- Wildfires – Western U.S.

Hazard Monitoring

- Severe thunderstorms possible – Northern Plains to Upper Mississippi Valley
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible – Southwest to Central/Southern Rockies
- Tropical Activity:
 - Atlantic: Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
 - Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1: Medium (40%)

Situation:

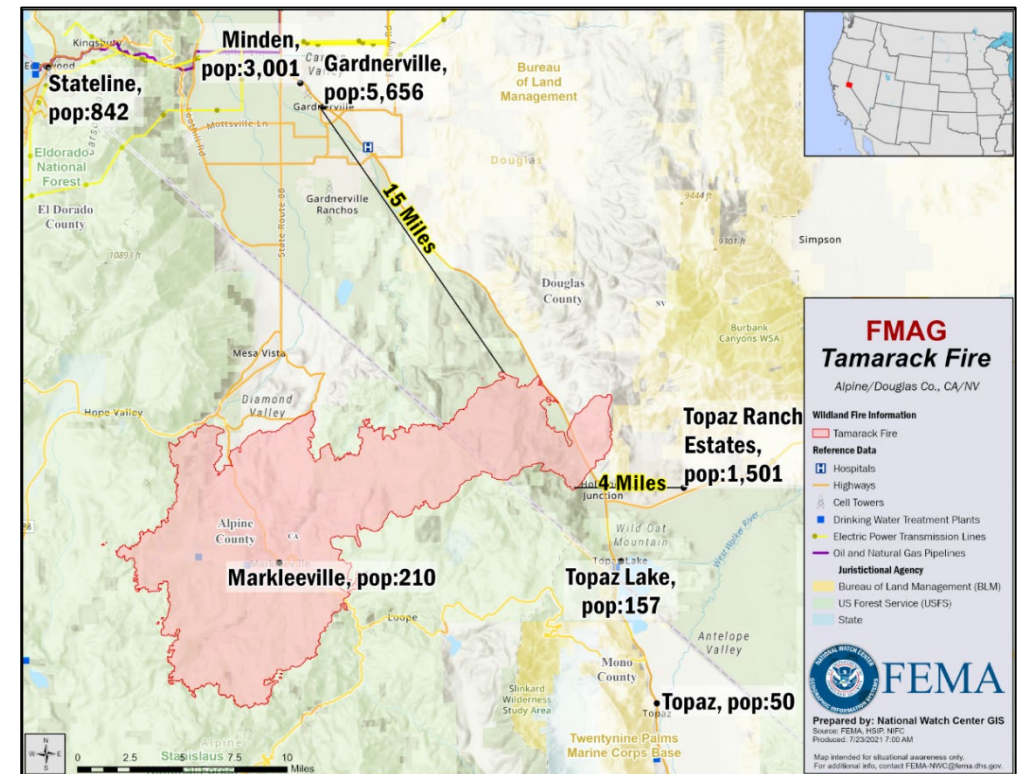
- The fire began on July 4 and is burning on federal, state, and private land in Douglas County (pop. 48,000)

Impacts:

- Threatening 800 homes (all primary), 5 mixed commercial/residential properties, 325 commercial properties and minor structures, a water treatment plant, power distribution lines and substations, cellular communication towers, and Highway 395
- 1 shelter open with 13 occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 7:00 a.m. ET)

State and Federal Response:

- NV EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- Region IX RWC is monitoring
- FMAG approved July 22

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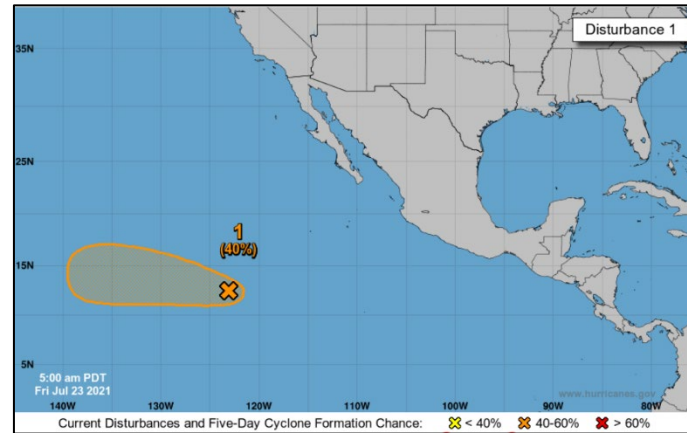
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Tropical Outlook – Five Day

