- Wildfires – Western U.S.

Hazard Monitoring

- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible – Southwest and Central Great Basin
- Tropical Activity:
 - Atlantic: Disturbance 1 (Invest 90L): Medium (50%)
 - Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1: Low (20%)
 - Central Pacific: Disturbance 1 (Invest 98E): High (70%)

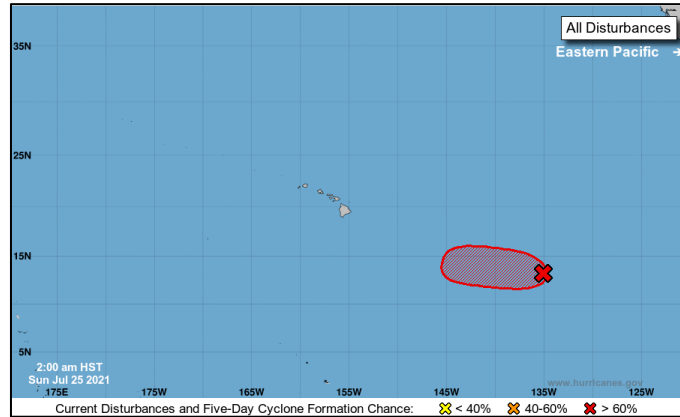

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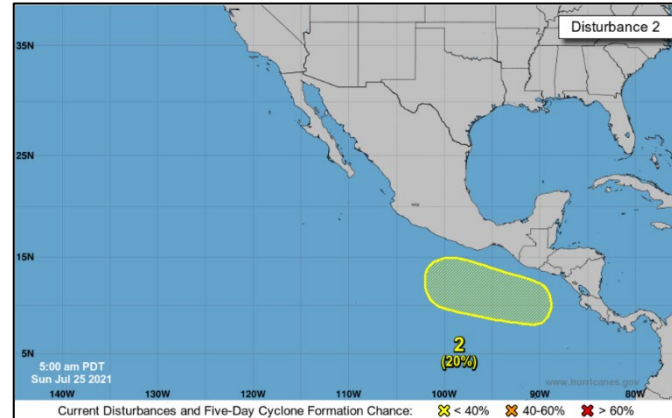
Tropical Outlook – Five Day

Central Pacific



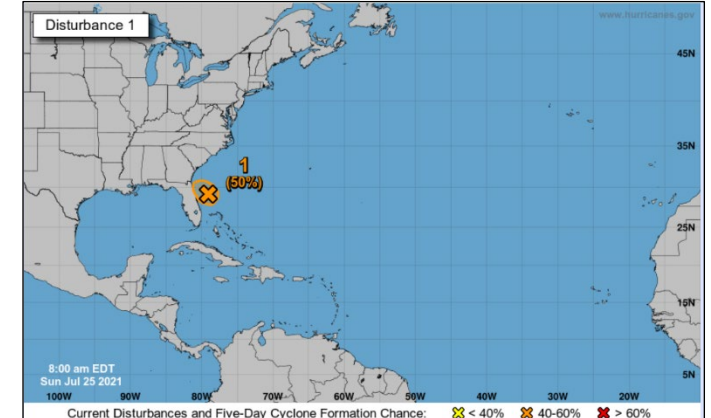
- **Disturbance 1 (Invest 98E)** (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)
- 1,400 miles ESE of Hilo, HI
- Moving W at 10-15 mph
- Tropical depression is likely to form within the next day or so
- 48-hour formation chance: High (70%)
- 5-day formation chance: High (70%)

Eastern Pacific



- **Disturbance 1** (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)
- Could form a few hundred miles S or SE of the Gulf of Tehuantepec in a few days
- Moving WNW at 10-15 mph
- Some gradual development is possible through late this week
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (near 0%)
- 5-day formation chance: Low (20%)

