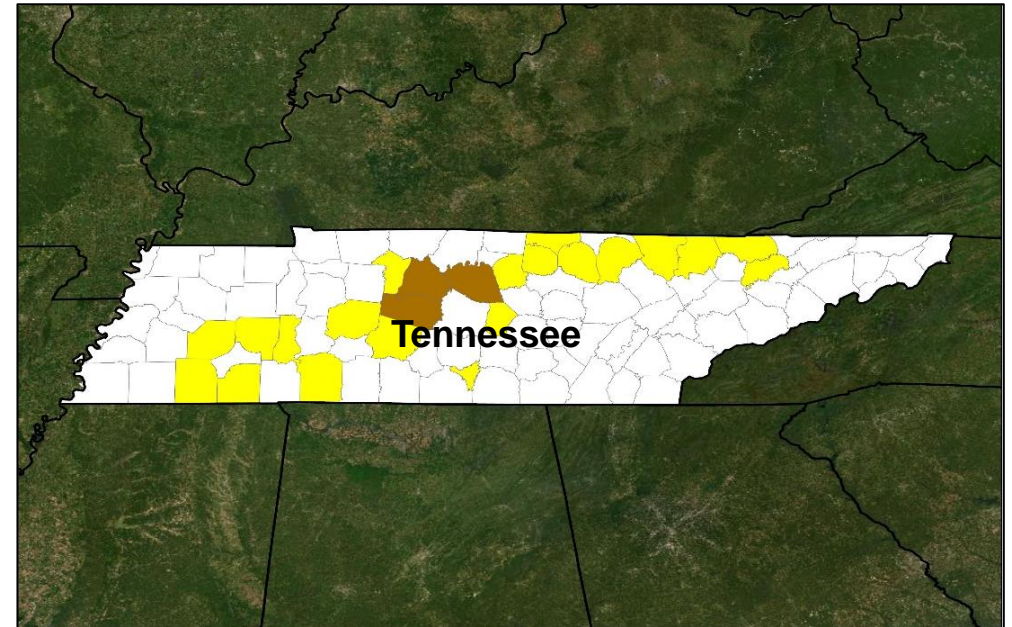