Central Pacific



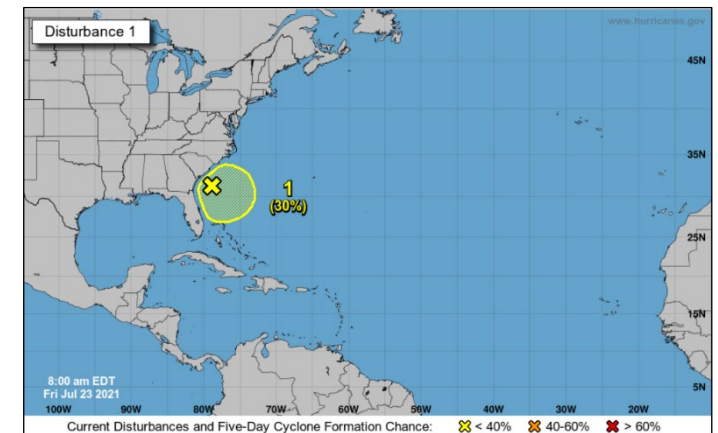
Eastern Pacific

- 1,200 miles SW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Moving W to WNW at 10-15 mph
- Could become a tropical depression this weekend or early next week
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (30%)
- 5-day formation chance: Medium (40%)

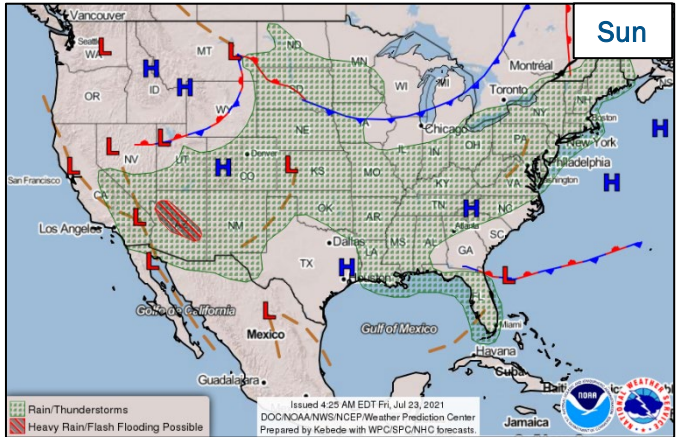
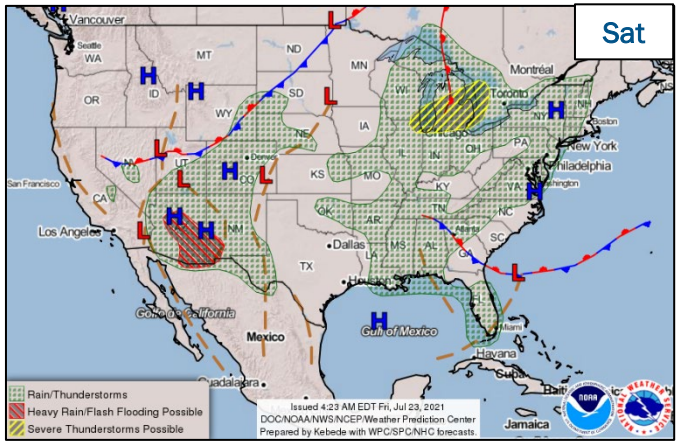
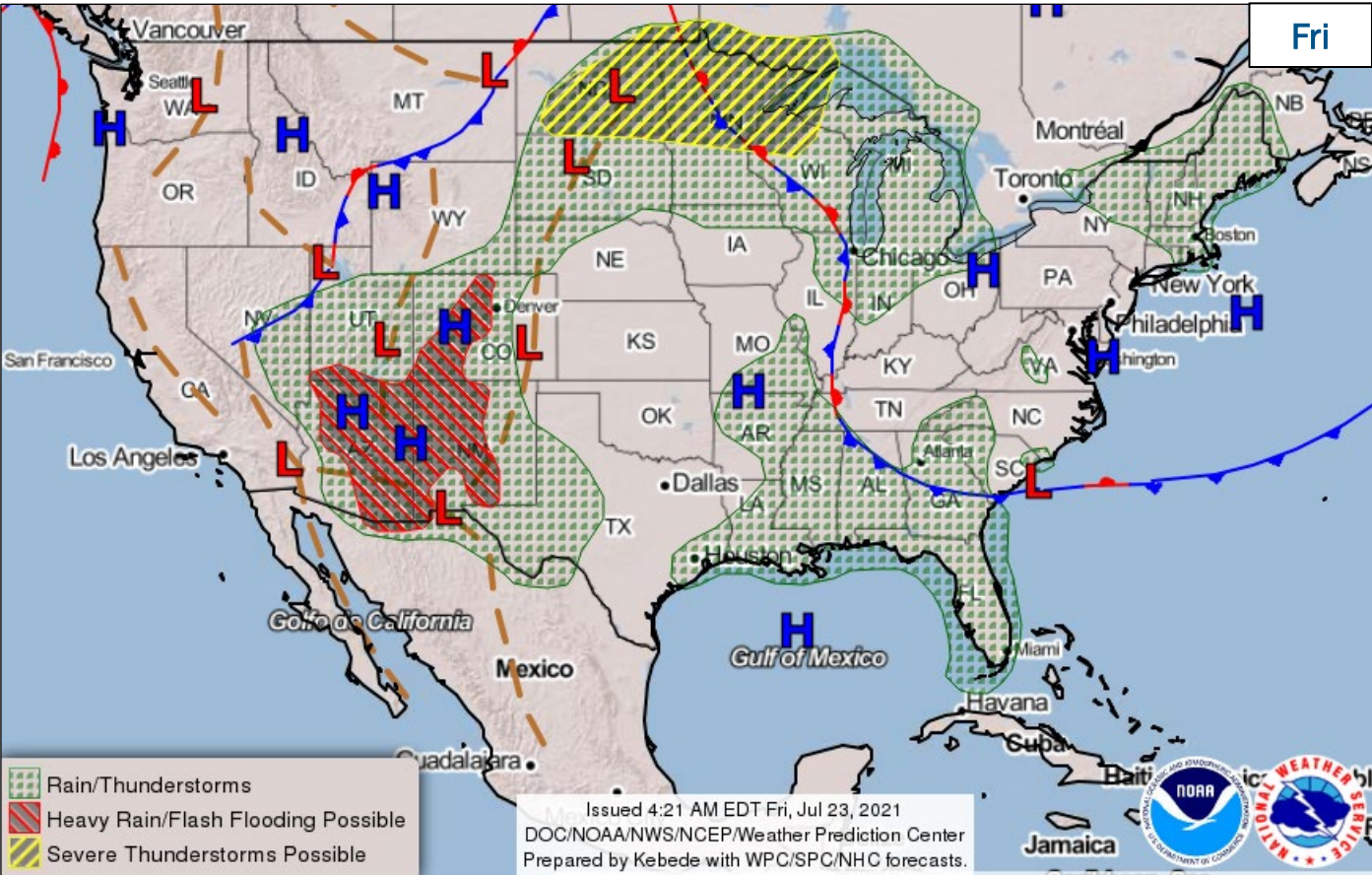
Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Marginally conducive for some additional development during the next couple of days

- 5-day formation chance: Low (30%)