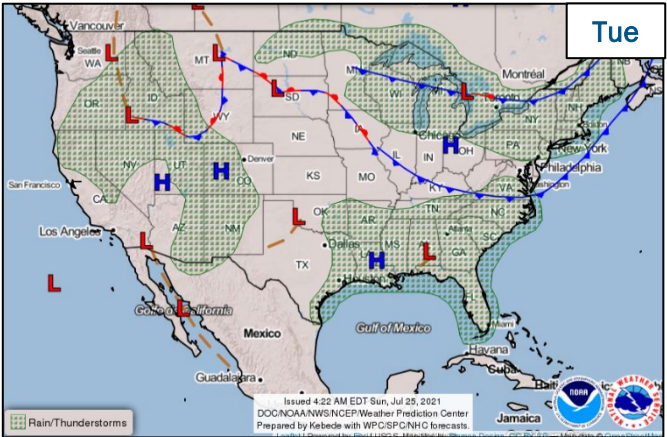
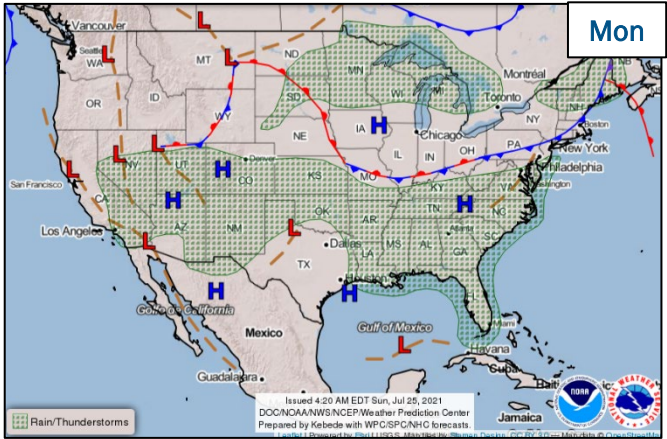
