Updates to the EC Division Padlet

Items of Interest

CARES Act - ESSERF - Exceptional Children Grant (PRC 167)

For PRC 167, the budget for carryover will pull into CCIP for the 2022 fiscal year. If the budget matches the 2021 grant Use of Funds, then a grant revision will not be required. If the budget does not match the 2021 grant Use of Funds, a revision of the 2021 CARES Act — ESSERF-Exceptional Children Grant will be required. PSUs are not required to complete a new application for the carryover funds.

2022 IDEA Grant Budget and Carryover

NCDPI Finance has added the carryover funds to the IDEA budget in NCCCIP. PSUs with IDEA grant and budget approved by NCDPI IDEA Program Consultant, will submit a budget amendment for the carryover funds.

For PSUs with grants still in the approval process that did not include carryover, the fiscal monitors will review and approve the grant with the initially submitted budget. After the approval, the PSU will submit a budget amendment for the carryover funds.

The PSUs with grants still in the approval process that did include carryover which does not match the NCDPI Finance carryover amount, will have the budget returned. The budget will need to be corrected and resubmitted prior to initial approval of the grant.

All carryover funds must be budgeted prior to any funds being allotted

American Rescue Plan: EC Funds

North Carolina will receive \$81,359,406 in supplemental ARP funding for the IDEA 611 grant and \$6,121,374 in supplemental funding for the IDEA 619 grant. These supplemental funds will be allocated via state aid using the same formulas as the IDEA 611/619 grants. New Program Report Codes (PRCs) will be developed and these funds will require a separate budget. The EC division is currently working on procedures to ensure appropriate tracking and monitoring of these funds and will communicate additional processes prior to these funds being allotted. This communication is to inform you of the current status and acknowledge they will be allotted in the near future.

STEM opportunity for Students who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing

Hands & Voices, a non-profit national organization, has partnered with the National Technical Institute for the Deaf (NTID) to create a project called "Casual Conversations." This project pairs a deaf or hard of hearing role model in the STEM field with a deaf or hard of hearing student who is interested in a STEM career. This project is currently looking for middle/high school students who are deaf or hard of hearing and who are interested in: IT field/software; Nursing/medical; Chemistry/biology.