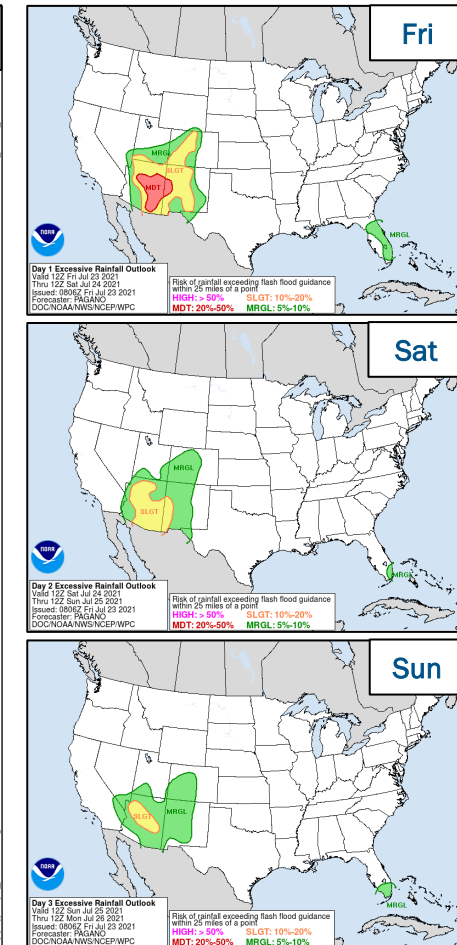
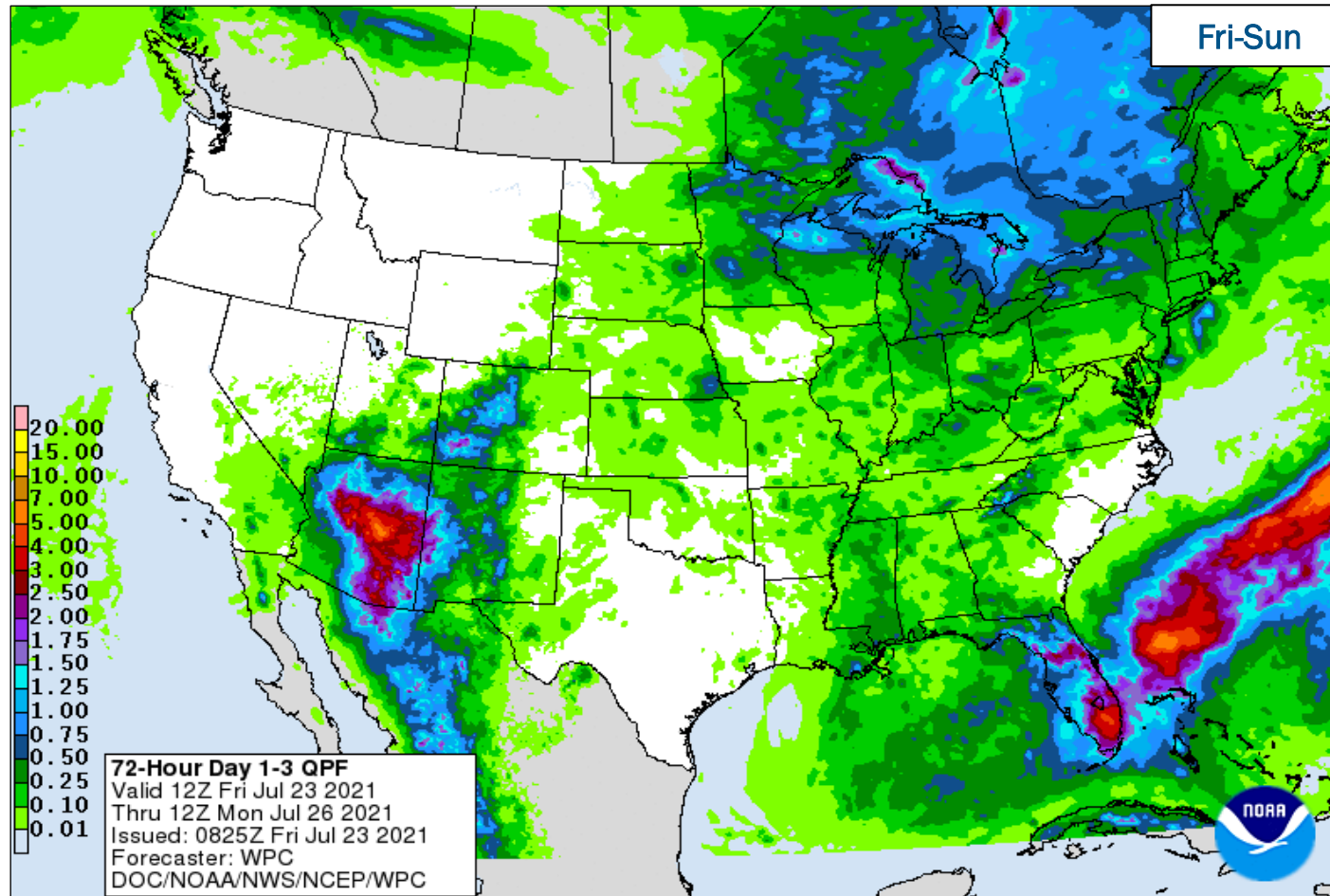
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National Weather Forecast