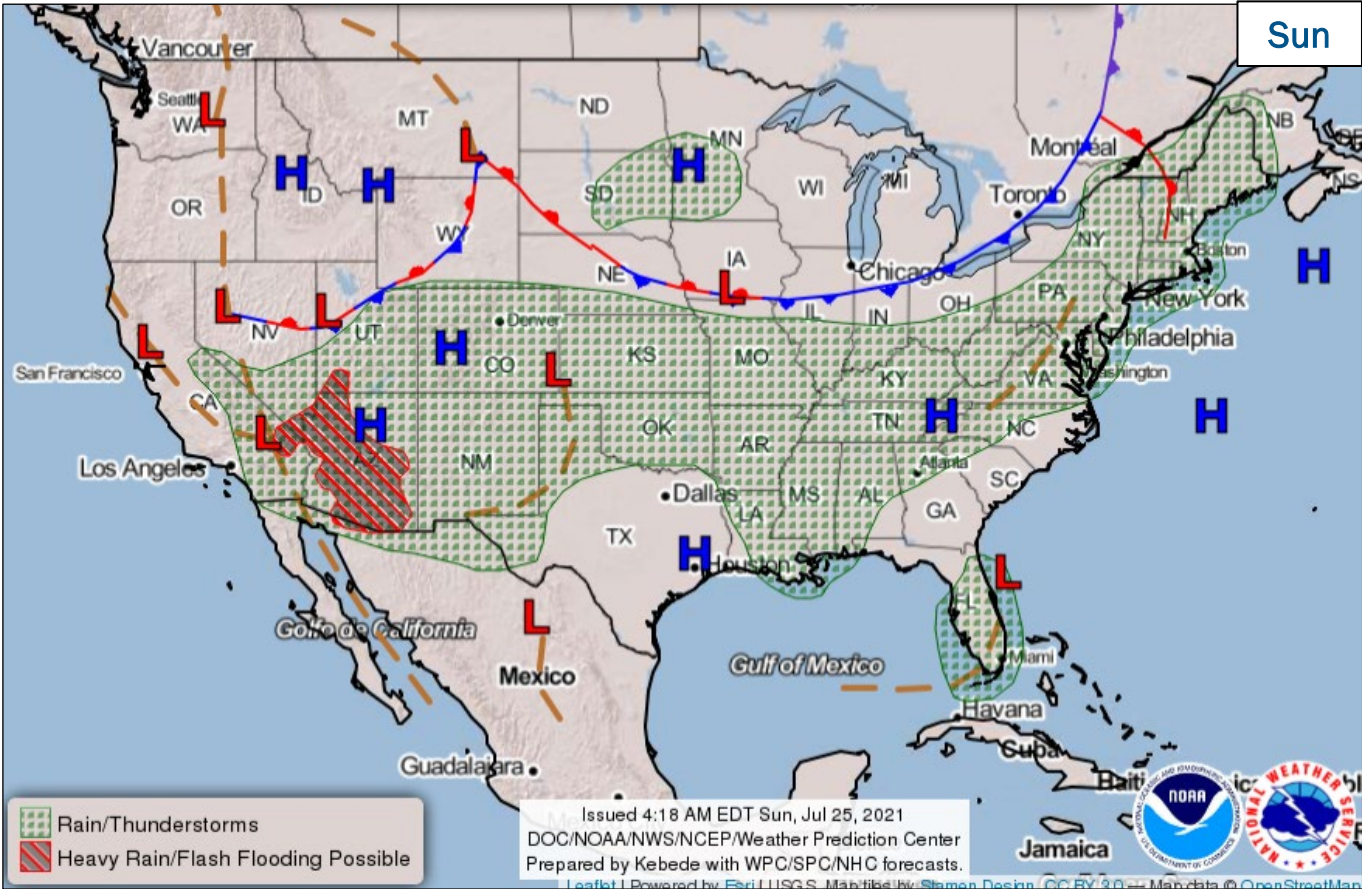


