
## **Tropical Outlook - Five Day**

#### **Central Pacific**

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
- Disturbance 1 (Invest 98E) (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)
- 1,400 miles ESE of Hilo, HI
- Moving W at 10-15 mph
- Tropical depression is likely to form within the next day or so
- 48-hour formation chance: High (70%)
- 5-day formation chance: High (70%)

#### **Eastern Pacific**



- Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)
- Could form a few hundred miles S or SE of the Gulf of Tehuantepec in a few days
- Moving WNW at 10-15 mph
- Some gradual development is possible through late this week
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (near 0%)
- 5-day formation chance: Low (20%)





#### Disturbance 1 (Invest 90L) (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- 160 miles E of Daytona Beach, FL











## **Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall**






## Long Range Outlooks - Jul 30 - Aug 3



6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