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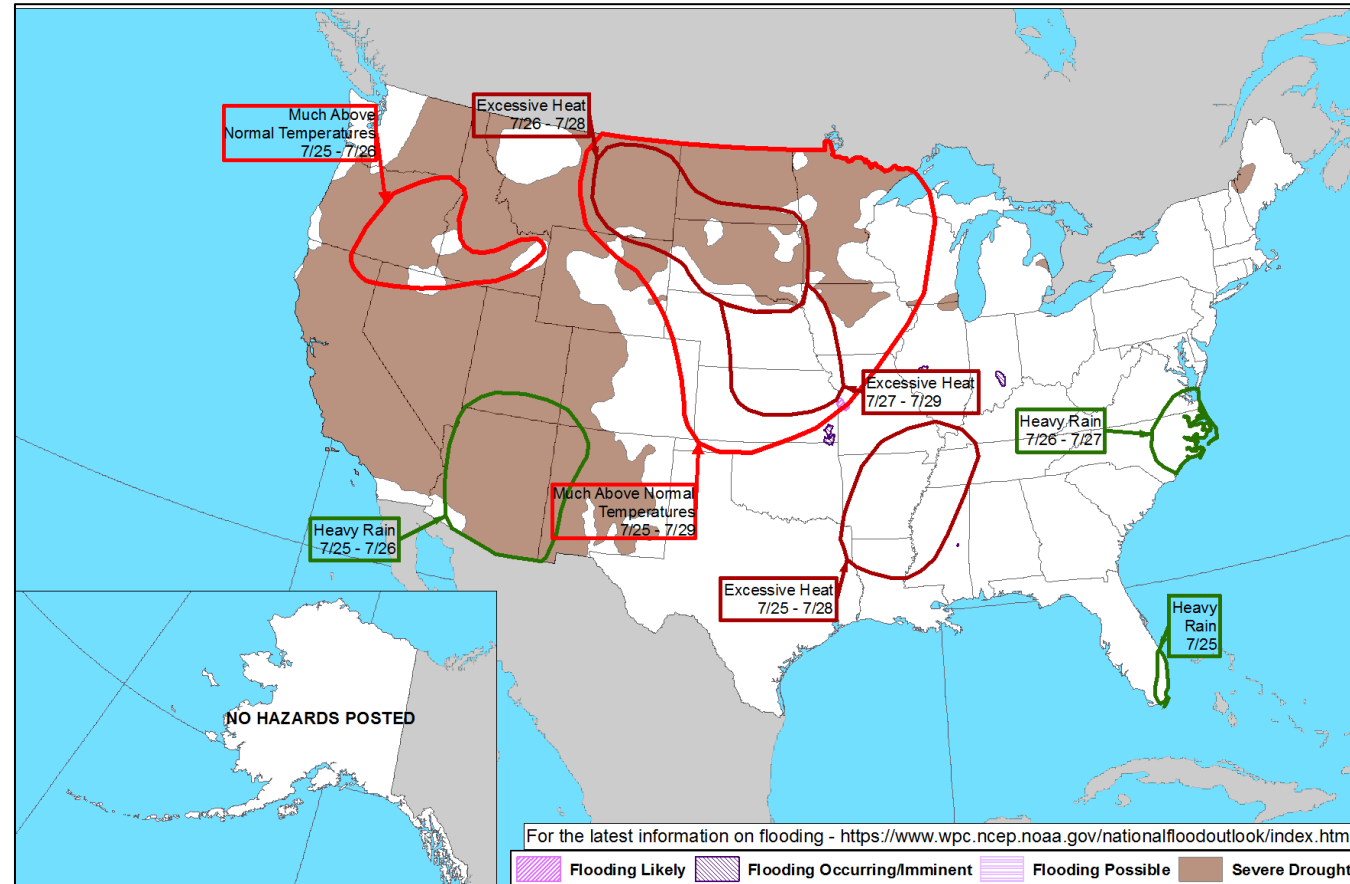
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