Partial Building Collapse - Surfside, FL

<u>Current Situation</u>: Search and Rescue efforts continue following a partial building collapse of a 13-story apartment/condo in Surfside, FL. Extent of damage and cause of the collapse remains unknown. It is believed that the property was primarily vacation rentals and approximately 80% occupied at the time of incident. Multiple jurisdictions are on scene to assist Miami Beach Fire Department.

Impacts: (source: FEMA Region IV)

Safety & Security:

- 72 of the 136 units involved in the collapse; remaining structure compromised
- Over 100 individuals reported unaccounted for

Food, Water, & Sheltering

- Residents in unaffected portions of the structure have been evacuated
- Reunification Center and Call-Line established

Health & Medical

12 injuries / 1 unconfirmed fatality reported at this time

Transportation

Several local road closures in the immediate area

State / Local Response:

- Miami-Dade County EOC at Partial Activation (Partial Building Collapse)
- Unified Command established
- Miami-Dade and Broward County supporting through Mutual Aid
- Elements of FL-TF1 (local resource) and FL-TF2 (State resource) are conducting operations
- FL EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19);





FEMA / Federal Response

- Region IV RWC is monitoring; IMAT-1deployed to Surfside, FI and IMAT-2 available
- NWC is monitoring
- US&F
 - VA-TF2, VA-TF1, & OH-TF1 assets on alert for national-level response
- Florida Task Force 4 and 6 will be deployed later today
- 3 FEMA LNO's deploying to FL; 1 from US&R, FIMA, and Region IV
- Emergency Declaration Approved on June 25th



No Disturbances Eastern Pacific 15N No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next five days. 5N 8:00 pm HST Thu Jun 24 2021



Atlantic




Disturbance 1 (As of 8:00 a.m. ET)





Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Severe Weather Outlook