- **Disturbance 1 (Invest 90L)** (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)
- 160 miles E of Daytona Beach, FL
- Drifting W toward the east coast of FL
- Tropical depression could form later today or early Monday
- 48-hour formation chance: Medium (50%)
- 5-day formation chance: Medium (50%)



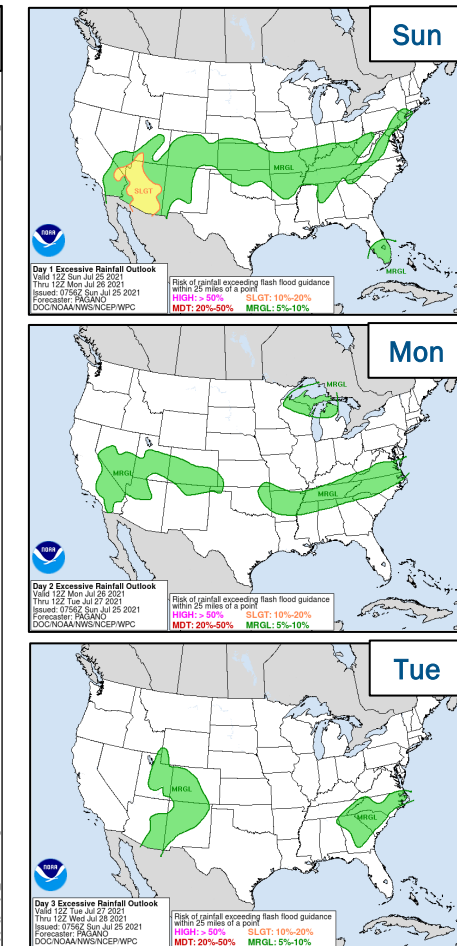
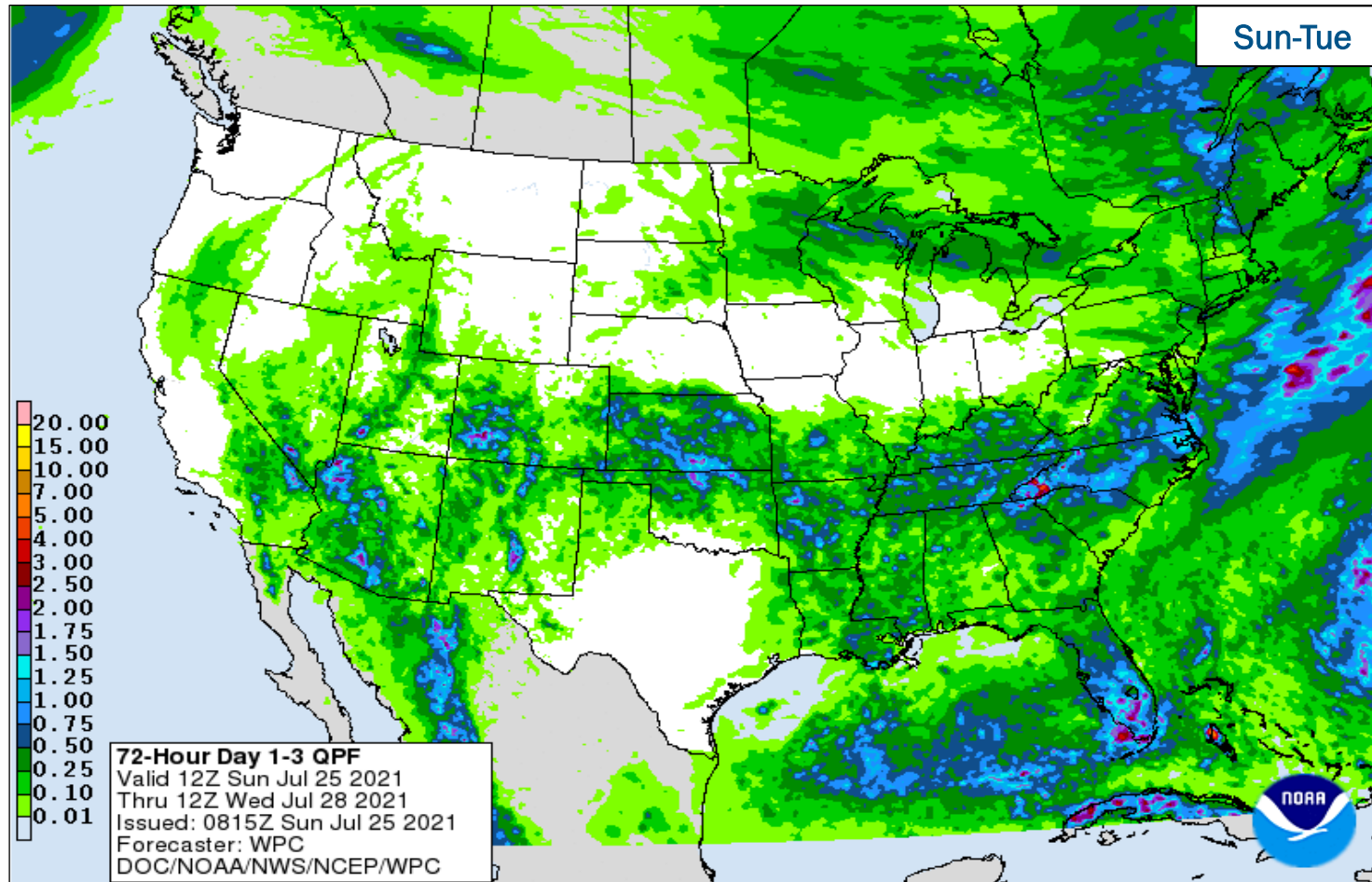
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National Weather Forecast