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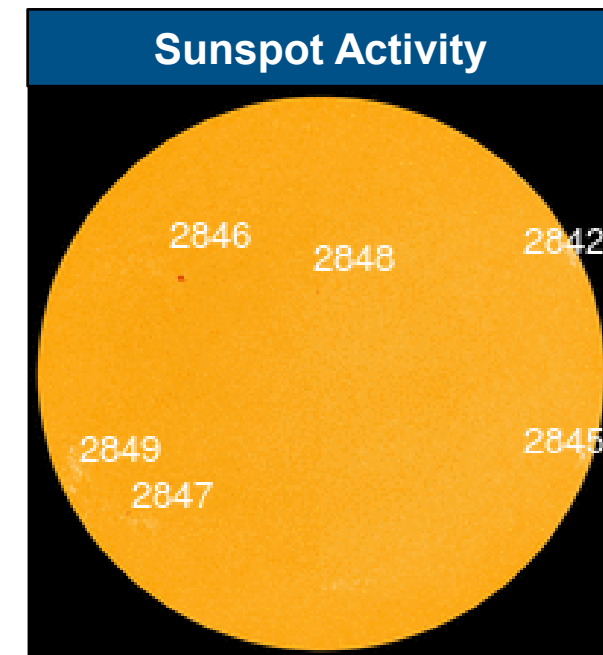
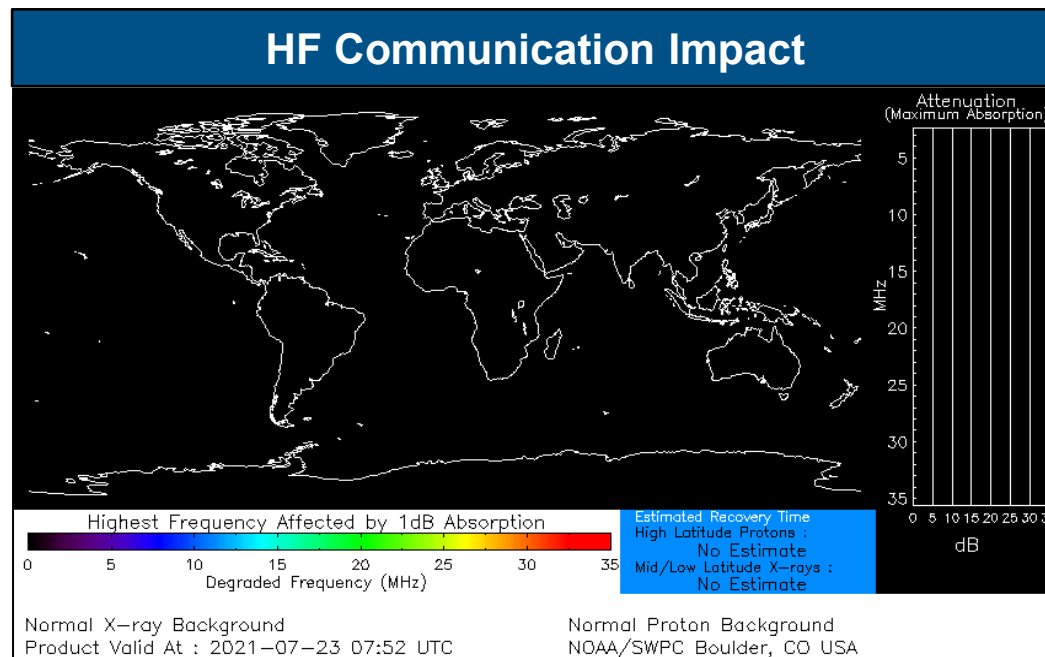

