

Central Pacific Tropical Cyclones and Disturbances Eastern Pacific



Remnants of Dolores (Advisory #9 as of 5:00 a.m. ET) - FINAL

- 170 miles E of Mazatlán, Mexico
- Moving N at 12 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 25 mph
- Dissipated over inland Mexico
- This is the last Public Advisory

Atlantic



<u>Tropical Depression Claudette</u> (Advisory #11a as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 25 miles W of Atlanta, GA
- Moving ENE at 13 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 30 mph
- Some re-strengthening tonight and forecast to become a tropical storm again on Monday



Tropical Depression Claudette - Response

<u>Situation:</u> Tropical Depression Claudette brought heavy rainfall to the Southeast causing flash/urban/and small stream flooding. Claudette is forecast to strengthen to a Tropical Storm again over the Carolinas this evening. The Storm Prediction Center preliminary tornado reports indicate 13 total tornado touchdowns. Response efforts expected to remain within State / Local capabilities; Community Lifelines are stable with no anticipated requests for FEMA assistance.


Food, Water & Sheltering:

- AL: Media reports significant tornado damage to a mobile home park in Brewton; local damage assessments to begin during day hours
- MS: Roof damage reported to one home and flooding in an apartment complex
- AL: One Shelter / unknown occupants; MS: One Shelter / 13 occupants Health and Medical:
- AL: 2 confirmed storm related fatalities *Transportation:*
- MS & AL: Several roadways closed due to localized flooding; alternate routes available

State / Local Response:

- MS EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
- AL EOC at Normal Operations






FEMA Response:

- FEMA Region IV RRCC rostered; RWC is Monitoring
 - IMAT-'s 1 & 2 available; FIT members in contact with state counterparts
- FEMA HQ: NRCC at Level III (COVID); rostered for full activation
 - NWC monitoring; Enhanced Watch rostered
 - Coordinating with CISA on infrastructure in the impacted areas
 - National IMAT and US&R teams identified for immediate deployment
 - MERS: Communications resources available from Denton and Thomasville
 - Logistics: 4 ISB teams on alert; distribution centers stocked/on-call





Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Long Range Outlooks – Jun 25 - 29



6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