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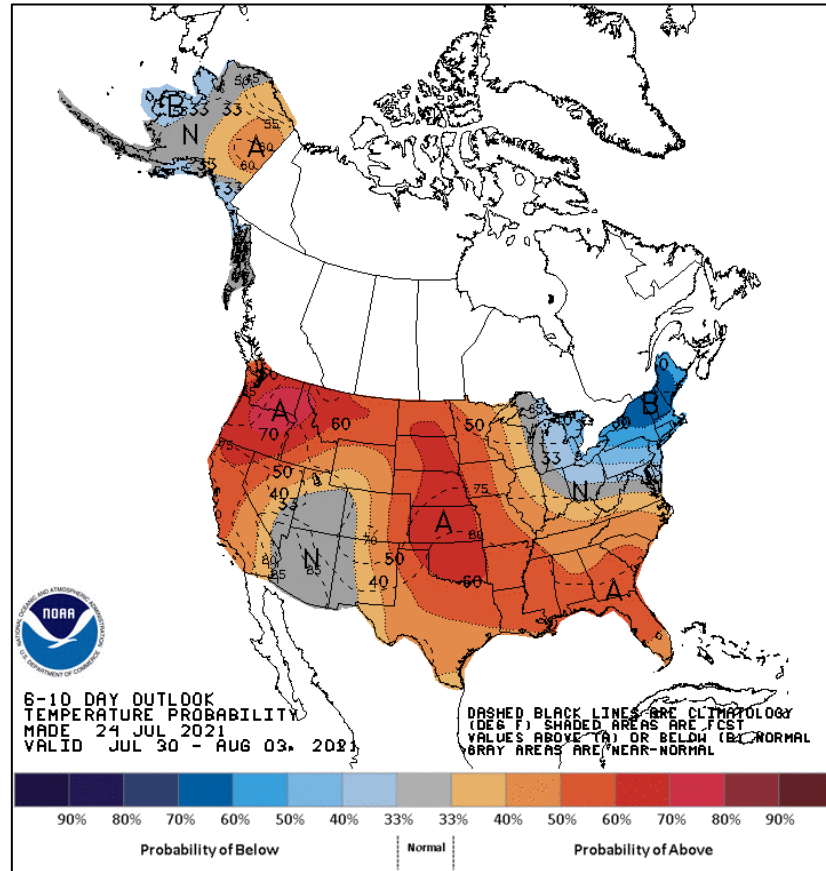
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



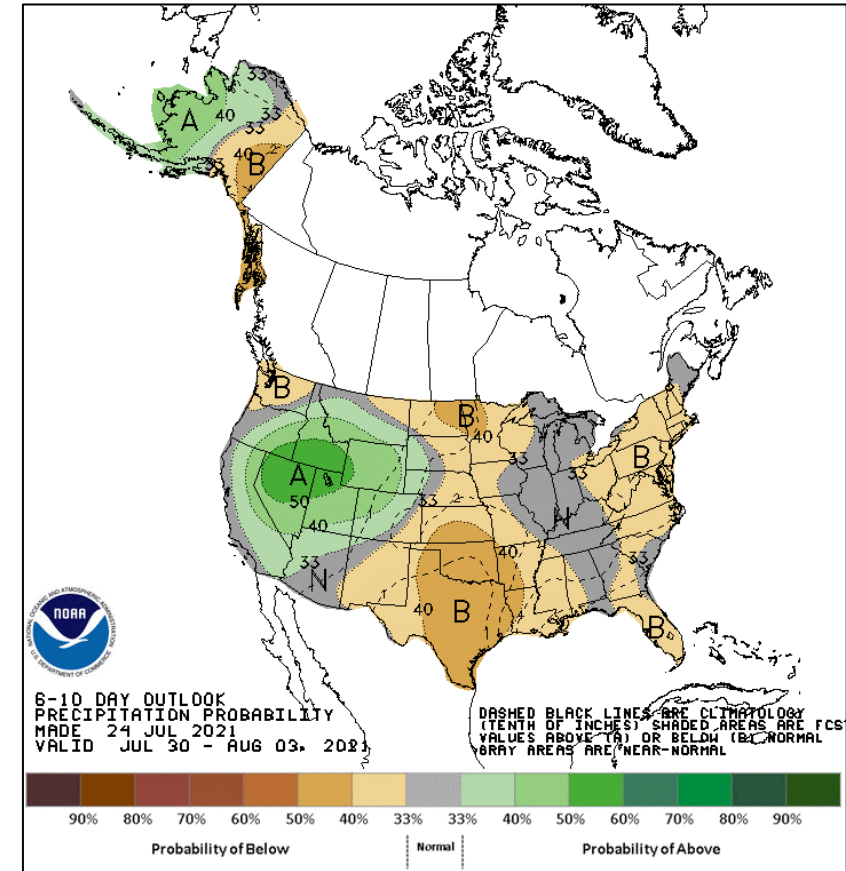
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Long Range Outlooks – Jul 30 - Aug 3