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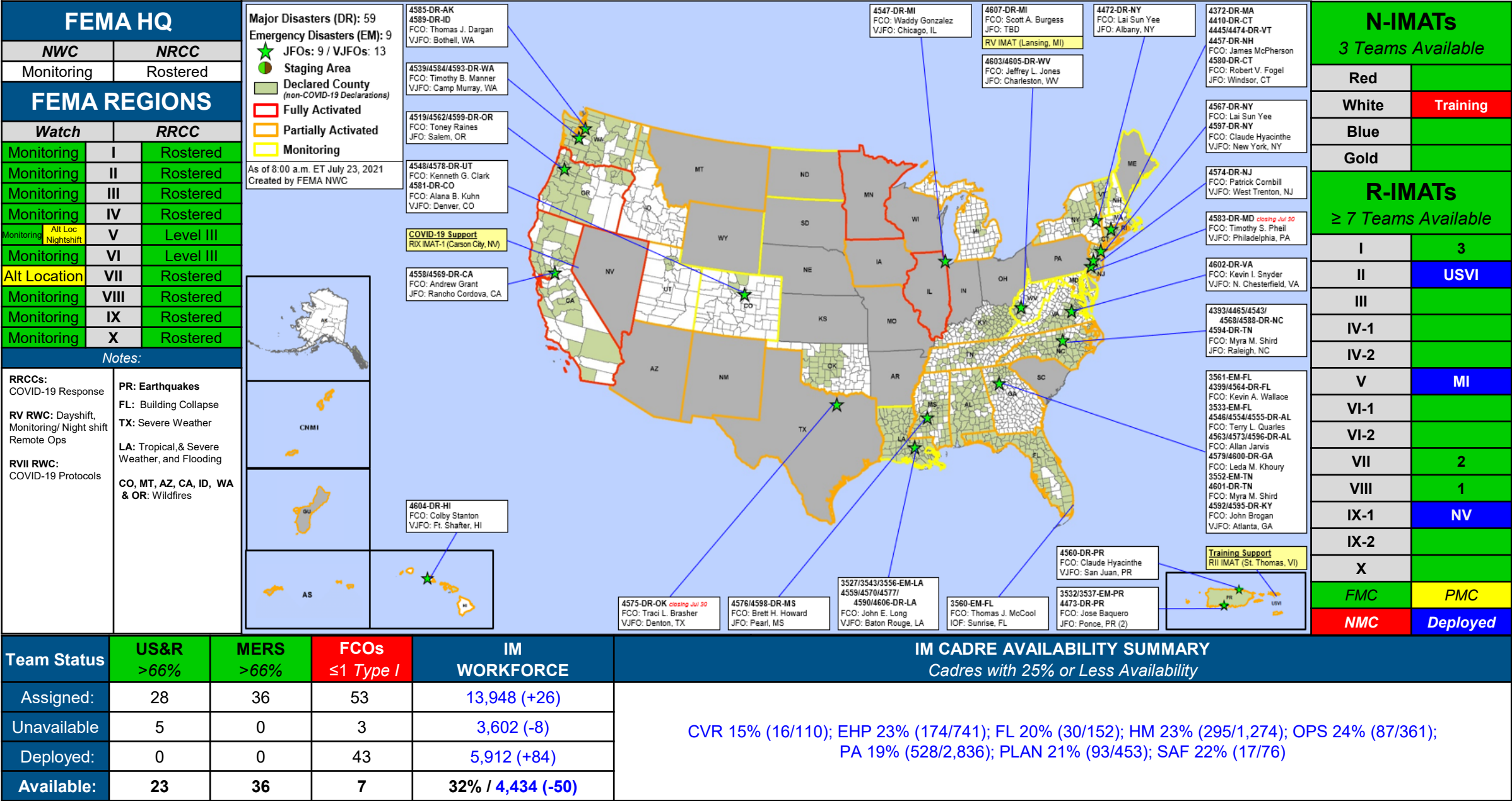
