





Eastern Pacific – Tropical Depression Six-E


Tropical Depression Six-E (Advisory #1 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 1,015 miles SSW of the southern tip of Baja California

- Forecast to become a tropical storm later today and be near hurricane strength by Friday













Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Severe Weather Outlook


Situation:

- The fire began on July 12 and is threatening 100 homes (all primary residences) in and around the community of Nespelem (population 700)
- Also threatening local tribal prison, tribal, county and state roads, tribal center government buildings, Nespelem Valley Electric Cooperative Public Electricity utility, parks and recreation facilities, farms, ranches, farming equipment, local watershed, streams and spawning sites, and culturally sensitive sites
- FMAG was requested by the State of Washington in coordination with the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation
- FMAG approved on July 13, 2021

Response:

- WA EOC at Partial Activation (Wildfires and COVID-19)
- Region X / Bothell MOC are monitoring