6-10 Day Precipitation Probability

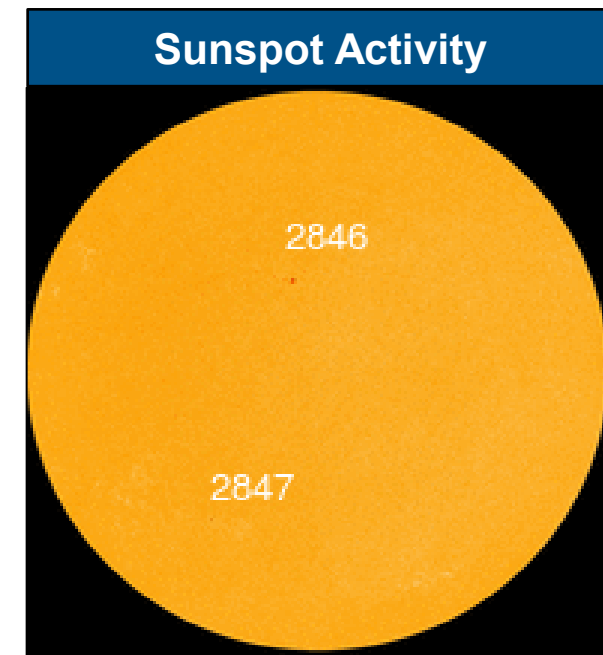
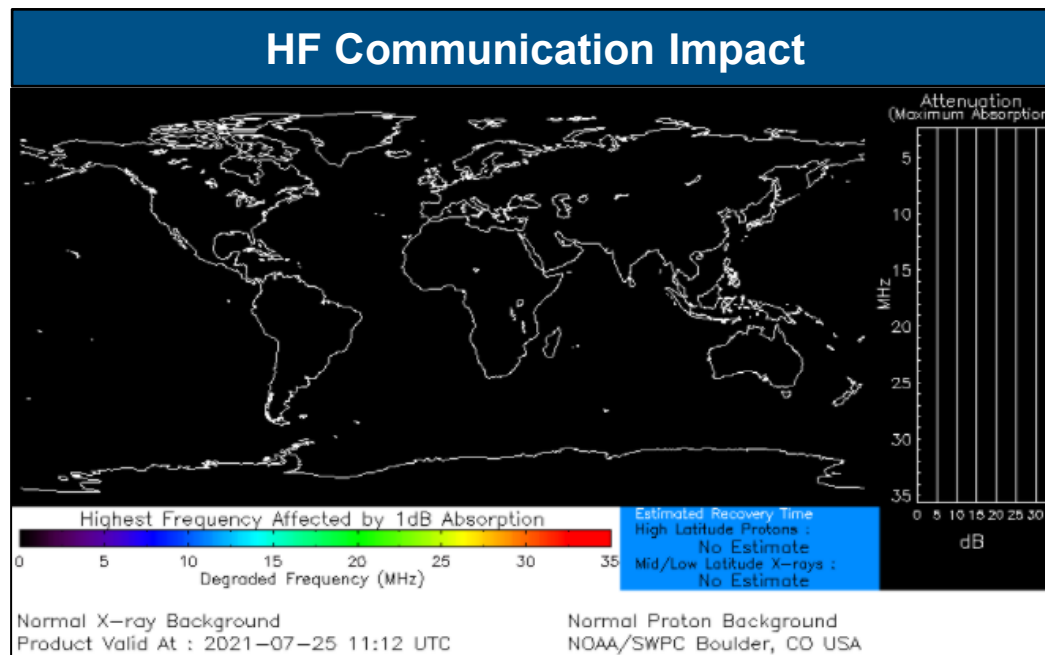

