Situation:

The Bootleg Fire began on July 6 in Klamath County, OR (pop. 64k). The fire has burned in excess of 90k acres of federal and private land with zero percent containment. At the time of the request, the fire was threatening 1,197 homes in and around the communities of Sprague River, Sycan Estates subdivision, Bly, and Beatty.

- The fire is also threating roads, bridges, utilities, infrastructure, recreation, and businesses areas
- Mandatory evacuations issued for 147 households
- Preparation for evacuation advisories issued for 1,050 households

Response:

- OR EOC is monitoring
- FMAG approved on July 10, 2021
- FEMA Region X / Bothell MOC and the NWC continue to monitor

<u>Current Situation</u>: Drier conditions next week will allow the moderate to major flooding to crest and recede, with most crests occurring this weekend. 10 (-1) flood gauges remain at major 2 (+1) to moderate 8 (-3) throughout coastal southeast Texas.

<u>Lifeline Impacts</u>: (Denton MOC Spot Report as of 9:54 p.m. ET, July 10) **Safety & Security:**


- High Water rescue continues; TX-TF1: 53 deployed to impacted areas

- NWC continues to monitor







Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Expected to form several hundred miles SW of the southern coast of Mexico within the next few days

- 5-day Formation chance: Medium (40%)
















Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall







Severe Weather Outlook





Fire Weather Outlook