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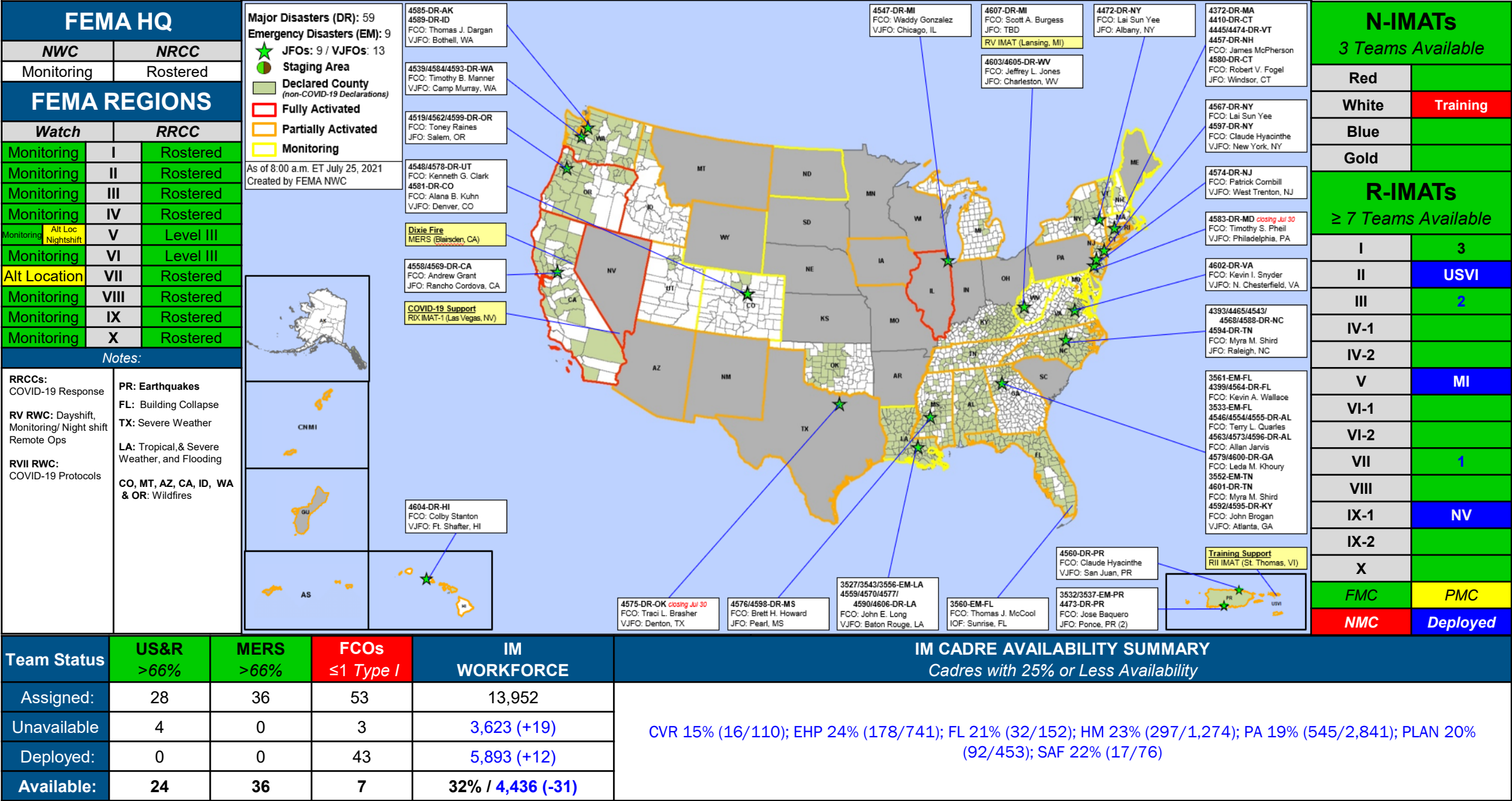
